Dear Mr. Wermuth:

Your letter of 18 July 1969 and its enclosed descriptions of suggested topics for study, addressed to Mr. Sobelman and myself, have been reviewed by us and the applicable staff members of ODCSOPS.

As you may have anticipated, some of the problems you have stated have been answered, generally but not exclusively, by in-house efforts. The other study suggestions are certainly interesting and provocative but not considered to be currently of a pressing or urgent nature; that is, if the budget were copious enough for essentials plus nice-to-have or provocative studies, we would consider them as candidates.

The budget, however, as we outlined during your kind visit, has been committed for the next fiscal year and is anything but copious, particularly with respect to contractual studies. Newspaper releases reflect this situation with ominous overtones for a tighter future.

We are pleased, however, that your visit and your letter submissions have taken place so that the Army has more knowledge of your capabilities. As you requested, the descriptive material submitted with your letter is being returned. The originality of any proprietary material will be protected.
