GUEST SPEAKER



Chief Warrant Officer Michael J. Novosel was born 2 September 1922, in Etna, Pennsylvania. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in February 1941 and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant upon completion of flight training in 1942. Thus began a most distinguished military career of active and reserve duty spanning more than forty-four years.

Early in his career, Chief Warrant Officer Novosel served special duty with the Office of Strategic Services. Later, assigned to Laredo Army Airfield, Texas, he served as Officer in Charge of Flight Test Engineering. During his next assignment, he served as an Aircraft Commander, 58th Bomb Wing on the Island of Tinian in the Marianas. He was one of the B-29 Aircraft Commanders who flew in the covering force over General of the Army Douglas MacArthur as the surrender of the government of Japan was accepted on the Battleship Missouri on 2 September 1945. Next, he served as Commander of the 99th Bombardment Squadron until it was deactivated. Then, he served as a B-29 Test Pilot at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida. Following this assignment, he left active duty and joined the Air Force Reserve. He was recalled to active duty during the Korean War and returned to reserve status in 1953. While in reserve status, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel and served at Eglin Air Force

Base, Florida. During the Vietnam War, Chief Warrant Officer Novosel requested to be placed on active duty and was informed that the Air Force was over strength in the Senior ranks, thus he resigned his position and accepted an appointment as a Warrant Officer in the Army. During his initial assignment in the Army, he served with the Army's Special Forces and saw duty with the 11th Air Assault Division in Arabia and the Dominican Republic. Next, he served with the 283d Medical Detachment (Helicopter Ambulance) in Vietnam. Later, returning to Vietnam, he served with the 82d Medical Detachment. This was followed by assignment as the Aviation Officer of the "Golden Knights", the Army parachute team. He then served as an author/lecturer with the Warrant Officer Career College at Fort Rucker, Alabama. Next, he served as Aviation Safety Officer, 2d Infantry Division. Prior to assuming his present position, Chief Warrant Officer Novosel served as Aviation Safety Officer, Directorate of Evaluation and Standardization, Fort Rucker, Alabama.

Chief Warrant Officer Novosel's military schools include attendance at the Air Tactical School, the Air Command and Staff College, the Army Warrant Officer Senior Course, and the Air Assault Course.

Chief Warrant Officer Novosel is the last World War II military aviator on active flying duty in the United States and is the recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor. His other awards include three awards of the Distinguished Flying Cross, two awards of the Bronze Star Medal, sixty-one awards of the Air Medal (one with "V" Device), the Army Commendation Medal, the Purple Heart, the Air Force Command Pilot Badge, the Master Army Aviator Badge, and the Air Assault Badge. Chief Warrant Officer Novosel was inducted into the Army Aviation Hall of Fame in June 1975.

Chief Warrant Officer Novosel is presently the 6th Aviation Training Battalion Senior Training, Advising and Counseling Officer for the Warrant Officer Candidate Program, United States Army Aviation Center, Fort Rucker, Alabama.

ABOVE THE BEST

THE COLORS, RED, BLUE, AND GOLD ARE USED TO INDICATE REPRESENTATION OF ALL BRANCHES OF THE ARMY IN THE ARMY AVIATION CENTER. THE ORGANIZATION'S AVIATION TRAINING MISSION IS SYMBOLIZED BY THE PERCHED FALCON DENOTING THE ART OF FALCONRY WITH ITS PATIENT TRAINING OF A SWIFT, KEEN BIRD FOR HUNTING. THE MAILED FIST DEPICTS THE MILITARY COMMANDER OR GROUND ARM WHICH EXERCISES THE CONTROL, TRAINING AND DIRECTION OF THE FLIGHT.
