I searched in our archive and found some possible candidates for your project. We have a lot of "home video" footage of helicopters in flight and from the cockpit of helicopters. We also have three audio files of cockpit transmissions from helicopter flights. All of the transmissions and videos I send you, you will be able to preview online in our Virtual Archive. If you are interested in using anything in your project, let me know. We can supply you with high quality digital versions of these materials.

Here is how to find the audio transmissions.

Visit <http://www.vietnam.ttu.edu/virtualarchive/>

Select "Search the Virtual Archive" (top center text or bottom button left menu)
Click on the Advanced Search link (red text)
Enter cockpit transmission as Keywords in the Keyword Field
Click on the little box next to Audio in the right hand gray menu (a green check mark will appear)
Click on Start Search (top button left menu)
It should return 3 items.
Click on Display Search Results (second button left menu)

The next screen has links to the materials online. You can click on the little gramophone icon and the audio files will play on your computer.

I found several home videos for you to preview. When you are finished with the audio files you can click on Return to Search in the left hand red menu. Then click on Clear Search Form (again red menu). Below you will see a list of item numbers. You can type these item numbers into the keyword box and then click on Start Search (red menu). The database will take you right to the film. You can click on the film strip icon and the film will play on your computer. Just search for each item number separately to see all of the films.

If these films do not work for you project, I would suggest you contact Traditions Military Videos. They produced/own copyright in most of the professional videos we had of helicopter flight/training in our collection. I get the impressions that Traditions works with the military to produce their official films.
