We have uncovered some amazing facts in the way of fraternity pin information for this number. Within the walls of the 24 sororities on the campus are 285 fraternity pins out of a total of 908 girls which means one pin to every third sorority girl! Placing the minimum cost of each pin at \$10, the average worth of the total number would be sufficient to put three students through the university for one full year.



We have personally taken the annual spring inventory of the following 24 houses, all of the sorority camps on the campus. This report comes just four months after our last check-up, December 1st, and finds an increase in the total of 84 since that time, every single house gaining at least one or more pins. At the same period last year, the total was 30 less and in the four years we have been here, this present figure is the greatest. Too, in leading the parade with 29 pins and 7 engagement rings, the Gamma Phi Beta sorority has established a new record for quantity numbers, replacing Chi Omega which had 27 pins during the 1938-'39 season.
