>650215, 650217, 650220, 650227 has Camp Holloway and other II Corps bases and
>landmarks wrongly located in Quang Tri province and I Corps which is way up
>north many, many, many kilometers away.

>The main provinces for Camp Holloway, Mang Yang, and An Khe, which were
located
>between Qui Nhon and Pleiku, are Pleiku province and Binh Dinh province
all in
>II Corps area as indicated on the map in the link.
