NOTES

1. Frank Metsker came up with an excellent suggestion concerning the room reservations at the Hyatt, which was to make arrangements to have all the Phoenix rooms together. Since the Hyatt will receive hundreds of reservation forms, and will assign rooms at random as people check in, the only way to reserve a block of rooms would be to send the reservation forms en mass. If you fill in the VHPA provided reservation form and send them to me, I will forward them to the Hyatt and request a block of the appropriate number of rooms be reserved together. Even though the reunion officially begins on Thursday, June 29, you may want to consider a Wednesday afternoon or evening arrival, if so, remember to so note on your reservation form. I will send all forms that I have by May 10. For you guys that are more proficient with a FAX than you are with a mail box, you can FAX me your form at 804-431-8754.

2. For those of you that do not belong to VHPA and do not receive the newsletters, and therefore the registration and reservation forms, I am enclosing copies of both. Our Phoenix reunion is a part of, and a by-product of, the VHPA reunion. VHPA membership is \$20 per year. There is a VHPA reunion fee of \$15 and fees for activities that you may or may not choose to take part in (ie.. luncheon, dance, banquet, etc.)

3. As I mentioned, I'd like to send out one more short bulletin just prior to the reunion listing any last minute information that might be helpful, including additions to the guest list, whether or not we were able to secure a block of rooms and if a hospitality suite has been reserved. At this time, suites are available with varying numbers of connecting bedrooms. Due to the volume of people that will be in attendance, and the size of our group, it would be nice to have a suite to serve as the Phoenix Nest and be large enough to accommodate our group and their wives.

Even though VHPA has negotiated much reduced room rates, the suite rates, as they now stand, are beyond our means. However, I've asked Larry Pluhar, who lives in Chicago, is on the VHPA reunion committee, and is a Ft. Riley charter member of the Phoenix, to check on some sort of discounted suite rate. There are only about 8 suites in the hotel, so we may have to move quickly if it is feasible.

If any of you own or work for a corporation that could be persuaded, coerced or cajoled into assisting in the sponsorship of a hospitality suite, that would be great. If so, please let me know, as it certainly will affect our planning. Since this is a one shot deal, it would be nice to do it up right.

4. Since everyone is identified by a SSAN, the task of locating people would be a piece of cake if, (A) we had full names and SSAN and (B) we had access to a computer data base with the capability to accept that information and produce an address. The only two data bases that I know like that belong to the IRS and the Social Security Admin. Anybody have access?

Due to the fact that not everyone who is interested can attend an annual reunion, I have received several letters suggesting an effort every 3 to 5 years to organize a Phoenix reunion in conjunction with the VHPA. This 3 to 5 year schedule would attempt to maximize the Phoenix in attendance. While VHPA would continue with the annual reunions, a concentrated effort to gather the Phoenix would be on a somewhat less frequent schedule.

Frankly, this project was undertaken with a short range goal in mind. I haven't really given any thought beyond 6/29/89. I guess if anything, I thought that since this was the first attempt to organize any type of reunion on a large scale in 20 years, that once the names and addresses were collected and disseminated, any future attempt at a reunion would be an informal matter of a few post cards or phone calls. So for you guys out there who may be sitting on the fence between going to Chicago and holding off for some other year, all I can say is that this may be the first of many Phoenix reunions, or it may be the first and only. Nobody knows.
