Greetings from England, I hope you are well. Thank you for your letter of 16th October. Sorry about the delay, but I am currently working on two books and have been rather busy. Please note new address.

Thank you for the copy of the latest membership directory. I will have to order a copy of the historical reference directory sometime. It is yet another thing that I keep meaning to do. I can imagine how much work it all is, compiling the directory.

If you are heading this way sometime, give me some warning and leave some space in your suitcase. I keep meaning to list the unit info etc that I got together for my book and pass it all on to you. There are about four box files of the stuff, say about a foot deep altogether. Too much to post to you. The VHPA are quite welcome to it, as long as I can borrow bits back in the future if I ever need to. Its mostly unit historical reports from 1st Cav and 1/9th if I remember correctly.

Have you considered contacting the historian at Air Force Special Operations Command, Hurlburt Field, FL? His name is Clay McCutchan (ex Major) [REDACTED]. The 20th SOS are based there too.

You may also try to write to John Holt, [REDACTED]. He is a member of the Air Force helo pilots association and sent me some details of his time with 21st SOS in late 1968, but I could not use it in my latest book. Also has a couple of pictures.

My latest book is entitled 'Any Time, Any Place' and covers the history of the special ops squadrons from 1944 to 1994. You may find a few bits in there of use. It is published by Naval Institute Press and the ISBN number is 1-55750-037-1. Went on sale a couple of weeks ago.


