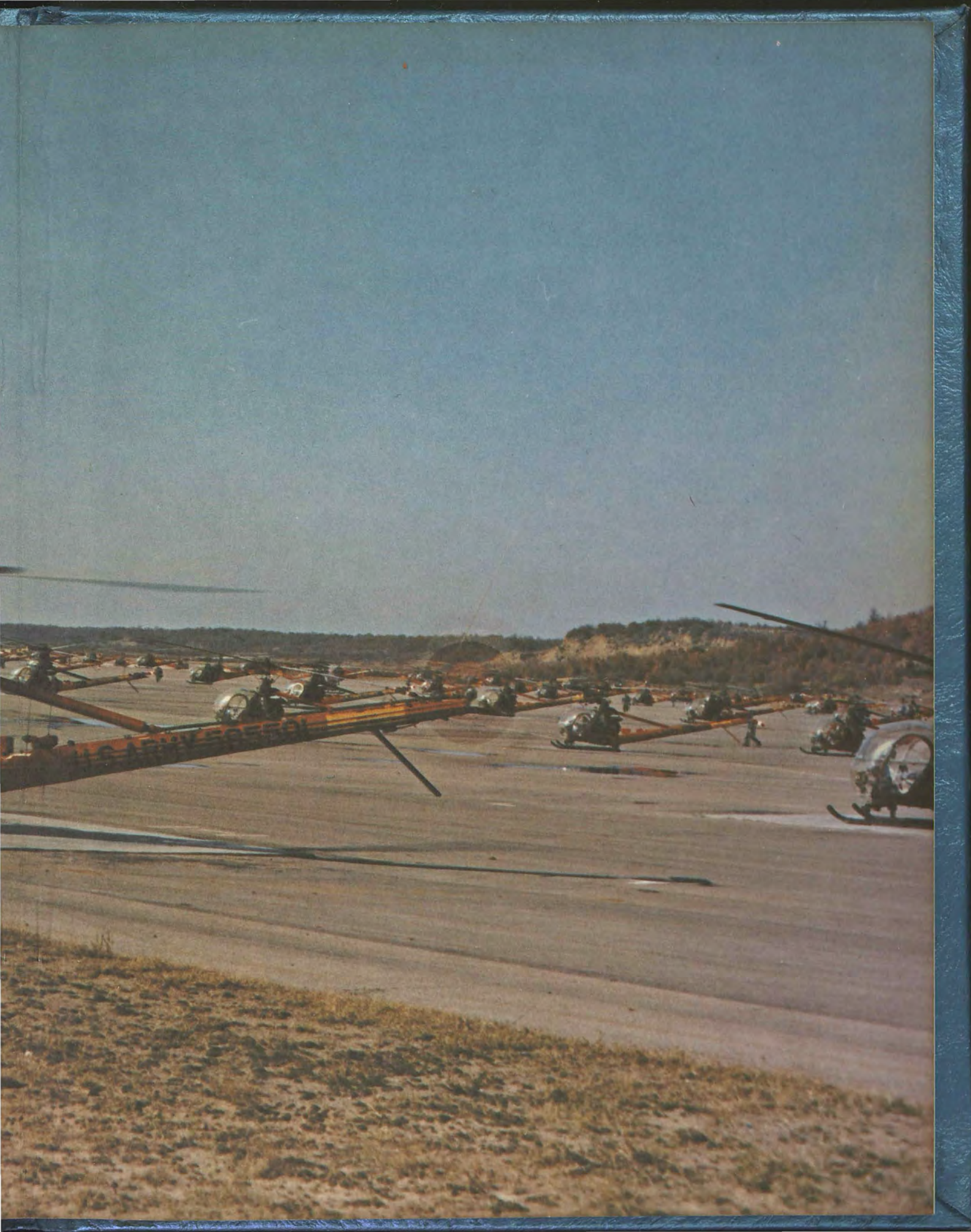




CLASS 67-15

Colonel Fleming entered the service as a second lieutenant in 1939 and was a battery commander of Field Artillery at Lingayen Gulf when the Japanese hit Luzon. He survived the Bataan Death March and spent over three years in Japanese POW camps.

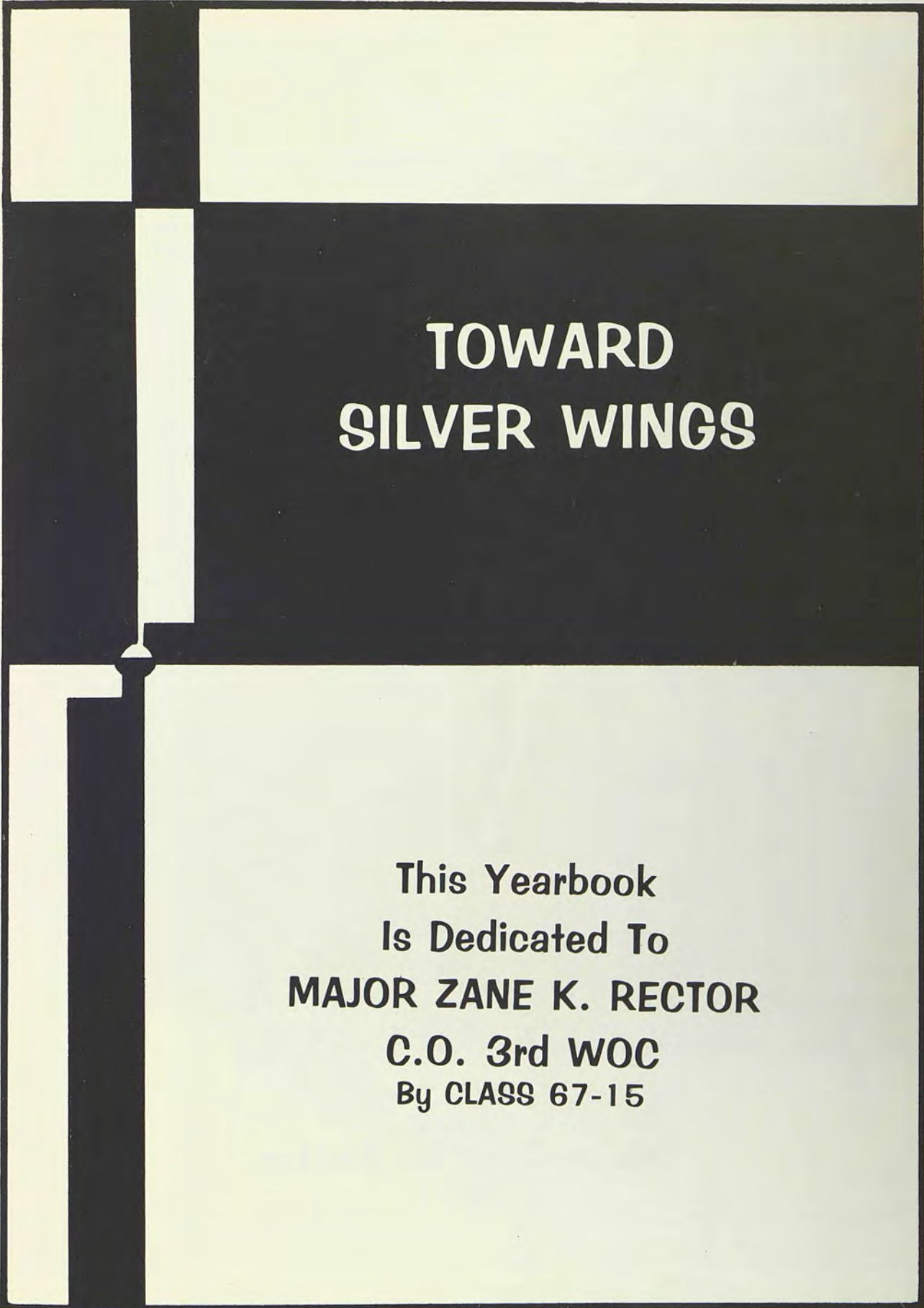
His assignments include operations officer of South Carolina Military District, C.O. 41st Field Artillery Bn, aviation officer of European Communications Zone, France, C.O. 66th Armored Field Artillery Bn, aviation training officer of the Office of the Director of Army Aviation, Military Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of the Army, and he became Commanding Officer of the USAPHC at Fort Wolters in 1965.

A master Army Aviator, he wears the Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Presidential Unit Citation with two clusters, Philippine Presidential Unit Citation, Army Commendation Medal, and the Joint Service Commendation Medal.

Colonel Holladay entered the service in 1942, and has served in Australia, Korea, New Guinea, and Germany. He was CDC Combat Development at Fort Knox. Among his decorations are the Bronze Star with V, Army Commendation Medal, and the Combat Infantrymen's Badge with Star.



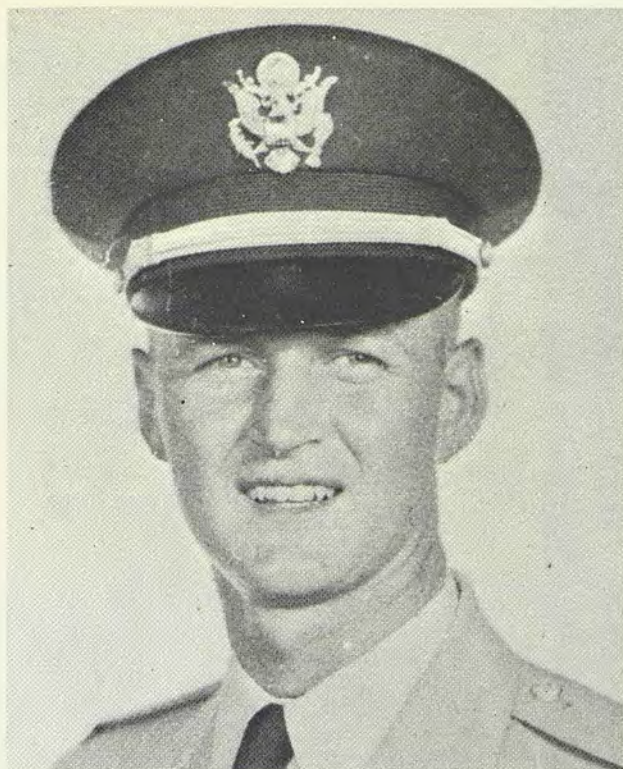
