Hi Jim,

My only concern is about my session not being filmed, because of copyrighted material I would like to show from ABC, CBS and NBC. They are evening news clips during Lam Son. I don't want either me or VHPA being sued.

We could have the movie, MIA: A Soldiers Homecoming, showing in the Lam Son party room. In it, two Black Widows, former Lt. Jon Evans and CW2 John Madden, describe the loss of Major Jack Barker and Captain John Dugan on March 20, 1971, the Kingsmen C.O.. That may go down as the worst day in Army Aviation History, although Doug Womack may believe LZ Lolo was. On March 20, virtually everyone flying, either took serious hits or were shot down. The film MIA: A Soldiers Homecoming deals about 50% of the time with JPAC, describing the efforts to document the remains. It would tie in well with the luncheon speaker. The film is available on line from Guerilla Docs on the web, for \$10.00. Denis McKallion produced it in Hollywood. He was the one that encouraged me to do the Anthology film.

Please keep me advised on the time frames for publishing and submissions to VHPA, regarding this.

Tom,

Thanks for getting back to me. Your reply here tells me all I need to know. We will put you down then as a featured speaker. This coming reunion, our luncheon speaker will be a JPAC rep – they are the remains recovery folks out of Hawaii. Frank Anton will be another speaker talking about his POW experiences, and then we have a doctor with the VA who is an expert on PTSD who will be speaking along with a VHPA spouse whose member husband committed suicide last year suffering from PTSD. Covering this topic is probably long overdue for some members. We will have another session on the memory map again with Lam Son as the focus. Of course, we will have a session of war stories as well. I thought about doing my Lam Son presentation, but that will remain as a backup, although I'd be happy to be on the panel or to participate with your presentation somehow. Finally, I think I will schedule a room for a Lam Son 719 mini-reunion, but that will be it theme-wise.

So, this year will be different – each HPF will be separate – no stringing of one internal event after another – will have about 30 minutes in between. Also for the first time, we will have at least one full day of ONLY internal events – no outside tours. The EC and reunion committee finally agree that a day with no tours is necessary and smart so we get more participation. So, you will be the only person speaking in your session and there will not be an event immediately before or after yours. Cost for HPF/WSC events will be \$25 this year to cover DVDs and AV costs.

So, there you have it, I believe. Call me if you have other questions. I look forward to seeing you again and for the presentation. Finally, I will have this together early so we can include the actual event rather than just saying an HPF session. That will help in attendance, I am sure.

I hope you and your family have a wonderful Thanksgiving!


