CHAPTER I

MISSION AND ORGANIZATION

Mission

(U) To provide a tactical force for employment to rescue and evacuate personnel engaged in operations in or adjacent to hostile territory; provide Local Base Rescue Units at selected bases; plan, organize, coordinate, and control the execution of personnel rescue operations; provide coordinate, and control the execution of personnel rescue operations; provide command and control of subordinate units, provide Joint Search and Rescue Center and Rescue Coordination Centers at selected locations. Geographical area of operations is Southeast Asia (SEA).

(U) Subordinate Functions - Directorate of Aerospace Rescue (DAR - 7th Air Force/Commander 3rd Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group).

1. Advises the Commander 7th Air Force on matters pertaining to Rescue and Recovery requirements and procedures.

2. Coordinates on matters pertaining to all Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service activities, requirements, and responsibilities in SEA.

3. Exercises operational control of all rescue forces in SEA in accordance with policies established by the Commander 7th AF and/or Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center (Pac ARRC).

4. Keeps the Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center (~~Pac ARRC~~) informed of SAR/Recovery requirements and all planned or conducted SAR operations.

5. Reports directly to the Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center on command and administrative matters.

ORGANIZATION

Command Organization

(U) The 3rd ARRCp is assigned to the Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center of the Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service (PARC) and comes under the operational control of the Commander 7th Air Force. The 3rd ARRCp exercises command over the following units:

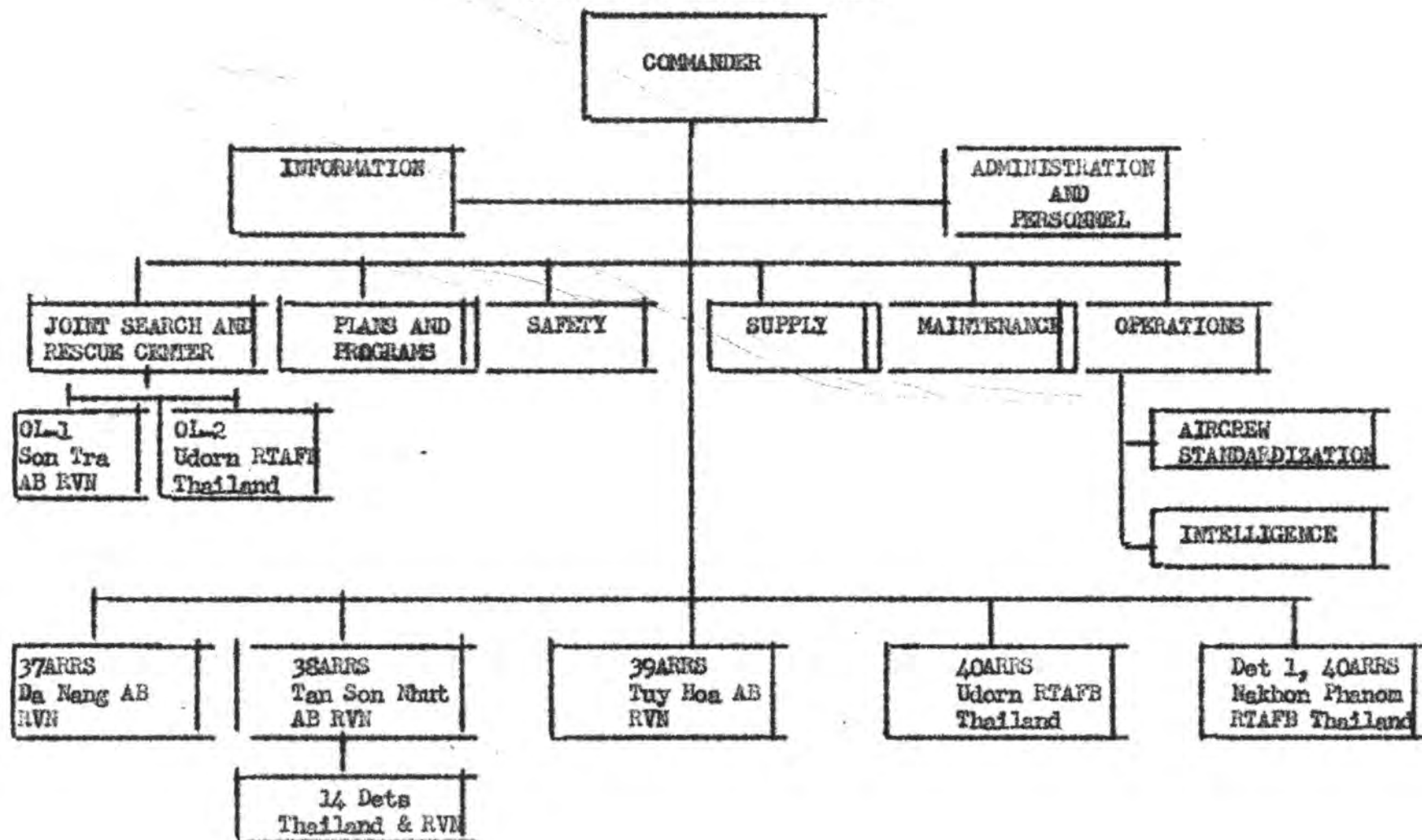

(U) These units are located in two nations and are responsible for search and rescue activities in an area encompassing 1.1 million square miles extending from the Mekong River Delta to the Chinese border and to the Burmese Frontier.

(U) The 3rd ARRGp headquarters is located at Tan Son Nhut AB, Republic of Vietnam. The units under the command of the Group are located in the Republic of Vietnam and Thailand.³

ADMINISTRATIVE SPECIALISTS

(U) The shortage of qualified administrative specialist throughout 3rd ARRGp units persisted during this quarter. The shortages became so acute it was necessary to request TDY manning assistance until PCS replacement arrived. The TDY assistance temporarily alleviated the undermanned 702X0 situation; however, most 3rd ARRGp units are still experiencing shortages.

AWARDS AND DECORATIONS

(U) The numerical and personnel listing of individual awards and decorations are in Appendix V & VI.

CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM

(U) 3ARRGp personnel have continued their active support of the Co-Whi-Vien-Viet Hoa Orphanage in the Cholon district of Saigon. During this period over 500 pounds of clothing, numerous toys, and many toiletry articles were donated by ARRS personnel, their friends, and relatives. In addition, \$ 1098 were donated by Hq ARRS world wide personnel. During the quarter \$ 472.00 were withdrawn from the 3ARRGp Civic Fund for floor tile and florescent light fixtures for the newly constructed Orphanage classrooms. In addition, the English conversation classes were begun at the Orphanage. 3ARRGp personnel who are conversant in French instruct the Nuns who in turn will conduct English classes for the Orphanage students.

AIRCRAFT

(GP-4) While Headquarters 3rd ARRGp did not possess any aircraft of its own, it is significant to note the aircraft operated by the subordinate units. These aircraft consisted of both fixed wing and rotary wing types. The HC-130P was the only fixed wing aircraft and was assigned to the 39th ARRS. The helicopter complement consisted of the following three types; the HH-3E, assigned to the 37th ARRS and Det 1, 40th ARRS; the HH-43B/F, assigned to the 38th ARRS; and the HH-53B assigned to the 40th ARRS.

(GP-4) HH-43F, 59-1575 which had been at Depot Maintenance for repairs was returned to operational status bringing the 38ARRS up to their authorized strength in HH-43's.

(GP-4) An HH-3, assigned to the 37ARRS was lost in combat on 9 June 1968.

CHAPTER III

OPERATIONS

(S) The primary function of the Headquarters Third Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group is to serve as the Command and Control agency for all USAF rescue forces in Southeast Asia. In addition to serving as the operations center for SAR forces, 3ARRGp Operations is responsible for the Standardization/Evaluation, Intelligence, and Training functions Group wide. To accomplish the combat SAR mission, rescue aircraft are strategically positioned throughout Southeast Asia to provide quick response for SAR missions. The HH-3E and HH-53B Jolly Green helicopters stand ground alerts and fly airborne orbits. HC-130P Crown aircraft fly airborne orbits and serve as airborne mission commanders. In addition, the HC-130P and HH-3E/HH-53's operate as a team using air-to-air refueling to provide rapid reaction time. A1-E Sandy/Spad aircraft provide RESCORT and fire suppression of hostile ground forces. HH-43B/F Pedro aircraft provide Local Base Rescue and a SAR capability within a 75 N.M. radius of action of the base. The authorized force posture for the 3ARRGp is 22 - HH-3E, 6 - HH-53B, 32 - HH-43B/F, and 11 - HC-130P aircraft. The SAR aircraft are deployed on a daily basis in the following manner:

1. HH-3E - 37ARRSq, Da Nang
 - a. Two aircraft stand ground alert at Da Nang.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at a forward operating site at Quang Tri.
 - c. One or two aircraft fly Gulf of Tonkin orbits as required.
2. HH-3E - Det 1, 4OARRSq, Nakhon Phanom
 - a. Two aircraft stand ground alert at Nakhon Phanom.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at L-98 and fly an airborne orbit over Northern Laos as required, alternating every third day with the HH-53B's.
3. HH-53 - 4OARRSq, Udorn
 - a. One aircraft stands ground alert at Udorn.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at L-98 and fly airborne orbits over Northern Laos as required, alternating two days out of three with the Nakhon Phanom HH-3E's.

4. HC-130F - 39ARRSq, Tuy Hoa

a. Crown 1 and 2 fly the morning and afternoon Northern Laos orbit respectively.

b. Crown 3 stands ground alert at Udorn.

c. Crown 4 and 6 fly the morning and afternoon Gulf of Tonkin orbit respectively.

d. Crown 7 stands ground alert at Tuy Hoa.

5. Al-E Sandy's - 602 Special Operations Squadron, Nakhon Phanom

a. Four aircraft stand ground alert at Nakhon Phanom.

b. Two aircraft fly the airborne orbit in Northern Laos with the HH-3E or HH-53B and add to the ground alert force when not airborne.

6. Al-E Snads - 6 Special Operations Squadron, Pleiku. The aircraft stage at Da Nang and stand ground alert.

7. HH-43E/F - 38ARRSq, Tan Son Nhut. Thirty two aircraft pull 24-hour alerts at 14 bases in South Vietnam and Thailand.

Combat and Non-combat Saves

(U) The units under 3ARRGp were responsible for 145 Combat saves and 63 Non-combat saves for a total of 208 saves for the quarter. The total number of saves since 1 December 1964 is 1863; 1345 Combat and 518 Non-combat. The "Combat" classification results when a rescue has been accomplished in which the individual rescued has been exposed to hostile action or has been recovered from a hostile area. A Non-combat save is credited when an individual could have died in a non-hostile environment if rescue forces had not recovered him. Appendix I lists the number of combat and non-combat saves for each month of the quarter.

3ARRGp Flying Hours

(U) 3ARRGp units flew a total of 9385 hours during the quarter. Appendix II gives the total flying hours by airframe for each month of the reporting period.

Largest Rescue Effort in History

~~(S)~~ The most extensive search and rescue effort in the history of the Southeast Asian operation began on 31 May 1968 when a Navy A-7 Corsair (Streetcar 304) was shot down. Two days and 189 sorties later he was successfully recovered by a HH-3E from Det 1, 4OARRS. The Jolly Green crew was: RCC - Captain David A. Richardson, RCCP - Major Louis D. Yuhas, FE - SSgt Coy W. Calhoun and RS - Sgt Peter S. Harding.

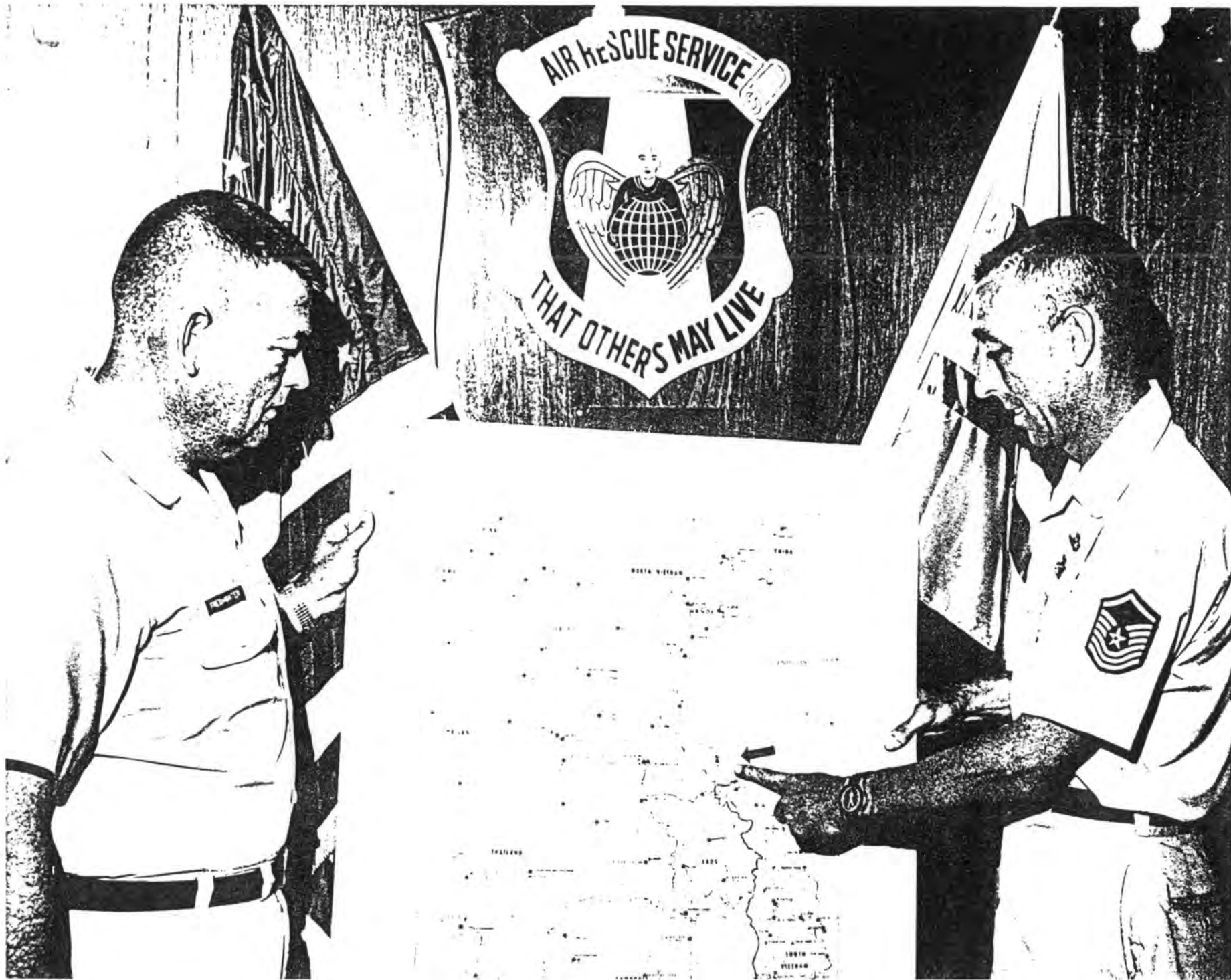

First Pararescueman Graduate from Recondo School

(U) The first pararescueman graduated from the U.S. Army Special Forces Recondo School at Nha Trang, RVN, during June 1968. Sgt Harwell P. O. Guillian, Jr., assigned to Det 12, 38ARRS underwent three weeks of intensive training that included infiltration/exfiltration procedures, reconnaissance patrols, map reading, rugged physical training, and an actual patrol in VC territory. More pararescuemen are scheduled to attend future Recondo classes.

Standardization

(U) Change in Personnel

Major Robert A. Bunker became Chief of Aircrew Standardization on 25 May 1968, vice Major Thomas E. Claus who departed on 19 April 1968. Major Bunker was previously assigned as Chief of Aircrew Standardization at the 37ARRS (DEROS 24 October 1968). MSgt Clarence R. Boles, Jr., replaced SMSgt Ted R. Hawkins as NCOIC of Aircrew Standardization on 2 June 1968. MSgt Boles was previously assigned to Det 1, 40ARRS as the NCOIC of Pararescue.

(U) Standardization Staff Visits

During the quarter, the following Standardization Staff visits were conducted:

Major John E. Shaeffer, HH-43 Standardization Officer, and SMSgt Hawkins, visited Det 9, 38ARRS on 9-11 April 1968; Major Shaeffer visited Det 7, 38ARRS on 16-19 April 1968; and Major Shaeffer and MSgt Boles visited Det 14, 38ARRS on 26-27 June 1968.

On the Job Training (OJT)

(U) An average of 785 airmen were assigned during the quarter with an average of 211 on OJT (27%). The drop in the percentage figure of assigned versus on OJT can be attributed to the sharp decrease in the number of assigned airmen; 900 the previous quarter compared to 785 this quarter. Of particular significance is the fact that 45% of all airmen on OJT in Pac ARRC are assigned to 3ARRGp. The overall SKT passing rate for this quarter was 77% (80% for 5 level and 73% for 7 level). During the quarter, 3ARRGp was presented an award for the "Finest OJT Program in Pac ARRC, 1 Jan 68 - 31 Mar 68."

Distinguished Visitors

(U) Colonel Donald T. Smith, Commander Pac ARRC visited all 3ARRGp units during the period 21 May - 2 June 1968.

(U) Lieutenant General James W. Wilson, Vice Commander MAC visited the following 3ARRGp units between the period 24 June - 27 June 1968: Hq 3ARRGp; OL 1 & 2; 3ARRGp; 37ARRS; 39ARRS; 40ARRS; Det 1, 40ARRS; and Dets 5, 7, 8, 11, 13, and 14, 38ARRS.

CHAPTER IV

JOINT SEARCH AND RESCUE CENTER (JSARC)

(U) The primary purpose of the Joint Search and Rescue Center is to provide coordinated direction of multi-service forces when they are involved in search and rescue operations. The secondary purpose is to develop a free and unrestricted flow of information that establishes close coordination and action between all U.S. Forces in Southeast Asia.

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ The Commander 7AF is the SAR Coordinator for the Southeast Asia Sub-Region which includes the land and water areas within the Saigon, Bangkok, and Rangoon Flight Information Regions. He maintains the Joint Search and Rescue Center under his Directorate of Aerospace Rescue (Commander 3rd Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group) at Tan Son Nhut, RVN. Because of the size of the SAR area and the limited number of primary SAR forces, it is imperative that personnel and equipment from all services is available for rapid SAR response. Although each service Commander maintains control of his forces, a centralized coordination of all SAR activities is necessary. JSARC (King) and the subordinate Rescue Coordination Centers Queen, at Son Tra AB, RVN, and Compress, at Udorn RTAFB, Thailand, provide an around-the-clock operation to coordinate SAR activities. The Commander 631 Combat Support Group, Don Muang RTAFB, Thailand is responsible for SAR activities within the Rangoon FIR. Through close cooperation with the 7AF Command Center and subordinate Tactical Air Control Centers, the JSARC maintains a quick response SAR posture.

Change in Key Personnel

(U) Lt Col Leslie E. Gamble replaced Colonel Jack W. Holman as Chief, JSARC effective 14 June 1968.

Lt Col James A. Henderson replaced Lt Col John J. Collins as the Army Liaison Officer assigned to JSARC on 17 June 1968.

Major Joe E. Marshall became OIC of the subordinate Rescue Coordination Center at Son Tra AB, RVN (Queen) vice Major Lester M. Jiggins effective 30 June 1968.

Relocation of OL-2

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ On 1 May 1968, the Rescue Coordination Center (Compress) at Udorn RTAFB, Thailand was relocated from the 7/13 Tactical Air Control Center building to the new Seventh Air Force alternate Tactical Air Control Center, North Sector (ATACC, NS) complex at the same base. The new facility will provide expanded working space, better radio and land line communications, immediate access to computerized command and control of aircraft equipment, and radar scopes for tracking aircraft experiencing emergency conditions.

Army Coordination

(U) Lt Col James A. Henderson, Army Liaison Officer to JSARC, effected coordination with MACV and USARV during June to establish the best channels of communications and permit closer cooperation at unit level between Army Aviation units and 3ARRGp Squadrons, Operating Locations, and Detachments of the 38ARRS. Arrangements were made for requesting Army assistance for SAR through the Army Aviation Element Representative at the Tactical Operations Center (TOC) of the nearest ARVN Corps Tactical Zone (CTZ). 3ARRGp units were advised of the appropriate contact in CTZs I, II, and III for obtaining assistance of Army CH-54s (Flying Cranes) for recovering damaged HH-3E and HH-43 helicopters. Duplication of effort by Army Air Ambulance units and Detachments of the 38ARRS will be minimized by the procedure established for the "Thaifoff" and "Pedro" units to coordinate requests for emergency Medical Evacuations at the local level.

SAR Conference

(U) A conference was held at Udorn, Thailand on 14 June 1968 to discuss SAR problems and procedures in a combat environment. Representatives from 7AF Combat Operations Command and Control Division, 3ARRGp, OL-1 and OL-2, 7/13 TACC, 602 TFSC, GCI sites Brigham and Invert and several Tactical Fighter Wings attended. The meeting resulted in a rewrite of the "RESCAP" procedures" portion of 7AFM 64-1, "Search and Rescue, Southeast Asia."

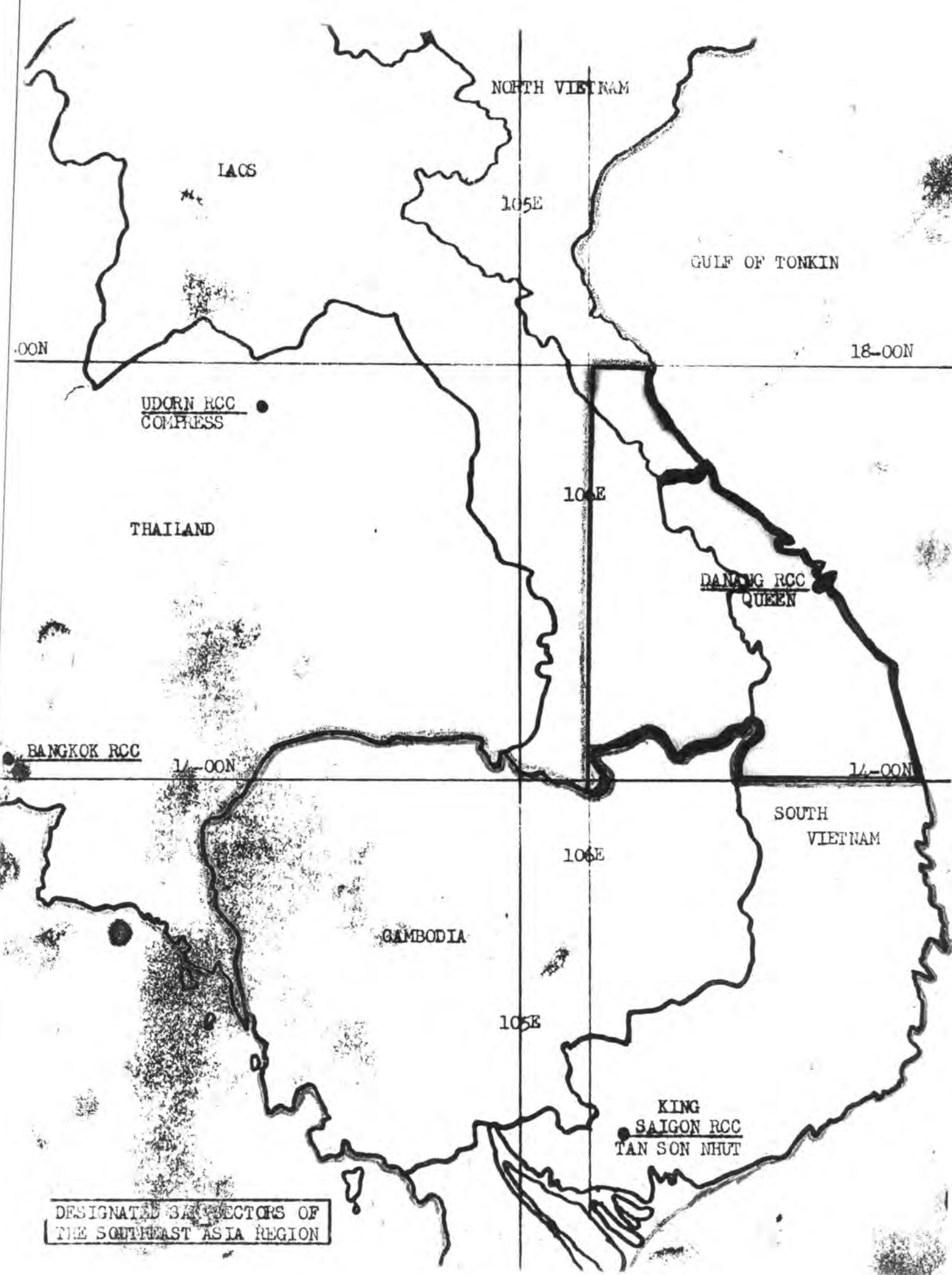
(U) A. Saigon SAR Sector - JSARC, Tan Son Nhut AB, RVN. South Vietnam south of 14-00N, Cambodia, and adjacent water within the Saigon FIR.

B. Da Nang SAR Sector - RCC, Son Tra AB, RVN. Land area bounded by 18-00N, 106-00E, 14-00N, minus the northeast portion of Cambodia, and adjacent water within the Saigon FIR.

C. Udorn SAR Sector - RCC, Udorn RTAFB, Thailand. All of Thailand, all of Laos, except that portion east of 106-00E, all of North Vietnam west of five miles inland from the Gulf of Tonkin and minus the southern portion assigned the Da Nang Sector.

D. Gulf of Tonkin SAR Sector - 7th Fleet or as assigned by the Commander, 7AF.

E. Bangkok SAR Sector - RCC at Don Muang RTAFB, Thailand. The land and water areas within the Rangoon FIR.

CHAPTER V

PLANS AND REQUIREMENTS

(U) During the past quarter the Group Plans and Requirements Section continued coordination or initiated action on the following projects:

3dARRGp Programming Plan I

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ Change Six to 3ARRGp Programming Plan I was published on 1 June 1968 and replaced Interim Change Six. The most significant change was in Annex Charlie, Operations and Training. Since 7AF restricted the use of Laotian forward operating locations (FOL's), Annex Charlie was rewritten.

Programming Action

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ In response to a 3ARRGp request the CSAF has approved the bed-down of all HH-53's at Udorn, RTAFB. USAF PD 70-2 is being amended to show ten HH-53's at Udorn RTAFB and four HH-3E's at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB. Deliver of the four HH-53C's to the 4OARRS is now programmed for December 1968.

Seek Dawn

~~(C)(GP-4)~~ A meeting was held on 17 Mar 68 with Elect Systems Division, Mitre Corporation, and Collins Radio to discuss the status of the Seek Dawn Program. It was agreed that the HF antennas for OL-1, OL-2, and 3ARRGp should be the omni-directional type rather than the omni-rotational type as originally planned. The rationale was that rotational antennas are unnecessary for the short distances required for 3ARRGp operations. Funding for the program has slipped; consequently, the scheduled completion date of April 1969 will probably slip.

3ARRGp Operating Costs

(U) A survey of operating costs for the fiscal year revealed a cost figure of 19.4 million dollars. This does not include the initial cost of the Group aircraft. Using this figure and the number of combat saves made during the year, an average cost per combat save comes to \$32,000; a small price to pay for the recovery of a combat aircrew member.

CHAPTER VI

MAINTENANCE/SUPPLY

(U) The principal mission of the Maintenance/Supply Section is to provide operationally ready aircraft for all rescue needs.

(U) During the period of this report, the 3rd Group operational ready rate was 82.0%, the NORM rate 12.9% and the NORS rate 5.0%. The breakdown by aircraft was as follows:

HH-3E IRAN Program

(U) The HH-3E IRAN facility at Don Muang Airport, Thailand continued operation. One HH-3E, aircraft number 65-12781, was completed and returned to operational status during April 1968.

HH-53B T-64 Engine Program

(U) Toward the end of the quarter, initial steps were taken to establish a Jet Engine Field Maintenance (JEFM) facility at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, Thailand. The airlift of HH-53B engines to North Island Naval Air Station, San Diego, California, continued during the quarter as an interim measure until the JEFM facility at Nakhon Phanom is operational.

HH-43B/F Rotor Blade Attrition

(U) A precautionary rotor blade waxing program was initiated in April 1968, resulting in a bare minimum of blade changes this quarter due to water deterioration.

Aircraft Battle Damage and Losses

(C)(S) A total of 14 aircraft received battle damage during the quarter. The month of May was the heaviest month with six HH-3E's and one HH-53B receiving battle damage. A 37ARFS HH-3E, aircraft number 67-14710 was lost during the Hellborn 215 mission on 9 June 1968. Appendix IV lists the number of helicopters, by airframe type, sustaining battle damage for each month of the quarter. This brings the total aircraft losses in 3ARRGP to 20; 10 - HH-3, 7 - HH-43 and 3 - HU-16.

SUPPLY

Significant NORS Rates

(U) The HM-43 NORS rate of 6.0% was attributed to the following parts: generators, rudder solenoid valve, power failure relay, rotor flaps and rudder function adjustment.

(U) The HM-3E NORS rate dropped from an 8.3% the previous quarter to 5.9% this quarter. The AF standard was exceeded by .9% primarily due to the tail rotor hub.

(U) The HM-53B NORS rate dropped appreciably from 18.5% the previous quarter to 12.4%. However, June was at an all time low of 7.8%. The most critical items contributing to the above standard rate were the servo cannon plugs and rotor heads.

Combat Loss

~~(S)~~ On 9 June 1968, the 37ARRS lost an HH-3E, aircraft number 67-14710, due to hostile ground fire while attempting to recover a Marine A-1 pilot on the Hellborn 215 mission. The aircraft was observed crashing in flames and all personnel on board were killed in action. The crewmembers of Jolly Green 09 were: RCC - Lt (USCG) Jack C. Rittichier, RCCP - Capt Richard C. Yeend, FE - SSgt Elmer L. Holden, and RS - Sgt James D. Locker.

First Medal of Honor to Rescueman

(U) On 14 May 1968, President Johnson presented the Medal of Honor to Captain Gerald O. Young who was previously assigned to the 37ARRS as an HH-3E Jolly Green Rescue Crew Commander. The presentation marked the first time the Nation's highest award has been bestowed upon a member of the Air Force for heroism while assigned to a rescue unit. Captain Young received the award for his heroic actions on 8 and 9 November 1967 after being shot down on a rescue mission.

Sandy RESCORT

~~(S)~~ The 602 Air Commando Squadron moved from Udorn RTAFB, Thailand to Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, Thailand during June 1968. The move places the A-1 Sandies within closer range to the tactical strike areas. Two A-1's stand ground alert and two fly aerial orbits with the Nakhon Phanom HH-3E or Udorn HH-53E helicopter.

Emergency Evacuation of Pattle Island

~~(S)~~ On 20 June 1968, Hq 3ARRGp entered into an agreement with RVN Joint Forecasting Service, Directorate of Meteorology for the emergency evacuation of Pattle Island. Pattle Island is a Vietnamese manned weather station located 210 N.M. east of Da Nang AB, RVN. Emergency evacuation is construed to mean in the agreement evacuation of Vietnamese personnel due to serious illness/injury and/or severe weather conditions. Appendix III is a copy of agreement.

Joint Forecasting Service, Directorate of Meteorology/3ARRGp Agreement
for Emergency Evacuation of Pattle Island

PURPOSE: To outline procedures to be followed when 3ARRGp is tasked to evacuate Meteorological personnel at Pattle Island.

1. General: MACV has directed 7th Air Force (DAR) to make available 3ARRGp forces for emergency evacuation of the Vietnamese Pattle Meteorology Station personnel (5 total) at Pattle Island, (coordinates 16°32'N, 111°36'E)(UTM EJ 640 280) approximately 210 miles east of Da Nang AB RVN, in the South China Sea. This agreement does not encompass resupply or normal rotation of Meteorological Personnel.

2. Responsibilities: The 37ARRS and the 39ARRS are tasked to provide the HH-3E helicopter/HC-130P rescue team for this mission. Every precaution will be taken to insure adequate mission planning and that aircrew personnel and equipment are not committed beyond their capability.

a. The Forecasting Service, Directorate of Meteorology, will determine the necessity for evacuation and inform the Joint Search and Rescue Center (JSARC)(Tan Son Nhut 3210) of the requirement for evacuation, stating the number of personnel to be evacuated and the nature of the emergency.

b. When a request for evacuation with the required data (*) reaches the JSARC, the information received will be evaluated and if feasible SAR operations will be undertaken. The JSARC will alert the 37ARRS and 39ARRS to perform the mission.

(*)(1) Required data to include:

- (a) Nature and seriousness of emergency.
- (b) Number of personnel involved.
- (c) Weather.
- (d) Recovery Site.

All evacuations will normally terminate at Da Nang Air Base, RVN, unless otherwise directed or authorized by the JSARC.

3. Limiting Factors:

a. Communications - AM/CW on 5872 and 3854 kc for transmitting weather in Vietnamese only. Since no direct contact can be made with a USAF agency, notification must come from the Vietnamese Forecasting Service.

b. Operations - As there are no navigational aids on the island, the mission will be limited to daylight VFR only. The HC-130P will provide navigation and helicopter refueling. The 39ARRS will prepare and have available appropriate maps and charts as required to perform the mission.

c. The Amphitrite Group of islands 45 miles to the northeast belong to Communist China. In no case will the mission aircraft penetrate to within 10 miles of this group of islands.

4. Familiarization: The Directorate of Meteorology shall reproduce in Vietnamese sub-paragraphs a through h, below in a briefing form. This printed form will be given to each person to be evacuated before the arrival of the helicopter and will remain in his possession for the duration of the flight.

a. Personnel will stay out of the helicopter approach and landing areas.

b. Do not approach helicopter until asked to board by the helicopter crew.

c. Danger - Do not approach helicopter from the rear.

d. On entering the helicopter take seats as indicated by the crew.

e. Fasten safety belt and keep it fastened for the duration of the flight. Litters if used, will be secured by the crew.

f. No Smoking except when permitted by the crew.

g. Life preservers will be worn during the entire flight.

h. In case of an emergency landing follow the crew's directions for landing and leaving the helicopter. Do not leave the helicopter until the rotor blades have stopped turning. Exit through the door you entered or by any window if the helicopter has overturned. Do not inflate life preserver until you are outside and clear of the helicopter.

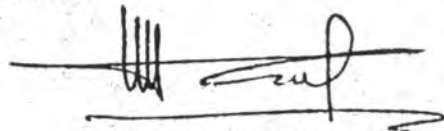
5. The Forecasting Service will brief the personnel on the procedures in paragraph 4, to insure familiarity with the equipment.

6. Landing Areas: The Meteorological department will advise the 3ARRGp when a suitable landing area has been prepared. The landing area will have a diameter of 35 meters and be kept free of plants and debris. The approach to the landing area must be free of poles, wires and other obstructions to flight. 37ARRS and 39ARRS will make a survey flight to the island when 3ARRGp is advised by the Directorate of Meteorology that the landing area is ready. This flight will be coordinated by the JSARC.

7. This agreement is effective upon date of final signature and shall remain in effect until modified or terminated by mutual agreement. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to mean that an evacuation will be performed at the expense of the primary Search and Rescue Mission in support of the military forces.
