2. The Detachment received a street sign from De Kalb County, Decatur, Georgia for the Detachment Street. The street is now known as Malone Loop in honor of the first man of the unit to be killed in action in November 1966. SP4 Wallace J. Malone was from Oxford, Nebraska.

4. The 541st MID lost its second member in action on 6 March 1968. Captain Gregory K. Whitehouse, Counterintelligence Section Chief, while accompanying an operation, was killed when the ACAV on which he was riding detonated a mine. The Detachment Dayroom has been refinished, to include a plaque to Captain Whitehouse's memory to honor his service to the unit and his country. The Detachment has set aside the 6th of March as the day designated to honor the unit's members who have given their lives in the service of their country.
