LOLO

COVER PHOTO ANALYSIS

VHPA member Mike Slonkier has spent countless hours searching Cliff Whiting's pictures of FSB LOLO which were most likely taken on the afternoon of 5 Mar, 1971. Mike talked to over 20 "LOLO veterans", listened to tapes of radio transmissions, collected copies of a dozen "LOLO photos", consulted Defense Intelligence Agency material and the VHPA KIA/MIA data, and read numerous After Action reports. The notes on this page summarize the events of March 3rd - the initial assault of LZ LOLO.

- A** WO Gary Arne, Rattler 23, 71st AHC, flew UH-1H #67-17269, the first aircraft shot down. He was Chalk 2 in the initial assault. The tail rotor was shot out on final, he lost hydraulics, and the engine quit. The Huey was skewered on a broken tree. The crew was evacuated that afternoon.
- B** 71st AHC UH-1H #69-15358 was Chalk 4 in the initial assault and the second aircraft shot down. The CE was Will Fortenberry but the names of the other crew members are not known.
- C** WO Robert Morris, Comanchero 39, A/101 AHB, flew the third aircraft forced down during the initial assault. The aircraft caught fire after they had dropped off the ARVN. Knowing there were no friendly bases nearby he returned to LOLO. They were streaming fuel and had other battle damage when they landed but the fire was out. Many believe this Huey was retrieved from LOLO on the 5th or the 6th. The crew was evacuated that afternoon.
- D** CW2 John Gale, Comanchero 14, A/101 AHB, flew UH-1H #67-17720, the fourth aircraft shot down. He was Chalk 18 (the 8th Comanchero) in the assault. They took heavy fire, especially on the right side, during the approach and caught fire. CPT Gerald Crews, the copilot on this ship, was a former SF officer and helped organize the ARVN, the artillery, and air strikes around the base. SP4 Boop, the CE, took several photos on LOLO including a striking series of three showing 720 burning.
- E** WO Manuel Catzoela, a Lancer, B/158 AHB, flew the fifth UH-1H downed on LOLO. His aircraft was hit by an RPG as they started to leave the LZ and burned rather quickly. 1LT Charles R. Anderson, the copilot, was hit in the head by the main rotor and died on the spot as he left the aircraft and started running toward the trench. Their CE, possibly SP4 Paul Sgambati, received a serious head wound during the approach. He was unconscious when they crashed, was evacuated that afternoon, but died soon thereafter. They were the only LOLO fatalities.
- F** A CH-47 landing to lavender smoke with possibly the sixth 105mm howitzer.
- G** The 174th AHC's gun platoon, the Sharks, lost two UH-1Cs, #66-15094 and #66-15169 during action near LOLO. Most everyone involved believe the gunships crashed on the face of the escarpment and not on the LOLO. The only explanation for this white area is that a bomb had shattered one of the boulders.

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Dear VHPA Member:

We sincerely hope you will enjoy the 1994 Directory - the 11th edition produced by the VHPA. Just as the LOH in the hotel lobby added a special touch to our 11th Reunion in July, we believe this Directory adds something special to your VHPA membership.

The VHPA passed another major mile stone this year - we now have names and addresses for over 10,000 living Vietnam Era helicopter pilots. When we add what we know about those who have died since the war plus the KIA/MIAs, we can account for over 13,000. And how do we do this? Simple - one person at a time. Approximately two pilots join the VHPA every business day. And we learn of one new potential member or someone who passed away almost every day.

The response to the new features in the 1993 edition (e.g. expanded indices, the songs section, pocket patches on the cover) was very positive. The membership response to the Newsletter articles requesting input concerning LAM SON 719 exceeded our expectations. A lot of people wanted to get involved in this year's production. As the various VHPA committees worked to prepare the 1994 VHPA Calendar and Volume 1 of the Historical Reference Directory, our expertise and knowledge expanded considerably. All these factors plus a lot of hard work and creativity went into making this Directory for you.

As is our tradition, the theme in the front cover "dedicates" the 1994 Directory to those who flew in and supported the DEWEY CANYON II / LAM SON 719 operation - the incursion into Laos during February and March of 1971. Many VHPAers have especially poignant feelings on this subject. It is not the VHPA's position to judge history but we can certainly do something about collecting, recording, and disseminating member's feelings. The photos of LOLO on the front cover and the DUSTOFF rescue of a UH-1C gunship crew on the rear cover sort of sum up the terror and the camaraderie of those times. The American air crews had to hang tough together else none would survive.

In year's past, the Directory included a "gift" - a bumper sticker for example. While you can still get a bumper sticker from VHPA headquarters, we thought this year people might enjoy looking at a tactical map again. Many VHPAers wish they still had the old one they used in Vietnam. Enjoy!

In closing, please remember that the VHPA is only as good as we make it!! We need your comments, suggestions, additions, corrections, address changes, information on other Vietnam Era pilots (living or dead), unit histories, copies of Vietnam Era orders and flight class rosters, articles for the Newsletter, photos for the VHPA Calendar - they are always welcome.

Photo and Map Credits

VHPA member Cliff Whiting took the photo on the front cover on the afternoon of March 5 or 6 with an Instamatic 126. Cliff flew with the 48th AHC and after being released for the day, overflew LOLO on his own because he had learned that a flight school classmate, 1LT Charlie Anderson, had been killed on the LZ during the initial assault on the 3rd. After slowing the aircraft to 40 knots and giving the controls to the other pilot, Cliff snapped several pictures. Refer to Cliff's material in the 5 Mar area of the Lam Son 719 history for more details.

VHPA members Cliff Whiting and Dan Grigsby were kind enough to loan the VHPA their tactical maps. Information written on both maps was merged and augmented with data other VHPAers, from maps printed in Into Laos and the 101st Airborne Division's after action report for the map reproduced as an insert for this Directory.

VHPA member Marty Heuer provided the three photos and the "song book" cover that appear in the Songs section.

VHPA member Fred Thompson took the photo on the rear cover about mid-day on 21 Feb with a 35 mm camera. Fred was in the right seat of the other 174th AHC UH-1C. The AC of the DUSTOFF was VHPA member Howard 'Mo' Modjeski. One of the wounded crew members was VHPA member Bruce Marshall. Bruce, Fred, and Mo were flight schoolmates. "Surfer Girl" was the name of the downed Shark gunship. The ship was never recovered.

VHPA member Mike Sloniker "found" the LAM SON 719 related material for the VHPA Directory Committee and deserves everyone's thanks for helping get it published.

SECTION I - Constitution

Approved July 1993

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be known as the "Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association", hereafter referred to as the "VHPA". It is an organization for all helicopter pilots who flew in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era, (1961 - 1975).

ARTICLE II - OBJECTIVES

The VHPA is dedicated to the fulfillment of the following purposes:

- a. To enhance and accredit the cohesiveness, esprit de corps, and traditions of valor of rotary wing aircrews that flew in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era.
- b. To seek out, using whatever means available, individuals who piloted rotary wing aircraft in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era and inform them of the existence of the VHPA and encourage all eligible individuals to become members.

ARTICLE III - OPERATION

Section I. The VHPA will operate on a calendar year basis.

Section II. The VHPA shall operate as a not for profit organization.

Section III. An annual audit will be conducted by a recognized financial agency selected by the Executive Council.

ARTICLE IV - REUNIONS

Section I. There shall be an annual Reunion of the VHPA.

Section II. The annual Reunion shall be conducted at a place and time as determined by the Executive Council.

Section III. The Executive Council shall announce the date and place selected for the annual reunion not later than one year prior to the annual reunion.

Section IV. In the event of a national or natural emergency, the Executive Council shall have the authority to cancel or postpone annual Reunions.

ARTICLE V - MEMBERSHIP

Section I. Membership is open to all helicopter pilots who flew in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era, (1961 - 1975).

Section II. Members shall be classified as Life, General, and Honorary. To be recognized as an active member in any of these classifications, the member must be in good standing and current in his dues.

Section III. Membership classifications are as follows:

- a. Life membership will be conferred upon an individual eligible for membership who pays a specified amount of dues as directed by the Executive Council and approved by the general membership.
- b. General membership will be conferred upon an individual eligible for membership who pays a specified amount of dues, annually, as directed by the Executive Council and approved by the general membership..
- c. Honorary membership is open to distinguished persons, such as aviation pioneers, guest speakers and aviation dignitaries. Honorary memberships must be voted upon by the Executive Council.

ARTICLE VI - ORGANIZATION OF THE ASSOCIATION

Section I. The officers of the VHPA shall be as follows:

- a. President.
- b. Vice President (who shall be President-elect and shall succeed the President).
- c. Three Members at Large.
- d. The Immediate Past President.

Section II. The Executive Council shall consist of:

- a. President.
- b. Vice President.
- c. Three Members at Large.
- d. The Immediate Past President.
- e. Secretary/Treasurer.

Section III. Holding office or other positions of influence and trust shall be limited to eligible members as defined in this Constitution.

Section IV. Responsibility and Authority of the Executive Council:

- a. The Executive Council shall be the governing body of the VHPA. It shall be responsible for the management of the affairs of the VHPA, including funds, programs and regulations. It shall have authority to approve budgets, authorize expenditures, seek and accept contributions and approve annual meeting sites and program arrangements.
- b. A majority opinion of the Executive Council shall prevail in all matters pertaining to the VHPA.
- c. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have a vote only as a tiebreaker.
- d. In addition to business conducted at the Annual Reunion, there shall be three quarterly conference calls made by the Executive Council between annual reunions for the purpose of conducting VHPA business. Said calls are to be conducted at a time that is convenient for the majority of the Executive Council members. The President or Secretary/Treasurer shall have the authority to initiate additional conference calls as deemed necessary.
- e. The Executive Council may delegate authority and functions to the Secretary/Treasurer or specific members of the VHPA.
- f. The Executive Council shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Constitution and Bylaws.

Section V. Committees

- a. The VHPA will have the following standing committees whose duties and responsibilities are outlined in the job descriptions and policy statements approved by the Executive Council.
 1. Directory
 2. Data Base
 3. Historical
 4. Membership
 5. Newsletter
 6. Public Relations
 7. Reunion
- b. Vacancies for the chairmanship of all committees will be filled by appointment by the President.
- c. All appointments to chairmanship of committees are subject to ratification by the Executive Council.

ARTICLE VII - VOTING

Section I. All active members with the exception of Honorary members are entitled to vote.

Section II. Attending members in good standing are eligible to vote and shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at annual meetings of the VHPA.

ARTICLE VIII - CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

The Constitution and Bylaws may be amended by the following procedures:

- a. Proposed amendments will be submitted to the VHPA Headquarters or any VHPA Officer 90 days prior to the annual reunion.
- b. The Executive Council must approve the proposed amendment(s).
- c. The adoption of the amendment(s) at an annual meeting of the VHPA is by a two-thirds majority of the members present and voting at the business session.

ARTICLE IX - CHAPTERS

Chapters may be initiated upon approval of the Executive Council. Chapters may have such officers, organization, and meetings as they may determine; not in conflict with the Constitution and Bylaws of the VHPA. Each chapter will be required to provide the Executive Council with the names of its officers and activities on an annual basis.

BYLAWS

CHAPTER 1 - MEMBERS

1. Honorary memberships shall be conferred by the Executive Council for life.

CHAPTER 2 - EXPULSION FROM MEMBERSHIP

1. Members of any classification, including elected and appointed officials, may be expelled for cause or conduct which the Executive Council deems contrary to the best interest of the VHPA.
2. General members shall be suspended for nonpayment of annual dues and shall be dropped from the active membership roster.

CHAPTER 3 - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

1. A Vice President and a Junior Member at Large shall be elected by a majority vote of those members present and voting at the annual reunion business meeting.
2. A Vice President shall be elected to a consecutive 3 year term on the Executive Council. The first year he will be the Vice President. The second year he will be the President. The third year he will be the Immediate Past President.
3. Members at Large shall be elected to a consecutive 3 year term on the Executive Council. The first year he will be the Junior Member at Large. The second year he will be the Midterm Member at Large. The third year he will be the Senior Member at Large.
4. Individuals newly elected to office shall be installed to that office at the close of the annual reunion.
5. Individuals already holding office shall advance to the next position of their term at the close of the annual reunion.
6. The election of officers shall be done by ballots. Should there be only one candidate for an office, than the ballot requirement shall be waived.

CHAPTER 4 - EARLY SUCCESSION TO OFFICE

1. Should the President resign, become incapacitated, or otherwise be unable to fulfill the duties of the Presidency, then the Vice President (President Elect) shall succeed him as President for the remainder of the resigning or incapacitated president's term. At the completion of the resigning or incapacitated president's term, the president shall begin serving the term of the Presidency for which he was initially elected. The position of Vice President shall remain vacant until the annual reunion.
2. Should the Vice President resign, become incapacitated, or otherwise be unable to fulfill the duties of the Vice Presidency, the position of Vice President shall remain vacant for the duration of the term of the resigning or incapacitated Vice President. A President and a Vice President shall be elected at the next annual reunion.
3. Should both the President and Vice President resign or become incapacitated, then the Senior Member at Large shall assume the duties of the Presidency (become Acting President) for the remainder of the term of the President who has just resigned or become incapacitated, but he shall not automatically succeed to the position of President after his term of Acting President has expired. A President and Vice President shall be elected at the next annual reunion with the new President's one year term beginning at the close of the annual reunion. The Immediate Past President shall serve one additional year on the Executive Council.
4. Should the Senior Member at Large resign, become incapacitated, or become the Acting President, then the following shall automatically take place.
 - a. The Midterm Member at Large shall immediately become the Acting Senior member at Large. He shall remain the Acting Senior Member at Large until he succeeds to the position of Senior Member at Large under the terms to which he was initially elected.
 - b. The Junior Member at Large shall immediately become the Acting Midterm Member at Large. He shall remain the Acting Midterm Member at Large until he succeeds to the position of Midterm Member at Large under the terms to which he was initially elected.
5. Should the Midterm Member at Large resign, become incapacitated, or become the Acting Senior Member at Large, the Junior Member at Large shall immediately become the Acting Midterm Member at Large. He shall remain the Acting Midterm Member at Large until he succeeds to the position of Midterm Member at Large under the terms to which he was initially elected.
6. Should the Junior Member at Large resign, become incapacitated, or become the Acting Midterm Member at Large, the President or Acting President shall offer the position of Acting Junior Member at Large to previous members of the Executive Council, subject to appointee's ratification by the Executive Council. A Junior and Midterm Member at Large shall be elected at the next annual reunion.
7. Should the Immediate Past President resign, become incapacitated, or otherwise be unable to fulfill the duties of the Immediate Past President, the President or Acting President shall offer the position of Immediate Past President to any qualified previous Executive Council Member, to be ratified by the Executive Council.

CHAPTER 5 - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. The President shall preside at the business meetings of the VHPA annual reunion and all Executive Council meetings.
2. The President shall appoint or remove Committee Chairman subject to ratification by the Executive Council.
3. The duties of the officers shall be those which are customary for such office and such other functions as may be prescribed by the Constitution and Bylaws of the VHPA, the Executive Council, and written job descriptions.

CHAPTER 6 - SECRETARY/TREASURER

1. The Secretary/Treasurer shall be appointed or removed by the Executive Council.
2. Once appointed, the Secretary/Treasurer shall serve in that capacity for an unspecified term.
3. The Secretary/Treasurer will be responsible to sign all checks for debts incurred by the VHPA along with the President of the VHPA (in the President's absence, the Vice President).

SECTION II - Members and Potential Members

The following roster is an alphabetical listing (by last then first name) of all 10,261 living helicopter pilots who flew in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Era and were known to the VHPA as of 19 August 1994. These 10,261 pilots include 613 Life, 6,940 General, and 2,708 Potential VHPA members. The data for the 76 pilots that passed away after joining the VHPA is listed in the Deceased roster. As in the 1993 Directory, each Life Member is identified with a large* following his name. All VHPA members that are "active" (either Life Members or General Members current with their VHPA membership dues) appear with their names in **bold print**. All VHPA General Members whose annual membership dues are not current and all pilots who have not yet joined the VHPA (Potential Members) appear with their names in normal print. The names of all pilots, Members or Potential Members, appearing in the Directory for the first time have their names underlined.

The VHPA needs everyone's assistance to keep this roster accurate and to reach the goal of having ALL LIVING VIETNAM ERA HELICOPTER PILOTS included in this roster. For example, if you see a friend in this roster who's address is marked with a question mark (VHPA's mail is being returned) and you have a current address, please send it to VHPA Headquarters. If you know the name and address of a Vietnam Era helicopter pilot not included in this roster, please send it to VHPA Headquarters.
