SUMMARY

This tape has been designed to acquaint you with the local training area. In the tape we have discussed the three primary training areas to include the heliports that are located in them. The Main Heliport (Wolters) in Primary I North, Downing Heliport in Primary I South, and Dempsey Heliport in Primary II. You have seen the most prominent landmarks and terrain features. The landmarks include the Baker Hotel, Mineral Wells, Weatherford, Jacksboro, Graford, Graham, and Breckenridge. The terrain features are; Mineral Wells Lake, Palo Pinto Lake, Possum Kingdom Lake, and the Brazos River. You have also seen some of the restricted (no fly) areas; the City of Garner, the fish hatchery at Possum Kingdom Lake, and Seybolds Guest Ranch.
