1. Significant organization and unit activities.

a. Principle operations: The platoon continued to support the division with three Combat Tracker Teams located at Phuoc Vinh, Quen Lei and Tay Ninh. Heaviest utilization of the teams is at present to provide intelligence information on ground probes and attacks at fire support bases.

e. Training and organization: Due to the turnover of dog handlers this month, training scout, sentry and bloodhound handlers has been the principle training task of this Unit. Because of a shortage of qualified dog handlers instructors and a general lack of excess personnel to conduct training this particular phase of unit training has been hampered this month. The number of operational dog teams projected for 1 September is 1 team, with a second becoming operational by 7 September, and a third by 1 October.

3. Commander's comments:

The major problem encountered this month, as in the past, was the elapsed time from an actual contact, to when the mission was actually laid on. Many units do not realize that time is the biggest obstacle that Combat Tracker Teams encounter. Too many tracks were 7-10 hours old and the enemy exfiltrated before the team was even inserted. Additionally, in most cases, even with tracks two hours old, units are reluctant or unwilling to deviate from preplanned lines of march to pursue the enemy. Hence, the Combat Tracker Teams have only rarely been utilized to their true potential. The majority of the missions this month have involved "intelligence gathering" which is not the primary mission of the Trackers.

4. Recommendations:

It will be necessary to brief all Bn S-3's, and Brigade operations sections again on the utilization and employment of Combat Tracker Teams.
