




# USARV HIGHLIGHTS

## DCS P&A

### US ARMY MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

(U) The accident rate of 5.9 accidents per million miles driven for the 2d Qtr, FY71 was slightly higher than the rate for the 1st Qtr, FY71; however, the overall number of motor vehicle accidents decreased.

### MILITARY PERSONNEL INJURIES

(U) The 2d Qtr, FY71 injury rate of 39.1 injuries per million mandays was 22 percent less than the 1st Qtr, FY71 rate of 50. The main problem area is injuries and fatalities resulting from small arm, explosive device and drowning incidents.

## DCSOPS

### BUDGET REVIEW-CY70, 12 HIGH DOLLAR MUNITIONS

(C) Command emphasis achieved a net savings of 48.5 million dollars through 24 December 1970. The munitions were removed from allocation on 24 December 1970.

### MOOSE II PROGRAM

(U) 46 leases have been terminated through MOOSE II actions with a lease savings of 1,494,970 dollars. The reduction will continue in the Saigon area as units are identified for relocation, inactivation, and drawdown.

## DCSLOG

### OPERATIONAL READINESS (OR) RATES

(U) The OR rates of wheeled vehicles were below the 90 percent MACV objective. The rates ranged from a low of 80 percent for the 10 ton tractor to a high of 89 percent for the 3/4 ton truck. The OR rates of combat vehicles (M551 Sheridan, AA/ARV and M48A3 Tank) were at or above the 85 percent MACV objective. The OR rates for CE equipment (Ground surveillance radar and AN/VRC 12 radio) were well above the MACV objective of 85 percent. Three categories of Engineer equipment had OR rates above the MACV objective of 80 percent while 2 categories

were below. All categories of self-propelled artillery were well above the 85 percent MACV objective. Only the LCU category of watercraft OR rates fell below the 75 percent MACV objective to 71.5 percent. A significant improvement in Tug OR rates was realized to a level well above the 75 percent MACV objective.

### DEPOT OPERATIONS

(U) Theater percentage of high priority requisitions decreased by 0.5 percent, primarily because of a 24 percent decrease at Da Nang. Theater material release denials decreased 0.6 percent as a result of a 2.4 percent decrease at Da Nang and a 0.4 percent decrease at Long Binh. Theater material receipts processing within 3 days decreased 7.8 percent.

## DCSCOMPT

### PROGRESS AGAINST DA PROGRAM FOR USARV SUPPLY FUNDING

(U) Indications are that USARV will operate well below the DA programmed FY71 level of 427.7 million dollars; however, DA may soon reduce the program by at least 50 million dollars. The reduction would be based on supply consumption and obligation trends.

### OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE ARMY (OMA), FY71

(U) The Budget Execution Review (BER) reflected total unfinanced requirements of 136.4 million dollars (25.9 million dollars in in-country funds and 110.5 million dollars in out-of-country funds). Some funding relief is expected as a result of the BER.

### OVERTIME DAC'S, FY71

(U) Full effect of the 40 hour overtime ceiling is now apparent and total overtime hours and total overtime pay have been reduced approximately 50 percent.

## DCSMIS

**USARV AUTOMATIC DATA PROCESSING EQUIPMENT INVENTORY**

(U) During the 2d Qtr, FY71, the punched card machine density in USARV decreased by 14 percent and the computer system density decreased by 13 percent. Continued reduction in USARV ADPE is projected.

## ACSC-E

**COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS**

(U) The number of ICS and CACS systems continued to decrease during the 2d Qtr, FY71 and is expected to continue through the 3d Qtr, FY71. Effective management at all levels of command has reduced Class A telephone service to 22 percent. The objective is 20 percent Class A telephone service and 80 percent Class C service.

**USARV COMMON-USER TELETYPE TRAFFIC, FY71**

(U) Teletype message traffic decreased by 6 percent during the 2d Qtr, FY71 and this trend is expected to continue, dependent upon the base closures and turnover of facilities to RVNAF during the 3d Qtr, FY71.

**USARV MILITARY AFFILIATE RADIO SYSTEM PROGRAM FY71**

(U) The closures of 6 stations due to redeployment activities and extremely unfavorable propagation conditions caused the phone patch count to drop by about 9,000 during the 2d Qtr, FY71.

**PROGRAMS**

(U) The RVNAF C-E Training Program, which began in FY71, continued to exceed projections during the 2d Qtr, FY71. Overall utilization of the wide-band tactical secure voice (NESTOR) equipment dropped from 86.1 percent for the 1st Qtr, FY71 to 83.4 percent during the 2d Qtr, FY71. The drop was the result of equipment being turned in because of troop reductions.

## ADJUTANT GENERAL

**QUARTERLY AWARDS REPORT, FY71**

(U) The awards output for the 2d Qtr, FY71 was the lowest output level in 18 months. However, meritorious service awards rose by 56.7 per thousand troops. Both facts are attributable to drawdown.

**CONFIDENTIAL****REENLISTMENT RATES**

(U) The 4th Qtr, CY70 reenlistment rate increased from the very low rate of the 3d Qtr, CY70. The increase was evident in first term RA personnel.

**REST AND RECUPERATION (R&R) PROGRAM**

(U) The 2d Qtr, FY71 out-of-country utilization rate decreased 16.6 percent from the 1st Qtr, FY71. The decrease is attributable to troop reductions and the two week leave to CONUS program.

**COMBAT ARMS COMMISSIONED OFFICER STRENGTH**

(C) While the overall combat arms strength remained below 2-71 PRA, the overall combat arms strength was 11 percent above authorized strength due to redeployments.

## CHAPLAIN

**RELIGIOUS SERVICES**

(U) Attendance of religious services decreased 3 percent during the 2d Qtr, FY71. The decrease is attributed to personnel turbulence resulting from drawdown, and the fact that there are fewer chaplains in-country.

## CIVILIAN PERSONNEL

**VIETNAMESE WORK FORCE, FY71**

(U) Budgetary limitations required establishment of a USARV hire ceiling of 25,547, well below the CINCUSARPAC authorization of 32,437 for the 2d Qtr, FY71.

## AVIATION

**AIRCRAFT VULNERABILITY AND AIRCREW SURVIVABILITY DATA**

(C) During the 2d Qtr, FY71 there was a decline in each of the aircraft and aircrew vulnerability indicators. The decline is attributed to the low level of enemy activity and application of lessons learned.

AVIATION SAFETY, FY71

(U) The 2d Qtr, FY71 USARV aircraft accident rate of 17.2 is the lowest ever achieved in USARV. It appears that the accident prevention program is proving successful.

AVIATION OPERATIONAL DATA

(C) Operational performance during the 2d Qtr, FY71 showed an overall decline from the previous quarter. This trend is expected to continue through the 3d Qtr, FY71.

AVIATION FLYING HOUR SUPPORT TO US AND FWMAF

(C) Although there was a general decrease in the number of flying hours flown in the 2d Qtr, FY71, the percent of US support provided FWMAF increased over the previous quarter. Support for GVN forces showed the largest increase in the percent distribution for flying hours.

ENGINEER

DISPOSITION OF REAL PROPERTY VIETNAM

(U) 49 installations, or parts thereof, were transferred to RVNAF during the 2d Qtr, FY71. The transferred property had an initial value of 62.5 million dollars. 13 more transfers valued at 28.2 million dollars are in progress.

MILITARY CONSTRUCTION ARMY (MCA)

(U) The MCA program was funded at 922 million dollars during the 2d Qtr, FY71 which included a 15 million dollar increase for the AMASF requirements. The total program is 87 percent complete and it is averaging a quarterly placement rate of 15 million dollars.

REDUCTION IN FACILITIES ENGINEERING BUDGET

(U) The FE budget was reduced as a result of the USARV budget reduction in August 1970. The budget for FE services performed by contractors was reduced by 16.85 million dollars.

LINES OF COMMUNICATION (LOC)

(U) USARV is responsible for 3,672 KM of the MACV LOC program. 937 KM were scheduled for completion during CY70 with 82 percent (765 KM) having been completed.

REDUCTION OF LEASED FACILITIES

(U) During the 2d Qtr, FY71, a savings of 639,444.69 dollars was realized in annual rentals. Although 31 leases were terminated and 4 leases were transferred to the rent free list, 315 remain on the inventory.

PROVOST MARSHAL

USARV PRISONER POPULATION

(FOUO) A 2d Qtr, FY71 reduction in the USARV prisoner population is attributable to the Christmas clemency program and effective out-of-country transfers of prisoners.

TRAFFIC OFFENSES, FY71

(FOUO) The number of traffic offenders decreased 12.9 percent from the 1st Qtr, FY71 level and the rate per thousand troop population decreased from 29.85 to 28.01.

MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES, FY71

(FOUO) The number of identified miscellaneous offenders decreased 7.8 percent from the 1st Qtr, FY71 level.

CRIMES OF VIOLENCE AND CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY, FY71

(FOUO) During the 2d Qtr, FY71 the number of identified offenders decreased 23.8 percent from the 1st Qtr, FY71.

INSPECTOR GENERAL

COMPLAINTS JUSTIFIED AND UNJUSTIFIED

(U) All indicators for monitoring the level of complaints showed an appreciable decrease from the 1st Qtr, FY71.

STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE

USARV COURTS-MARTIAL ANALYSIS, FY71

(U) During the 2d Qtr, FY71 total courts-martial decreased slightly from the 1st Qtr, FY71 level. The slight decrease is attributable to decreases in the number of general and special courts-martial. Summary courts-martial increased during the quarter.
