Thank you for printing the obituary of my husband William E. Tyler, Sr. in your December 1992 newsletter. I'm sorry it's taken me so long to express my appreciation, but it has been a very difficult year for me with numerous things to attend to.

I have recently put together a scrapbook of my husband's aviation career and came across some items that might be of interest to your organization historically. In 1967, the year Bill served in Vietnam with "E" Battery 82nd Artillery, 1st Air Cavalry Division, I cut out every article from our local newspaper in Norfolk Virginia that specifically mentioned the 1st Air Cav.
