SUBJECT: Combat After Action Interview Report.

1. NAME AND TYPE OF ORGANIZATION: 11th ARMORED CAVALRY REGIMENT.
2. DATE OF OPERATION: 29 OCT 1970.
3. LOCATION: Outside K Troop NDP at XT901317.
4. CONTROL HEADQUARTERS: 25th INFANTRY DIVISION.
5. PERSON BEING INTERVIEWED: CPT BOBBIE R. EUBANKS, OPERATIONS OFFICER, 3/11th ACR.
6. INTERVIEWER: SGT RICHARD J. HOUSE, HISTORIAN, 28th MHD, 11th ACR.
7. TASK ORGANIZATION: K TROOP, 3/11th ACR, while supporting RF and PF forces.
8. CONCEPT OF THE OPERATION AND EXECUTION: One platoon of K Troop SP'd to set up a strong point and act as a Ready Reaction Force for the RF and PF forces who were on a recon mission in the densely wooded area. At 0130 Hours on 29 OCT 1970, an estimated company - size enemy force more or less stumbled across K Troop's position because it was a surprise to both forces when contact began. K Troop received RPG and 75mm recoilless rifle fire. K Troop opened up with everything it had. The NVA had an excellent position near a fortified ditch. They withdrew to the north-east after 2 were killed. One US was killed instantly by an RPG round while sitting in the driver's compartment.
