

Helicopter Training Squadron EIGHT, located at Naval Air Station Whiting Field, Milton, Florida, provides primary and advanced helicopter training for Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and allied student aviators. HT-8 is staffed by 82 officers (58 Navy, 21 Marines, and 3 Coast Guard officers), 44 Navy enlisted and 3 civilians. This command provides flight training for approximately 300 students annually. The squadron flies the TH-57 Bell Sea Ranger Helicopter in the B and C models for its training. Custody of these aircraft is maintained by Commander, Training Air Wing FIVE. All maintenance and simulator support is provided by civilian contractor. Burnside-Ott was responsible for TH-57 maintenance until October when it changed to United Nuclear Corporation Support Services. Loral Corporation provides simulator support.

In 1990, HT-8 was forced to operate much more efficiently and effectively than ever before in its history because of budget cuts, decreased PTR, reduced total flight time (46,441 in 1989 and 39,600 in 1990) and an unavoidable lack of aircraft availability (due to cracks found in crosstubes of the majority of aircraft.) As a result, student time to train decreased from 24.1 weeks to 23.1 weeks and the number of hours per sortie (hps) decreased from 2.06 (hps) to 1.95 (hps).

HT-8 utilizes Pilot Training Rate (PTR) as a measure of success with regard to accomplishing its primary mission. The FY 90 PTR was completed ahead of schedule, resulting in the winging of 178 Navy, 96 Marine Corps, 11 Coast Guard and 12 Allied Students. The student training completions and record of total flight hours per month for the calendar year are provided below:

Helicopter Training Squadron EIGHT, located at Naval Air Station Whiting Field, Milton, Florida provides primary and advanced helicopter training for Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and Allied student aviators. HT-8 is staffed by 84 officers (55 Navy, 27 Marine and 2 Coast Guard officers), 46 Navy enlisted and 3 civilians. This command provides flight training for over 550 students annually. The squadron uses the TH-57 Bell Sea Ranger Helicopter in the B and C models in its training. Custody of these aircraft is maintained by Commander, Training Air Wing FIVE. All maintenance support is provided by civilian contractor, Burnside-Ott. Simulator support is provided by Ford Aerospace Corporation.

1989 was one of the squadron's most successful years of operation since its formation in 1950. A total of 46,441 Flight hours were accrued while completing a record 22,522 training sorties.

COM HT-8 utilizes Pilot Training Requirement (PTR) as a measure of success with regard to accomplishing its primary mission. The FY89 PTR was completed three weeks ahead of schedule, resulting in the winging of a record 220 Navy, 90 Marine Corps, 13 Coast Guard and 11 allied Students. In recognition of HT-8's outstanding performance, the squadron was awarded the 1989 CNATRA Training Efficiency Award for rotary wing training. The student training completions and record of total flight hours per month for the calendar year are provided Below:

HT-8 is staffed by 69 officers (45 Navy, 20 Marine and 4 Coast Guard officers), 49 Navy enlisted and 2 civilians. This command provides flight training for over 550 students annually. The squadron uses the TH-57 Bell Sea Ranger Helicopter in the B and C models in its training. Custody of these aircraft is maintained by Commander, Training Air Wing FIVE. All maintenance and simulator support is provided by civilian contractor, Burnside-Ott.

1988 was the squadron's most successful year of operation since its formation in 1950. A total of 45,410 flight hours were accrued while completing a record 26,076 training sorties.

HT-8 utilizes Pilot Training Rate (PTR) as a measure of success with regard to accomplishing its primary mission.
