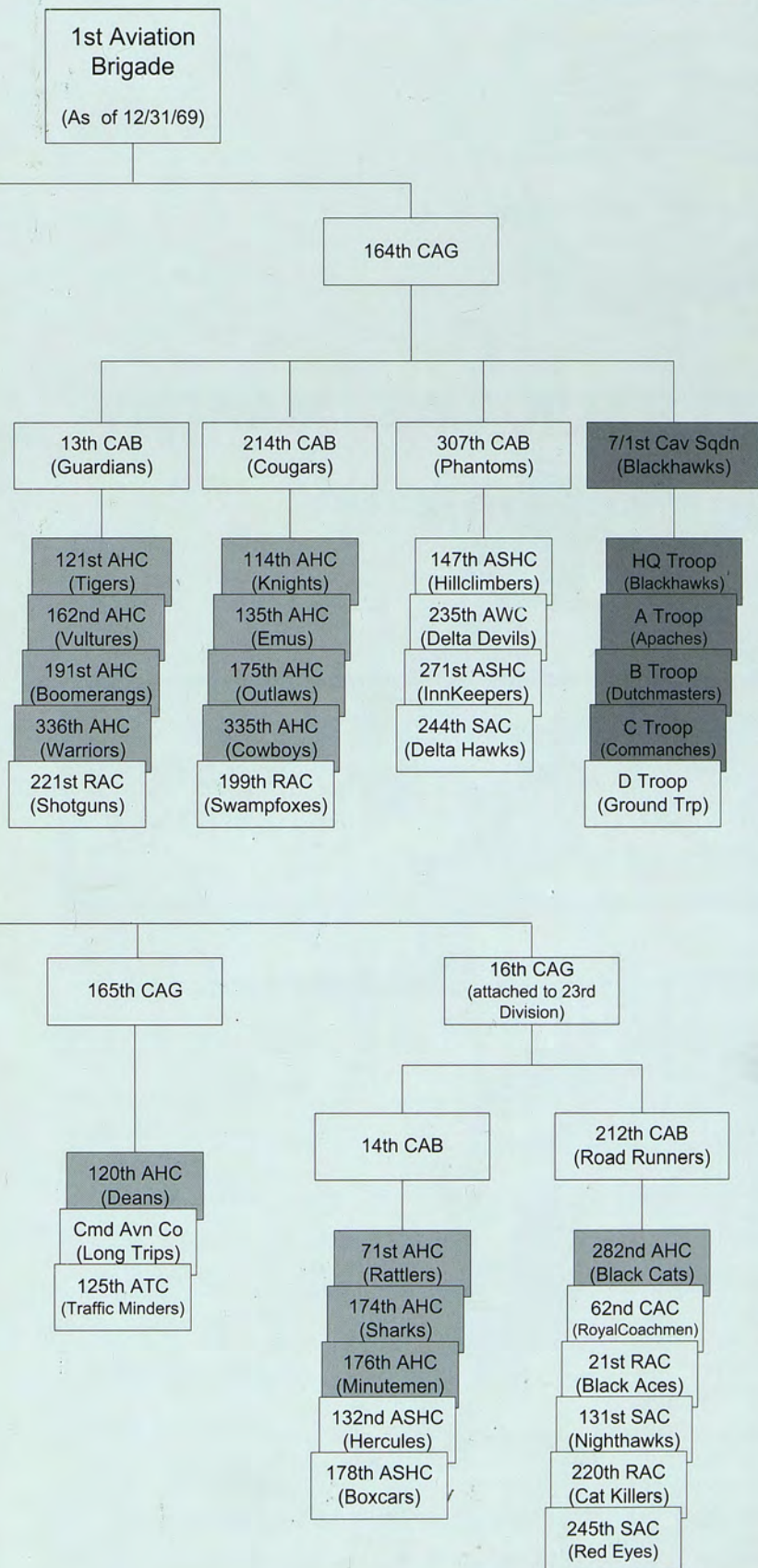

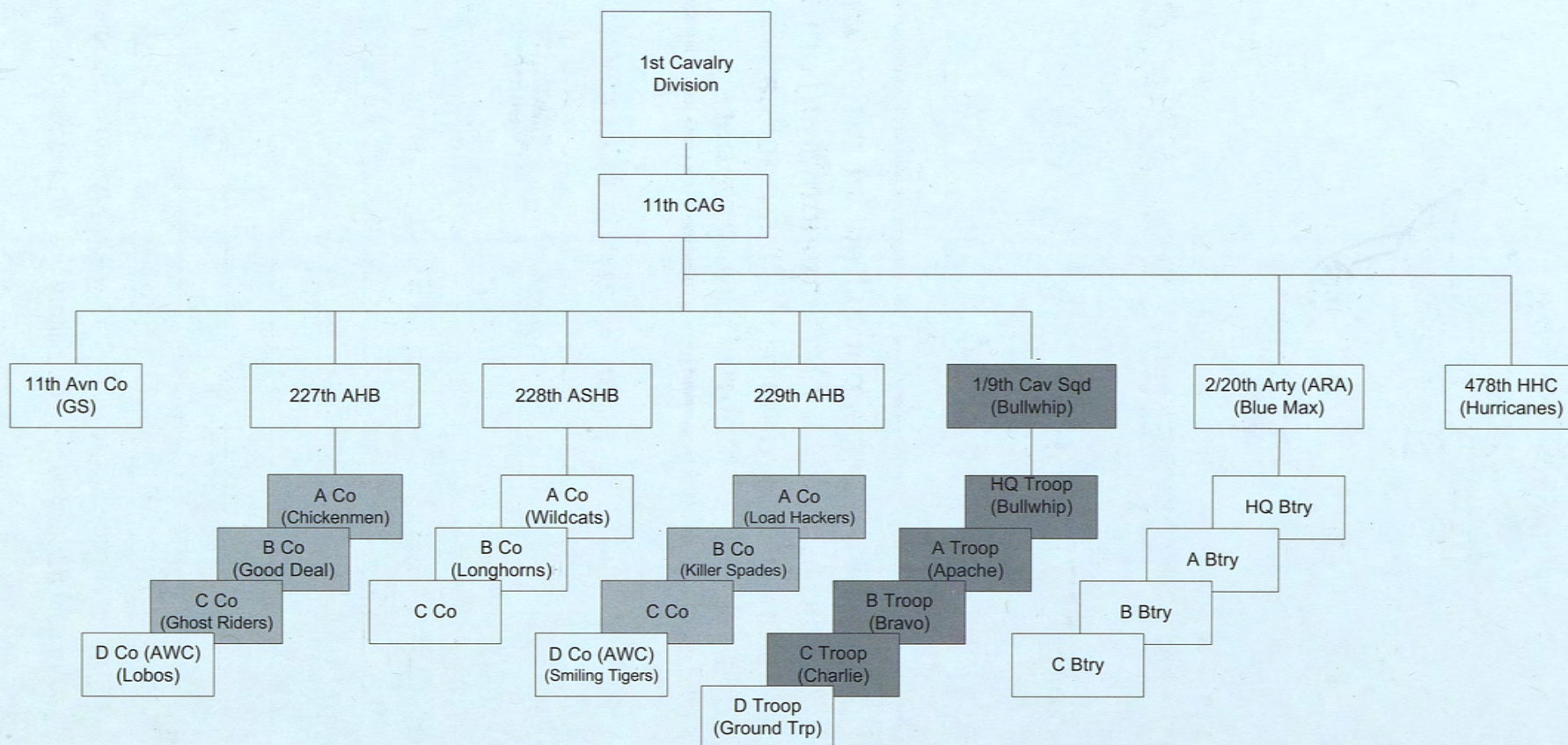

LETTER FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Dear VHPA Member,

Your 2004 Membership Directory, the 21st edition, is another VHPA volunteer-produced item that should continue to add value to your membership in our great organization. Along with the six VHPA Newsletters and our major Reunion in July, this Directory completes the line-up of benefits that you receive as a member of VHPA.

"Finding our missing comrades" continues to be one of the Executive council's priority goals. We commissioned a special Task Force, lead by the Membership Committee, that included the Records/Database and Directory Committees plus our HQ staff to find ways to add the names, address, flight class number, etc., of individuals known to have attended U.S. Army helicopter flight training during the Vietnam Era to the VHPA's Membership database. Last year we added all known men who flew helicopters in Vietnam. This information was obtained from the Pentagon based on helicopter pilot MOS information from all services. This year we have added addresses for 13,000 of these men. As a result, your directory now contains over 36,000 good addresses. We believe that approximately 40,000 helicopter pilots served in the Vietnam War so we are getting really close to finding addresses for all those eligible to be VHPA members. So that flight class lists can be as complete as possible, we have included those who did not go to Vietnam because they were either foreign nationals trained by the Army or National Guard officers who were not called to serve or those just lucky enough to get other assignments. Unfortunately, this effort also determined that about 9% of our comrades have died since their tour in Vietnam. As a result, the Died After Tour section in this directory has also dramatically increased.

The indexes are now more complete; especially the flight class indexes. If there is missing information in the indexes, it means that we do not have that information. It is now up to you to help with this effort. Please provide HQ, or the Database Committee, updates and changes so that next year's reunion and directory can be even more complete.

As you can see with only about 7,500 active members, we have the potential to double or triple in size. If every member recruited just one person each this year, we could double in size. If each person recruited two people this year, we could triple in size. Now is the time to contact a past class mate or hooch mate and get him to join. The majority of new members state that they joined because a friend told them about the VHPA. It is not enough for HQ to send out an invitation. It requires a personal contact from a friend. Please make that contact.

We would like to offer special thanks this year to volunteers Stan Gause and Bert Adams for helping Gary Roush on the directory committee. Stan did most of the work on the Order of Battle section including the cover and Bert helped to find SSNs so we could get addresses for potential members.

Please let us know the "good" and the "not good" so that we can continue to provide you with the best possible benefits of membership.

VHPA Memorial Scholarship Fund Offers a Positive Legacy



When the Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association began, back in 1983, there was never an intent to establish a scholarship program for children and grand children of members. However, over the years donations began to mount as individuals and units began to “challenge” each other to match their giving. Finally, in 1999 the amount of accumulated funds was nearing \$10,000 and the Executive Council decided something needed to be done. Several different ideas were evaluated to determine how the funds could be managed and invested so that someday a sufficient principle would exist to yield an annual scholarship. In addition, procedures necessary to solicit and select a scholarship recipient were discussed. Ultimately, it was determined that (1) not enough money to yield a significant scholarship was available and (2) the process of application and selection needed to be done in such a way that would be in keeping with very high standards and procedures.

Not wanting to “re-invent the wheel”, the VHPA Executive Council sought and evaluated several organizations and companies that might do the job. Much was learned about foundations and companies capable of both investing and administering the VHPA Memorial Scholarship Program. Finally, a clear choice emerged and it was obvious that the Army Aviation Association of America was the very best choice. The AAAA is an organization with very close ties to many members of the VHPA. The AAAA is made up of U.S. Army pilots. An added bonus for the VHPA was that through the AAAA Heritage Program, they would match the \$10,000 of the VHPA with an equal amount. Approximately \$5,000 was added in 2002. With the combined principle, an immediate \$1,000 VHPA Memorial Scholarship became available for the 2001 cycle of scholarships. Another added bonus was that VHPA applicants would also be eligible for many of the AAAA scholarships. The partnership was a win-win situation for the VHPA and AAAA.



The AAAA Foundation has awarded individual scholarship grants each year, ranging from \$1,000 to \$15,000 given out as one, two or four year scholarships. Interest-free loans of up to \$4,000 (\$1,000 a year) are also available. Any VHPA applicant or their father must be a member of AAAA, at time of application. The postmark will govern. The applicant will be requested to provide additional supporting data. All scholarships are awarded on merit.

2004 Award In early August, Bill Harris, Executive Directory of AAAA, sent a letter to the VHPA with the official announcements of all AAAA scholarship winners. For the 2004 competition, the AAAA received a total of 178 applicants and made 121 awards totaling \$200,500. This year’s recipient of the VHPA Heritage Scholarship of \$1,000 for one year, is Joshua Charles Walker, son of Joseph (Wozolek) and Jolene Walker. They live in Middletown, OH. Joe “Woz” Walker is a member of the VHPA and was in Flight Class ORWAC 68-24. He served in A/4th Avn, 4th Div. in 69-70. Joshua plans on attending Ohio State University and becoming a secondary history teacher.

Five years ago the VHPA selected The Vietnam Archive at Texas Tech University as its official repository for all historical information. The Vietnam Archive has been collecting, preserving, and making available records of the Wars in Southeast Asia since 1989. The Vietnam Archive welcomes all materials and perspectives concerning the Wars in Southeast Asia and considers no collection or donation to be too small. They believe all of the sacrifices made during the Wars are significant and the individual collections and recollections of the men and women who participated in those events are equally important. All

materials in the Archive are preserved in keeping with modern archival practices and procedures to ensure they remain available for future generations. Currently, the Archive has over 7 million pages of documentation in its manuscript and microform collections, over 2,000 maps, and more than 50,000 photos and slides related to wartime experiences in Southeast Asia.

These 42,562 pilots include 1,694 Life, 10,243 General, and 30,087 Potential VHPA members - also 235 foreign pilots, and 303 American pilots who did not go to Vietnam. The data for the 563 members who died after joining the VHPA is listed in the Deceased roster. Each Life Member is identified with a large ***** following his name. All VHPA members who are "active" (either Life Members or General Members current with their VHPA membership dues) appear with their names in **bold print**. All VHPA General Members whose annual membership dues are not current and all pilots who have not yet joined the VHPA (Potential Members) appear with their names in normal print. All Potential Members have a large # following the name. Underlined names indicate that the information is new or changed since the last directory. E-mail addresses are not included this year.

The VHPA needs everyone's assistance to make this roster accurate. There are 6,525 pilots whose addresses are missing or marked with a question mark (VHPA's mail is being returned). This directory provides you with nearly 13,000 new addresses for potential members. It is now your turn. Please send additions or corrections to VHPA Headquarters or the database committee.
