PATHFINDERS IN CONTACT--361st 28 KBA's

A five man Pathfinder team of the 52nd Battalion Pathfinder Detachment came in contact with a large enemy force 13 kilometers north of Dak Pek (50 miles NW of Pleiku). The Pathfinder team was participating in search operations northwest of the Central Highlands Provincial Capital of Pleiku. According to CPT Vernon Klinger, Long Beach, California, several aircraft have been reported missing in the area and CPT Klinger's Pathfinder Detachment from the 52nd Aviation Battalion Combat at Pleiku joined in the search. Klinger explained, "One of the search aircraft spotted what looked like the wreckage of one of the missing planes, so we were called upon to go in and see what we could find in the area."

PFC Mark Westhoven, Napolean, Ohio, one of the Pathfinders said, "There was no LZ big enough for our slick to land in so our five man team jumped from the aircraft as it hovered about 20 feet above some scrub type trees."
