COLONEL HOLLON H. BRIDGES

Commander, Third Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group

Prior to assuming command of the Third Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group, Colonel Bridges served as Vice Commander for a three month period. Before his Vietnam assignment, Colonel Bridges was assigned to Headquarters Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service at Orlando AFB, Florida, first as Director of Operations Control and then as Deputy Chief of Staff for Plans.

The Colonel was born in Mars Hill, Maine, on 8 March 1923. He began his military career in 1943 with the U.S. Army's famed Infantry Rangers, later transferring to the Aviation Cadet Program and earning his pilot wings. During World War II, he flew B-24 and B-29 aircraft.

Returning to civilian life in 1945, he became a civilian personnel officer with the War Department in the Pentagon. In 1947, Colonel Bridges was recalled to active duty and participated in the Berlin airlift. For the next three years, he remained in Europe as a personnel officer at the Erding Air Depot.

Later assignments included personnel officer for the Special Weapons Command at Kirtland AFB, New Mexico; flying troop carriers during the Korean conflict; and then three years at Tachikawa AB, Japan, flying C-54's as a Flight Commander and Commander of the Operations Support Squadron.

In 1957, he graduated from the Air Command and Staff College at

Maxwell AFB, Alabama, followed by four years in the Pentagon as Executive Officer for Headquarters Air Force Director of Plans. Colonel Bridges then served as Wing Inspector and Commander of the Air Force Survival School at Stead AFB, Nevada, from 1961 to 1964. Before being assigned to Headquarters Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service in 1965, he was Commander of Shemya Air Force Base Station, Alaska, for one year.

CHAPTER I

MISSION, ORGANIZATION, AND RESOURCES

Mission

Primary Mission

(U) The primary mission of the Third Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group is to provide a tactical force to rescue and recover personnel engaged in operations in or adjacent to hostile territory; provide Local Base Rescue units at selected bases; plan, organize, coordinate, and control the execution of personnel rescue operations; provide command and control of subordinate units; and provide Joint Search and Rescue Center and Rescue Coordination Centers at selected locations. Geographical area of operations is Southeast Asia (SEA).

Subordinate Functions

(U) The Commander 3rd Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group serves on the 7th Air Force staff as Director of Aerospace Rescue (DER). Subordinate functions are:

1. Advises the Commander 7th Air Force on matters pertaining to Rescue and Recovery requirements and procedures.
2. Coordinates on matters pertaining to all Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service activities, requirements, and responsibilities in SEA.
3. Exercises operational control of all rescue forces in SEA in accordance with policies established by the Commander 7th

Air Force and/or Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center (Pac ARRC).

4. Keeps the Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center informed of SAR/Recovery requirements and all planned or conducted SAR operations.

5. Reports directly to the Commander Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center on command and administrative matters.

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OrganizationCommand Organization¹

(U) The 3rd ARRGp is assigned to the Pacific Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Center of the Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service (MAC) and comes under the operational control of the Commander 7th Air Force. The 3rd ARRGp exercises command over the following units:

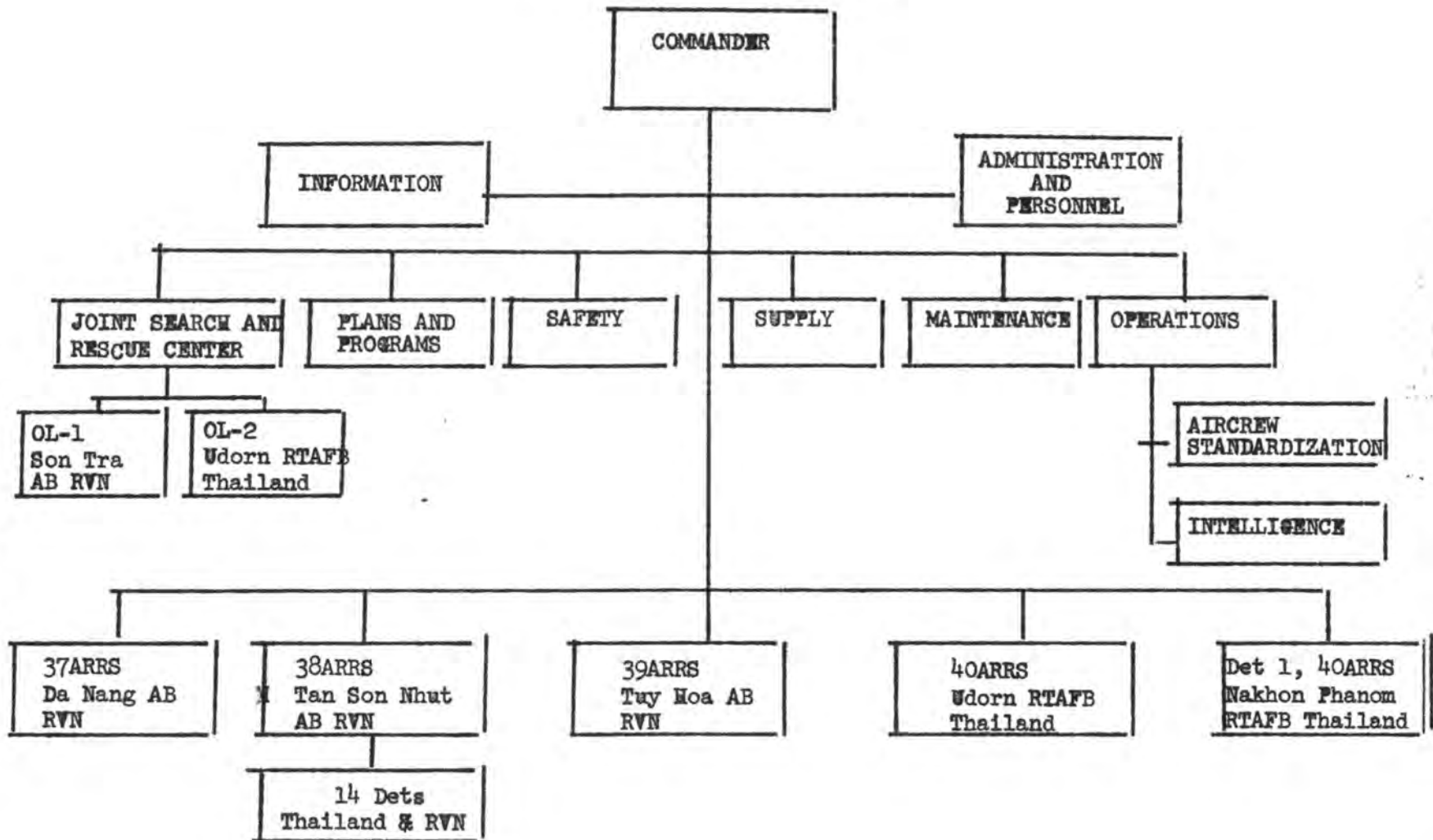

Change of Key Personnel (U)

Colonel Hollon H. Bridges assumed command of 3d Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group on 20 September 1968, replacing Colonel Paul E. Leske who departed for retirement. Colonel Bridges was previously assigned as Vice Commander 3ARRGP.

Major Carroll S. Shershun became Information Officer on 10 August 1968 vice Major William M. Dempsey. Major Shershun was previously assigned as Chief Editorial Division Secretary of the Air Force

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requirements permitted. The July meeting at Taipei, Taiwan, was attended by Captain William B. Byrd, Jr., (37ARRS) and 1/Lt Leone S. Russo (40ARRS). The August meeting held at Clark AB, Philippines, was attended by Captain William B. Byrd, Jr., (37ARRS), Captain Robert E. Thornton (39ARRS), and 1/Lt Leone S. Russo (40ARRS). Heavy Kuma CST, Hawaii.

Records Dispersal Program

(U) Dispersal of personnel records from the 61 Military Air-Lift Wing CEPO at Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii, to host base CEPO's began in late September with an effective date of 1 October 1968. The following units were affected: Detachments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 12, and 13 of the 38ARRSq. Records dispersal action will continue through 1 January 1969 until all units are serviced by their local CEPO's. The difficulty of remaining current with the Personnel Data Systems should be eased as the personnel records are dispersed to unit level.

MAC SEA Junior Officer Council

(U) Since the formation of the MAC SEA Junior Officer Council last March, 38ARRSq units have supported the council when mission requirements permitted. The July meeting at Taipei, Taiwan, was attended by Captain William B. Byrd, Jr., (37ARRS) and 1/Lt Leone S. Russo (40ARRS). The August meeting held at Clark AB, Philippines, was attended by Captain William B. Byrd, Jr., (37ARRS), Captain Robert E. Thornton (39ARRS), and 1/Lt Leone S. Russo (40ARRS). Heavy

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mission requirements in September precluded 3ARRGp representation at the Cam Ranh Bay AB, RVN meeting.

MAC Manpower Survey

(U) The Manpower Survey of 3ARRGp conducted by MAC is still pending. However, action has been completed for reducing the number of pararescue authorizations in HH-3 units. According to Lt Col Pasetti's letter of 7 August 1968, there was no way of increasing maintenance slots in the various units because current events outdated the original study.

Manning Problems

(U) 702X0 Manning. We continued to function during part of this quarter with 702X0 TDY assistance as a temporary relief. An out of cycle requisition was forwarded through channels to Hdq MAC requesting 7 out of cycle gains. Three out of cycle gains reported in mid-September. This AFSC was still critical at the end of the quarter.

(U) 431X0 Manning. A shortage of helicopter mechanics (431X0) persisted throughout the quarter. A request went forward for out of cycle manning, but no relief was noted. The 37ARRBSq, 38ARRBSq, and 40ARRBSq suffered the most. Det 1, 40ARRBSq had no critical manning problems in this AFSC during this period. Percentage wise the picture was as follows:

It was necessary throughout the period to continually TDY 431XO's within the 38ARRSq detachments to maintain an equitable manning status. The 37ARRSq experienced considerable battle damage in July and August. As a result, eight 431XO's were sent TDY for 15 days from Det 1, 40ARRSq to the 37ARRSq. In August, 431XO's were again sent TDY to the 37th for 10 days; 6 from Det 1, 40ARRSq and 6 from 38ARRSq detachments.

Awards and Decorations

(U) A total of 1148 awards and decorations were approved for 3ARRGp personnel during the quarter, of which 23 were Silver Stars.¹

Civic Action Program

(U) 3ARRGp personnel continued their active support of the Co - Nhi - Vien - Viet Hoa Orphanage in the Cholon district of Saigon. Contributions during the quarter included approximately 100 pounds of clothing and \$85.00 donated by Hdq 3ARRGp and Hdq 38ARRSq personnel. Of the money donated by ARRS personnel world-

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wide last quarter, \$720.00 was spent on fans and installation costs for the new classrooms. On 26 September 1968, an American style wiener roast was held at the orphanage for 170 children. Total cost was \$185.00. This was the first time many of the children had ever tasted or seen a hot dog. In addition, Captain Robert Gerard who is fluent in French and a former French instructor at the Air Force Academy continued teaching the Nuns English each Thursday afternoon.

Emphasis On People Program

(U) The following Emphasis On People projects were completed/ and/or started during the quarter:

- (1) A Hdq 3ARRGp permanent rocket/mortar bunker was constructed through self-help.
- (2) The Hdq 3ARRGp coffee bar was remodeled and the surrounding floor area retiled through self-help.
- (3) An aggressive self-help program was begun for improvement of the enlisted barracks. Plans call for lowering the ceilings, constructing two man rooms in lieu of open bay, and tiling all floors.

RESOURCES - AIRCRAFT

—(C)(GP-4) While Headquarters 3rd ARRGp did not possess any aircraft of its own, it is significant to note the aircraft operated by the subordinate units. These aircraft consisted of both fixed wing and rotary wing types. The HC-130P was the only fixed wing aircraft and was assigned to the 39ARRS. The helicopter complement consisted of the following three types; the HH-3E, assigned to the 37ARRS and Det 1, 40ARRS; the HH-43B/F, assigned to the 38ARRS; and the HH-53B assigned to the 40ARRS.

CHAPTER II

OPERATIONS, JSARC, ~~AND~~ TRAINING, + SAFETY

OPERATIONS

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(8) The primary function of the Headquarters Third Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group is to serve as the Command and Control agency for all USAF rescue forces in Southeast Asia. In addition to serving as the operations center for SAR forces, 3ARRGp Operations is responsible for the Standardization/Evaluation, Intelligence, and Training functions Group wide. To accomplish the combat SAR mission, rescue aircraft are strategically positioned throughout Southeast Asia to provide quick response for SAR missions. The HH-3E and HH-53B Jolly Green helicopters stand ground alerts and fly airborne orbits. HC-130P Crown aircraft fly airborne orbits and serve as airborne mission Commanders. In addition, the HC-130P and HH-3E/HH-53's operate as a team using air-to-air refueling to provide rapid reaction time. A1-E Sandy/Spad aircraft provide RESCORT and fire suppression of hostile ground forces. HH-43B/F Pedro aircraft provide Local Base Rescue and a SAR capability within a 75 N.M. radius of action of the base. The authorized force posture for the 3ARRGp is 22 - HH-3E, 6 - HH-53B, 32 - HH-43B/F, and 11 - HC-130P aircraft. The SAR aircraft are deployed on a daily basis in the following manner:

1. HH-3E - 37ARRSq, Da Nang

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- a. Two aircraft stand ground alert at Da Nang.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at a forward operating site at Quang Tri.
 - c. One or two aircraft fly Gulf of Tonkin orbits as required.
2. HH-3E - Det 1, 40ARRSq, Nakhon Phanom
- a. Two aircraft stand ground alert at Nakhon Phanom.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at L-98 and fly an airborne orbit over Northern Laos as required, alternating every third day with the HH-53B's.
3. HH-53 - 40ARRSq, Udorn
- a. One aircraft stands ground alert at Udorn.
 - b. Two aircraft stand ground alert at L-98 and fly airborne orbits over Northern Laos as required, alternating two days out of three with the Nakhon Phanom HH-3E's.
4. HC-130P - 39ARRSq, Tuy Hoa
- a. Crown 1 and 2 fly the morning and afternoon ~~Northern Laos~~ orbit respectively.
 - b. Crown 3 stands ground alert at Udorn.
 - c. Crown 4 and 6 fly the morning and afternoon ^{over water} ~~Gulf of Tonkin~~ orbit respectively.
 - d. Crown 7 stands ground alert at Tuy Hoa.
5. Al-E Sandy's - 602 Special Operations Squadron, Nakhon Phanom *see note*
- a. Four aircraft stand ground alert at Nakhon Phanom.
 - b. Two aircraft fly the airborne orbit in Northern Laos with

the HH-3E or HH-53B and add to the ground alert force when not airborne.

6. Al-E Spads - 6 Special Operations Squadron, Pleiku. Two aircraft stage at Da Nang and stand ground alert.

7. HH-43B/F - 38ARRSq, Tan Son Nhut. Thirty-two aircraft pull 24-hour alerts at 14 bases in South Vietnam and Thailand.

Combat and Non-combat Saves

(U) The units under 3ARRGp were responsible for 51 combat saves and 65 non-combat saves for a total of 116 saves for the quarter.¹ The total number of saves since 1 December 1964 is 1965; 1366 combat and 599 non-combat.

3ARRGp Flying Hours

(U) 3ARRGp units flew a total of 10,722.2 hours during the quarter.²

Commander's Conference

(U) A 3ARRGp Commander's Conference was held at Udorn RTAFB, on 26 and 27 July 1968. The conference was hosted by the 40ARRS. Since the majority of Commanders were recently assigned, this conference was the first opportunity for them to meet each other and discuss mutual topics of interest. A total of 39 agenda items

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were discussed during the conference.

Operations Conference

(U) An Operations Conference was held at Udorn RTAFB, on 9 and 10 August 1968. All 3ARRGy units were represented including controllers from King, Queen, and Compress. In addition, representatives from the 602 Special Operations Squadron (Sandies) and the 6 Special Operations Squadron (Spads) attended.

Replacement for Combat Loss

~~(C)(GP-4)~~ The replacement HH-3E for the 9 June 1968 combat loss arrived at the 37ARRSq on 26 September 1968. This brings the 37ARRSq back to programmed strength of 14 aircraft.

Navy Pilot Exchange Program

~~(C)(GP-4)~~ The Navy Pilot Exchange Program was initiated on 18 September 1968. This is a mutual exchange of Rescue HH-3 pilots with Navy CH-3 pilots for 30 day periods; two at the 37ARRSq and two at Det 1, 40ARRSq. Our four rescue pilots fly with the Gulf of Tonkin aircraft carriers. The purpose of the program is to provide an interchange of experience between the two distinctive SAR missions.

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Pedro Pilot Killed In Action

(U) An HH-43 Pedro from Det 13, 38ARRSq (Phu Cat AB) was scrambled on a SAR mission on 17 September 1968 to recover five Dustoff (Army Air Ambulance) crewmembers who were shot down. As the Pedro was attempting the pick up, heavy ground fire was experienced. The Rescue Crew Commander, Captain David H. Pittard, was hit in the left side and pronounced dead upon arrival at Qui Nhon. The aircraft received severe battle damage, but was able to recover to Phu Cat.

Rescue Force Posture

(S)(GP-4) During the quarter, the Udorn HH-53B's and Nakhon Phanom HH-3E's resumed pulling ground alert between the morning and afternoon strikes at a forward operating location in Northern Laos, Lima 98. This positioning of the SAR force provided for a faster reaction time in addition to reducing the number of flying hours required for a continuous aerial orbit.

Standardization

(U) Arrival of Personnel

Pilot, arrived on 13 September 1968. Captain Wells departed TDY for Det 7, 38ARRS to gain first hand operational experience pending Major John E. Shaeffer's 4 November 1968 DEROS.

(U) Standardization Staff Visits

During the quarter, Major Robert A. Bunker, Chief of Aircrew Standardization; Major John E. Shaeffer, HH-43 Standardization Officer; and MSgt Clarence R. Boles, Jr., conducted twelve formal staff assistance visits and seven informal visits.⁴

Distinguished Visitors

(U) Brigadier General Allison C. Brooks, Commander ARRS, visited all 3ARRGp units during the period 15 September through 24 September 1968.

(U) Colonel Donald T. Smith, Commander Pac ARRC, visited the following 3ARRGp units between the period 27 September through 29 September 1968: 37ARRS, Hq 3ARRGp, Hq 38ARRS, Det 14, 38ARRS, and Det 10, 38ARRS.

Joint Search and Rescue Center (JSARC)

(U) The primary ^{MISSION} purpose of the Joint Search and Rescue Center is to provide coordinated direction of multi-service forces when they are involved in search and rescue operations. The secondary purpose is to develop a free and unrestricted flow of information that establishes close coordination and action between all U.S. Forces in Southeast Asia.

~~(C)(S)~~ The Commander 7th Air Force is the SAR Coordinator for the Southeast Asia Sub-Region which includes the land and water areas within the Saigon, Bangkok, and Rangoon Flight Information Regions⁵. He maintains the Joint Search and Rescue Center under his Directorate of Aerospace Rescue (Commander 3rd Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Group) at Tan Son Nhut AB, RVN. Because of the size of the SAR area and the limited number of primary SAR forces, it is imperative that personnel and equipment from all services are available for rapid SAR response. Although each service Commander maintains control of his forces, a centralized coordination of all SAR activities is necessary. JSARC (King) and the subordinate Rescue Coordination Centers; Queen, at Son Tra AB, RVN, and Compress, at Udorn RTAFB, Thailand, provide an around-the-clock operation to coordinate SAR activities. The Commander 631 Combat Support Group, Don Muang RTAFB, Thailand, is responsible for SAR activities within the Rangoon FIR. Through close cooperation with

the 7th Air Force Command Center and subordinate Tactical Air Control Centers, the JSARC maintains a quick response SAR posture.

SAR Task Force (SARTF) Briefing Team

(U) Overall command and control procedures for SAR Task Forces were briefed to ~~the~~ theater air traffic control, command center, tactical fighter wings, and primary SAR personnel during ^{OCTOBER, NOVEMBER} August ^{DECEMBER} and September 1968. The SARTF briefing team consisted of a JSARC controller, pilots from "Crown", "Jolly Green", and "Sandy" units, and a representative from the Command and Control 7th Air Force Division (DOCC).⁶ In addition, a weekly SAR briefing is given to newly assigned aircrew personnel of the 460 Tactical Reconnaissance Wing and the 834 Air Division.

Sandy Pilot on SARTF Briefing Team

(U) Major Charles Flynn, an experienced "Sandy" pilot from the 602 Special Operations Squadron, was assigned TDY to 3ARRGp during August and September 1968. He served as a member of the SARTF briefing team, as an advisor to JSARC during rescue missions in hostile areas, and coordinated A-1 aircraft Rescue Escort (RESCORT) requirements with 7th Air Force staff sections. He also briefed pilots of the 39ARRS and 6 Special Operations Squadron on Sandy RESCORT tactics.

7AFM 64-1, Search and Rescue Southeast Asia

~~(a)(GP-4)~~ JSARC, in cooperation with 7th Air Force Command and Control Division, revised the portion of 7AFM 64-1 covering composition, execution, and control of SAR support forces. The revision was published as Change 1 to 7AFM 64-1 and dated 12 October 1963. The new procedures contained in the change eliminates the need for "Crown" crews to coordinate the aerial refueling of RESCAP fighter aircraft, provide better communications procedures and discipline, and reduce unauthorized participation in rescue efforts.

JSARC/Army Coordination

(U) Lt Colonel Henderson, the Army Liaison Officer assigned to JSARC, instituted procedures during July for close coordination on the local level between the 38ARRS detachments and Army Air Ambulance units to prevent HH-43 "Pedros" and UH-1 Army "Dustoffs" from launching on the same emergency medi-evac missions. He also arranged for Army CH-54 "Flying Crane" support from Da Nang for the recovery of battle damaged HH-3E helicopters in the Da Nang Sector without the need for Hdq USARV approval, as was previously required. He also coordinated the ready availability of Army CH-47 "Chinook" helicopters for rescue missions beyond the range of HH-43's off the southern coast of South Vietnam. Arrangements were made for changes to Army aircraft call sign and frequency lists to be obtained from

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USARV and distributed to 3ARRGP units.

Standard Survival Procedures Developed

(U) On ~~30 July 1968~~, JBARC initiated a ^{yle} standard procedure for use of survival radios by downed aircrew members within SEA. ^{HAS PROVEN}
^{real effective during this exercise}
 The new procedure expedites the electronic phase of a search, the establishment of voice contact with the survivor, and permits rescue aircraft to distinguish between the sounding of a beeper by a downed aircrew member and accidental transmission or testing of emergency radios. The procedure (15 second tone, voice call sign, listening out for 15 seconds, and repeated until voice contact established) ^{IS BEING} will be taught at the Pacific Jungle Survival School, ~~included in future printings of survival booklets and technical orders on emergency radios, and has been dispatched to all major commands worldwide and relayed to their subordinate units operating in Southeast Asia.~~ ^{is being used at all including}

① Rescue Information Reports

(U) After coordination with 7th Air Force Security and Intelligence Sections, JBARC provided specific guidance to all 3ARRGP units regarding the security classification of Rescue Information Reports to provide uniformity and prevent overclassification. AFR 205-1 and "The Security Classification Guide to Southeast Asia" were too general to provide the needed guidance. Narrative reports initiated by one unit are now being distributed to other 3ARRGP units, the 48ARRS, Pacific Jungle Survival School, and all A-1 and tactical

fighter wings within the theater, as well as the mandatory addressees in accordance with ARPSM 55-2. This wider distribution disseminates lessons learned during a rescue mission to possible participants in future missions. 3ARRGp Supplement 1 to ARPSM 55-2 was revised and published on 11 July 1968 to incorporate Rescue Information Report reporting instructions directed by higher headquarters that were not previously contained in a permanent directive.

JSARC Controllers Attend P/SH

(U) All JSARC, OL-1, and OL-2 Officer Rescue Controllers who had not previously attended Pacific Jungle Survival School received the training during this quarter. The training enables a controller to anticipate the actions of a downed survivor who has received similar training.

Training

M-16 Refresher Training

(U) During the quarter, a refresher course on the care and handling of the M-16 rifle was instituted for all airman assigned to Hdq 3ARRGp and Hdq 3SARRS.

Recondo School

(U) Eight 3ARRGp pararescuemen completed the Recondo School during the quarter. 3ARRGp has been given a quota for two personnel for each Recondo class.⁷

On-the-Job Training

(U) An average of 723 airmen were assigned Group wide during the quarter with an average of 195 on OJT (27%). The overall SKT passing rate this quarter for 3ARRGP was 67%; 67% for five level and 67% for seven level.

(U) A comprehensive 3ARRGP regulation (50-2) was published 1 June 1968. The intent of regulation is to clarify the major areas of misunderstanding noted among our subordinate units and assist them by consolidating the major procedural requirements.

(U) 1SG William P. Lyons, 3ARRGP OJT Program Supervisor, departed on 12 August 1968 and was replaced by SSgt Eugene R. Johnson on 22 August 1968. SSgt Johnson was previously assigned to the 616 Military Airlift Support Squadron here at Tan Son Nhut and is a fully qualified training technician (75LXO).

(U) Major Robert E. Grutzik, 3ARRGP OJT Administrator, and SSgt Johnson will attend the 61 Military Airlift Wing OJT Conference at Hickam AFB, Hawaii, 22-25 October 1968. The OJT supervisors from 37ARRS, 39ARRS, 40ARRS, and Det 1, 40ARRS will also attend.

CHAPTER III

MAINTENANCE AND SUPPLY

MaintenanceMission

(U) The principle mission of the Maintenance and Supply Section is to provide operationally ready aircraft for all rescue needs.

NORM/NORS Rates

(U) During the period of this report, the 3ARRGp Operational ready rate was 84.5%, the NORM rate 10.7%, and the NORS rate 4.8%.

The break down by aircraft was as follows:

HH-3E IRAN Program

(U) The IRAN facility at Don Muang RTAFB, Thailand processed one HH-3E, Number 64-14230, during the quarter. This facility has one dock and is operated by the Lockheed Aircraft Service Company. On 1 September 1968, the Thai-Am Corporation began operation of a one dock IRAN facility at Don Muang. The two dock program and improved supply support will provide a greater IRAN capability and faster service in the future.

HH-53B T-64 Engine Program

(U) The Jet Engine Field Maintenance (JEFM) facility at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, Thailand, was not operational yet due to the lack of an adapter kit for the T-64 jet engine test stand. *The adapter kit is scheduled to arrive during January, 1969.* ~~A firm delivery for the adapter kit was not established.~~ In addition AFR 11-4 host/tenant agreements have not been completed. These support problems have been referred to PACAF and MAC for resolution. Until the JEFM is fully operational, HH-53 engines are airlifted to North Island Naval Air Station, San Diego, California for processing.

HH-43B/F Rotor Blade Attrition

(U) Kaman Aircraft Corporation has developed an experimental fiberglass rotor blade for the HH-43. The blades were released for field testing in late September. DET 13, 38ARRS at Phu Cat AB, RVN, is the only SEA unit involved in the testing of this new blade.

Aircraft Battle Damage and Losses

~~(C)(DP-4)~~ A total of seven aircraft sustained battle damage during the quarter as a result of hostile action.¹ Two of the seven aircraft, HC-130P's, were totally destroyed when VC sapper teams penetrated the base defenses at Tuy Hoa AB, RVN, on 27 July 1968. Replacement aircraft were received during the last week of August 1968. This brings the total aircraft losses in 3ARRGp to 22; 10 - HH-3E, 7 - HH-43, 3 - HU-16, and 2 - HC-130P.

1. Appendix 8 lists the battle damaged aircraft by type for each month of the quarter.

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3ARRGp Materiel Conference

(U) On 9 and 10 September, the 3ARRGp Materiel Section conducted the first Materiel Conference in the history of the Group. Twenty topics in the Maintenance/Supply field were discussed by representatives from the squadrons comprising the group. Although several problems were unsolved, the most significant achievement was a greatly improved spirit of coordination and cooperation fostered between the squadrons and Group Headquarters.

SupplyChange in Personnel

(U) Captain Radford L. Reavis arrived on 6 September 1968 vice Captain Herbert N. Ehrlich, 3ARRGp Supply Officer who has a 12 November 1968 DEROS. Lt Joseph H. Fischer arrived on 8 September 1968 and assumed duties as 3BARRS Supply Officer vice Lt Robert J. Dallenbach who departed on 6 September 1968.

Significant NORS Rates

(U) The HH-3E NORS rate rose to 8.3% this quarter. The primary reason was battle damage to 37ARRS aircraft. DET 1, 40ARRS achieved 0% NORS rate for two months of the quarter and only .5% for the other month.

(U) The HH-53B NORS rate continued to drop significantly again this quarter; e.g., 12.4% or previous quarter to 7.1% this quarter. In September, the 40th achieved the first 0% NORS rate in the unit's history.

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CHAPTER IV

PLANS AND REQUIREMENTS

(U) During the past quarter the Group Plans and Requirements Section continued or initiated action on the following projects:

3rd ARRGp Programming Plan 1

(U) On 8 July 1968, the 3rd ARRGp Programming Plan 1 was officially terminated. Uncompleted programming actions in this plan have been overcome by events and are no longer applicable due to changes in our force disposition.

Programming Action: ARRS Programming Plan 589

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ The ARRS Programming Plan 589 has been received and is now in effect. This plan covers the actions required for the movement, delivery, and logistic support of four HH-53C's to the 40ARRS, Udorn RTAFB, Thailand. Due to late receipt of the plan, it was requested that events scheduled for completion in June be slipped 30 days; ARRS concurred in this. Delivery dates for the C-models are for two aircraft to be delivered on or about 15 ^{16 Jan} December 1968 and two on or about 15 ^{17 Jan} January 1969. Aircraft are to be brought by ship to Sattahip, Thailand, and flown from the port to Udorn. As the HH-53C's are delivered, the HH-3E force at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, Thailand, is to be reduced on a one-to-one basis. Initial plans are for the reduction of two aircraft in January 1969, followed by two more in ^{March} February 1969.

Seek Dawn

~~(S)(GP-4)~~ Installation of new radio equipment for OL-1 and

OL-2 under the 7th Air Force Seek Dawn program has been further delayed, pending funding. Latest information indicates the program will commence in April 1969. No completion date is available.

SEAOR Review

(U) 3ARRGp has the primary responsibility for the following SEAOR's:

#125. Bullet Resistant Windshields and Side View Panels for Rescue and Support Helicopters.

#144. Survival Kit Gas Masks.

#170. Hover Weight Computer.

A 7th Air Force SEAOR Review and Revalidation Board was held on 18 July 1968 to discuss removal or downgrading of the current SEAOR's. Major Edwin M. Weissler, Plans and Requirements Officer for 3rd ARRGp, attended the Board and was successful in supporting the Group's position that the above SEAOR's should remain in effect and should not be downgraded.

#46. Rescue Direction Finding and Ranging System. Dated 3 April 1966. Development and funding for four prototypes has been approved. Production for Class V Modification is contingent upon successful testing and evaluation. Test evaluation and recommendations was suspended for 30 September 1968.

#58. Pararescue Transceiver Helmet. Dated 28 September 1966. Magnavox Corporation has been awarded the contract with an 8 December 1968 production suspense.

#60. Tactical Employment Command and Control System. Dated 17 October 1966. Funding approved. No estimate available.

#97. Modernize Doppler System for HH-3E. Dated 21 July 1967. Awaiting funding. No estimate date.

#102. Automatic Integral Weight and Balance System. Dated 3 August 1967. Suspense for the best preliminary estimate was 30 July 1968 for the HH-53 system.

#111. Aircraft Fuel Cell Explosion Suppression. Dated 3 April 1967. Estimated scheduled for HC-130P; start date - March 1969, and completion June 1970. HH-43, HH-3, and HH-53 are converted to SEACR Class V Mod.

#112. Identification Panels. Dated 3 April 1967. Issue completed. Item closed.

#114. Search and Rescue Night Recovery System. Dated 3 April 1967. Estimated schedule: Approval - February 1969; start work - June 1970; and complete - November 1970.

#123. Discretionary Descent System. Dated 17 April 1967. Converted to PACAF ROC (Required Operational Capability) 21-68. Item Closed.

#125. Bullet Resistant Windshields and Side View Panel for SEA Rescue and Support Helicopter. Dated 17 April 1967. No state of the art solution in sight. Weight is a limiting on the HH-3, but is not a factor on the HH-53.

#129. Redundant Start Systems and Battery for HH-53B. Dated 21 February 1968. Money request in staff coordination. Estimate work to begin June 1969, and completed by June 1970.

#144. Survival Kit Gas Masks. Dated 31 July 1967. Operational testing and evaluation proved the XM-28 Mask was unacceptable. A new approach is needed.

#170. Hover Weight Computer. Dated 29 February 1969. Estimated schedule: Validate - May 1968; approval - May 1968; start work - July 1968; and complete - August 1968.

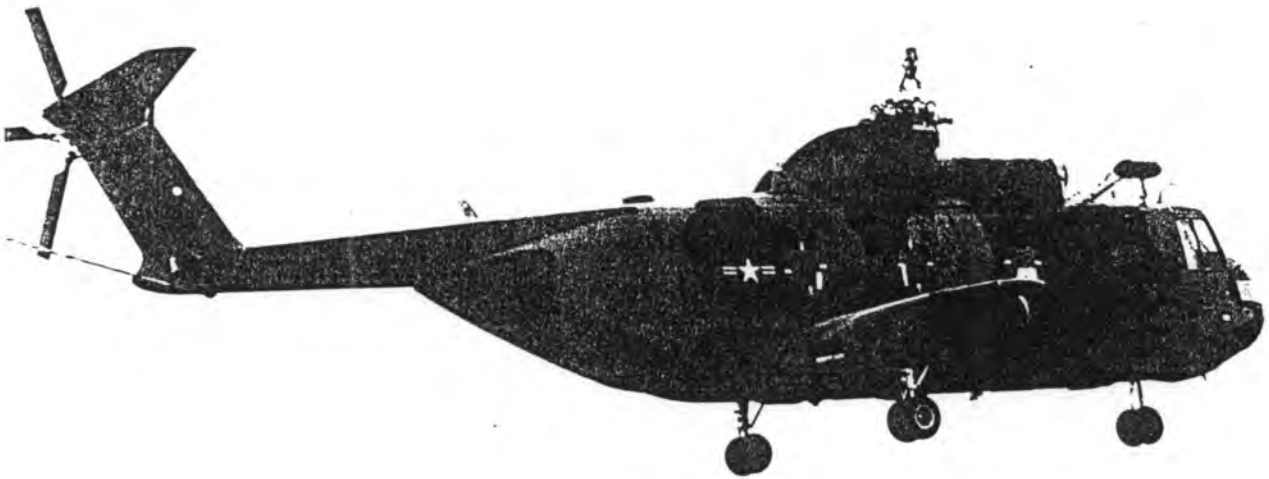

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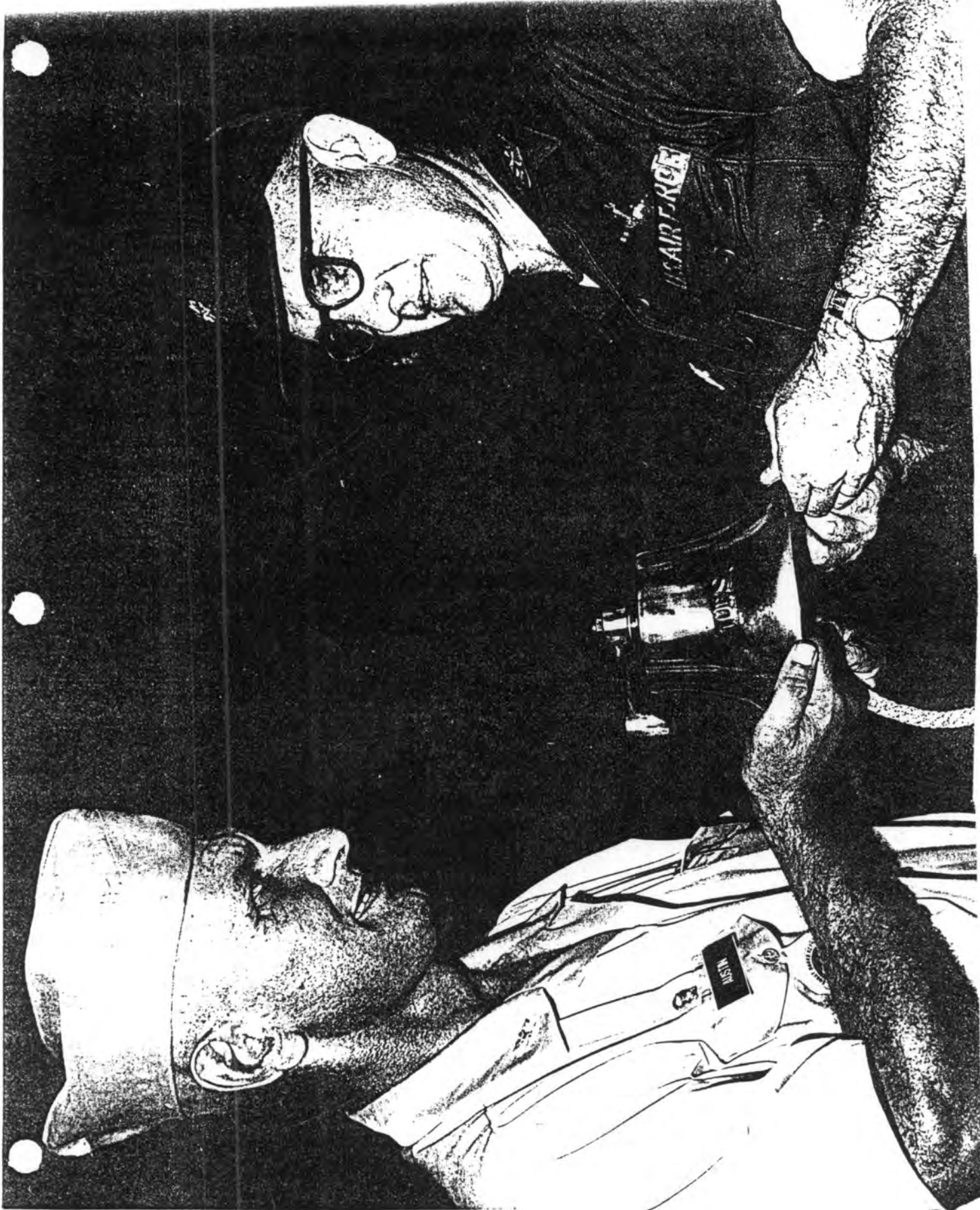
