I will get to you my ideas for a Lam Son 719 History Symposium for VHPA next year.

I am thinking of having a multi media production with four panels of four speakers and a moderator, each limited to 25 minutes, with a script and a moderator. I will have an audio visual producer there to keep us on script and timeline.

I plan to commence sales on The Price Of Exit Anthology at VHPA.

The Lam Son dvd will be done early next year.

Random House bought the photo in 1997. I'd be happy to give permission to use it, but I simply don't own the copyright.

Attached is a picture from Ken Mayberry. It is one of two shots he took as a W.O.-1 over Laos of WO Dave Wolfe in October, 1970.

The other picture Mayberry sold to Random House, before THE PRICE OF EXIT was published in 1997, when they purchased the copyright.

Ken lives at 1832 N. Delaware Avenue, York NE 68467. He told me yesterday he was happy to allow this photo's use, with credit to him.

His phone is [REDACTED] He will sign permission if it is sent to him.

Since this wasn't purchased by Random House, this may be the simplest option.

I expect you can get permission from Random House, Permissions desk, to use the photo, but that may take some time.

Coincidentally, I did get permission from Sports Illustrated / Time Inc. to use their Sept.23, 2003 cover with Lt. Bob Kalsu on it. Mrs. Kalsu also

provided me permission.
