Dear Mr. Johnston:

Thank you for your request for information regarding U.S. and foreign civilian employees of Civil Air Transport (CAT) involved in missions with the U.S. Army in Southeast Asia as part of the PL 95-202 Group Application.

Although the Center of Military History (CMH) is not a document archives, our historians do have holdings pertaining to their specific research, including a body of documentation on the war in Vietnam and, to a lesser extent, in Laos. Our review indicates nothing relevant to the criteria specified in the regulation. CMH files contain no evidence that the U.S. Army had contracts or hired CAT in any capacity. As a civilian airline CAT probably did ferry American personnel in South Vietnam and Laos, but our records do not contain details on this.
