In one of Felix's many letters to me since we re-met this year he said that he never got recognition or a medal for his actions in saving my (and Crew Chief) life. Let me tell you why.

His CO was going to put him in for a medal but then the CO was sleeping with a female companion...and he was married back stateside. Felix was, and is, religious and wouldn't cooperate with his CO in keeping things a secret. Because of that Felix never got his recognition...I believe the CO got his.

Things are moving a little fast right now and I need some help. Am I doing the Right thing in asking for the Medal of Honor for Ray (Felix) Knight? I believe I am. I want to hear your side. Please be honest and up front. Remember I don't know or remember what happened when I went down that day. I don't even know if our Crew Chief is alive today but when I find him I know my efforts will be doubled.

If you feel, as I do, please join in helping me to advance this cause. I have never done anything like this and don't know how to begin.

Attached is a letter sent email today to a columnist for our Minneapolis Star Tribune newspaper. It will get a response. Mr Grow will get his story. If you can add to this story please send to me now.

I am keeping this secret from Felix and request you do so also.

This past weekend I was at the first reunion of our old Vietnam unit in Shelbyville, MO. While I am close, I have not found our Crew Chief yet

but
it will happen soon. The story I have is about Felix.

He never got recognition for his heroic act. I feel his actions
warrant
nothing less than the Medal of Honor. I and our Crew Chief are alive
today ONLY because of his actions. When our ship discovered activity
leading up the western slopes of a hill in the A-Shau valley in 1969
it
led to not only one of the biggest battles of Vietnam but also one of
America's greatest debates here at home.

My story is that of the quest for a Medal of Honor, and is currently
held up because our helicopter #67-16281 was shot down just inside
Loas. Today information on it is Classified. We are working to have
it
released. From it we will obtain the Crew Chiefs name and all
pertinant
data.

The story I can give you comes from letters from others and they are
begining come in from all over.
