The white diamond with Indian on it is from a Huey unit using the callsign Warriors. That much I'm positive on. Couldn't find my notes on this yet but it is one of the units flying UH-1Ds early on some with the early style intake fit (no grass screens), several being photographed by Tim Page. Nice photo of one by him on the cover of the book "Vietnam Choppers", by Simon Dunstan. May be one of the units that was disbanded in 65-66 and redesignated something else. 62nd Avn Co or 73rd Avn Co before the names were reused perhaps. If I had to guess I'd say it was the 73rd before the Army gave the designation to a Fixed-wing unit.

I'll keep my eyes out for my notes on this. In the mess somewhere.
