Operations for 9 Feb. 1969. B/Co-2/4 received 15 to 20 rds. of 60mm mortar they are north of perimeter and 40 to 50 AK rds. negative casualties. D/Co 2/12 1-7 ambush made contact they received small arms fire and 1 B-40 rocket rds. traveled toward the NW. 1-7 ambush engaged with small arms and artillery. Results is 7 US WIA, and 1 US KIA. A/Co 2/12 at 387722 received 15 mortar rds. 82mm they landed S of FOB. neg casualties. A/Co at 453665 found 4 cases of 82mm rds. 3 cases full (6 rds. in each case) 1 case opened with 4 rds. total of 22 rds. Also found 3 cases of fuzes and charges (18). D/Co 2/12 found 3 NVA KIA's, 1 AK-47, 3 B-40 rockets launchers. A/Co at 173684 found 850 lbs. of rice, 1 US lynxetic compass, 1 weapon (unknown type or make) bolt action, and document. D/Co 2/8 at XT 318734 found 100-200 lb. bags of rice. A/Co 2/8 at XT 316753 found 2 NVA KIA about 3 days old. also engaged 10 ind. with 1 NVA killed.
