Dear Dr. Taylor:


Thanks very much for your recent letter regarding the President's request for supplemental appropriations for South Vietnam and Cambodia.

Although the Administration has shown increasing alarm at the deterioration in the security of Indochina lately, I see no reason why we should continue to give military and economic assistance indefinitely to regimes that cannot stand by themselves. Maintaining the Thieu government in office is not a high priority of the American people, and I believe that the Congress as a whole has already made it clear that we do not intend to support any further involvement in the internal affairs of Indochina.

I appreciate having your perspectives on this situation, as a doctor who worked with Vietnamese civilians, and thank you again for taking the time to write.
