

CHAPTER I

MISSION AND ORGANIZATION

UNIT: Detachment 5, 38 Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron, Military Airlift Command.

PERIOD: Detachment 5, 38 Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron is located at Udorn Royal Thai Air Base, Thailand. The base is located three and one half miles southeast of Udorn Thani, Thailand. The town has a population of approximately 70,000. The base population is presently more than 6,500.

ASSIGNMENT: Detachment 5, is assigned to the 38 Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Squadron at Tan Son Nhut Air Base, Republic of Vietnam. The 38th ARRSq is assigned to the 3rd Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group, also located at Tan Son Nhut. Operational control of the 38 ARRSq aircraft is exercised by the 7th Air Force. Thirteenth Air Force is responsible for logistics and administrative support. The 432nd Combat Support Group, located at Udorn RTAFB, is responsible for control of base facilities and support of tenant units.

AIRCRAFT: The Detachment is equipped with two Kaman HH-43B helicopters. The serial numbers of these helicopters are 59-1572 and 60-0259. One aircraft is continually of immediate response alert. The other stands backup alert. Both aircraft are used for training missions.

FACILITIES: Detachment 5 is located on the flight line near the control tower and civilian air terminal. The alert facility provides office space and alert quarters for crew members overnight. Nearby tool sheds contain all the necessary equipment for aircraft maintenance. A hangar is located approximately 100 yards from the alert facility. This hangar is capable of sheltering two aircraft in inclement weather and provides a sheltered maintenance work area.

## CHAPTER III

## OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

RESCUE MISSIONS: During this quarter Detachment 5 flew intercepts on a total of 111 aircraft, amassing 37.9 hours of operational mission time. A total of 124 training missions and 128.2 hours were flown from 1 July to 30 September 1970.

OFF BASE MISSIONS: On 29 August 1970, Pedro Operations was notified that a man had been seriously injured in a motor vehicle accident at a remote site 45 miles from Udorn. The man required immediate evacuation from an Army radar site near Khon Kaen, Thailand where he had been taken. Pedro 09 launched at 2000L and flew to the site, where, upon landing it was evident the injured man's condition had greatly deteriorated and his life was in jeopardy. The man had suffered a chest wound and had a collapsed lung. The helicopter mechanic and a medical technician loaded the injured man on the aircraft. After a normal flight back to Udorn RTAFB, the man was off loaded to an ambulance. It was later learned that the man probably would not have lived without the prompt air evacuation provided by the Pedro crew. The crew on this flight was: Captain Glynn A. McGregor, Aircraft Commander; Major Alfred W. Lamkin, Co-pilot; and Sgt Frederick R. Marshall, Helicopter Mechanic.
