1. (C) OPERATION SUMMARY:

a. General

(1) 9th Inf Div: The OLD RELIABLES continued Operation PEOPLE'S ROAD (DUONG CUA DAN), TRUONG CONG DINH, HOPTAC I and TOAN THANG.

(a) 9th Inf Div: Continued Operation TOAN THANG with 3rd Bde, RTAVR and TF Forsyth.

1 TF Forsyth: Continued Operation TOAN THANG DENVER/AKRON with two maneuver battalions.

a The 2-47 Inf (M) continued Binh Son and Bearcat security. Co A remained in RON position vic YS 116979 throughout the night without contact. Co A remained at Bearcat today and was the bn RRF. Co A RON position for tonight vic YS 129934 has had no contact. Co B remained in RON position vic YT 202008 throughout the night without contact. Co B continued the Binh Son security mission. The 3d Platoon remained on Gia Ray mountain vic YT 605010. Co B RON position for tonight vic YS 208934 has had no contact. Co C remained in RON position vic YT 130037 throughout the night without contact. Co C remained at Bearcat and provided RRF. Co C RON position for tonight vic YS 198840 has had no contact. The Scout Platoon conducted mounted patrols along Hwy 15 between Long Thanh and YT 083037 without contact.

b The 6-31 Inf: Co A was the bn RRF and conducted 4 daylight patrols without contact. Co B remained in RON position vic YS 257975 without contact. Co B completed airmobile extraction back to Bearcat at 1625H. Co C conducted night patrols in the Bearcat area without contact. Co D remained in RON position

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DOWNGRADED AT THREE YEAR INTERVALS  
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vic YS 238968 without contact. Co D completed airmobile extraction back to Bearoat at 1258H. Co E conducted four night patrols without contact.

c Other Activity: At 1425H vic YT 166021 sector D personnel on the Bearoat berm found 3 chicom grenades in front of bunker 92.

d TF TOWER: At 1800H TF Tower assumed OPCON of 2-47 Inf (M) and 6-31 Inf.

e Pd cas US none; VC 3 grenades optr.

f RTAVR: Continued Operation TOAN THANG/NHON TRACH.

g The Regt conducted security mission for Engr work parties, FSPB YAK, Binh Son, Long Thanh and roadrunner operations. The 1st Co continued security of the FSPB at Phuoc Thein vic YS 125893. The 2d Co assumed the Binh Son security mission. The 3d Co remained at Bearoat and conducted refresher training and ambush patrolling. The 4th Co remained at Bearoat and conducted refresher training. The Recon Trp conducted roadrunner opns and provided RRF vic YS 134922. The RTAVR CP remained at Bearoat.

h Pd cas RTAVR none; VC none.


i 3d Bde: Continued Operation TOAN THANG CMD/LONG AN with 4 maneuver battalions.

a The 3-39 Inf conducted local combat patrols and planned for future opns. At 0300H vic XS 742699 the bn's base camp at Rach Kien received 18 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. The bn reacted with counter mortar and arty fire. A LFT supported. The attack ceased at 0302H and resulted in 3 US WHA (not evac). At 0715H vic XS 740669 2d Platoon/Co C departed Rach Kien and conducted Recon in Force opns west to vic XS 725707 searching for enemy positions from last nights mortar attack. At 0745H vic XS 730702 2d Platoon sustained 1 WHA from a hand grenade booby trap (not evac). At 1053H vic XS 724704 2d Platoon destroyed 1 chicom grneade booby trap found in a can. 2d Platoon/Rach Kien at 1330H. At 0805H vic XS 751765 a bn roadrunner team destroyed 1 roadblock made of mud.

b The 5-60 Inf (-) conducted local combat patrols and provided security for 2 convoys between Tan An and Saigon. At 2115H vic XS 6155 the 5-60 Inf FSPB at Binh Phuoc received 10 rds of 82mm mortar fire. The bn reacted by having a LFT placed on station, by firing counter mortar and arty into suspected positions vic XS 618557. The first rounds resulted in 6 US WHA (not evac). Co

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departed the FSPB and conducted Recon in Force opns vic XS 618557. Co B received small arm fire in the vic of the suspected enemy position which was returned using mortars and organic weapons. This area was searched without results. At 2215H vic XS 586585 Co A called arty in on 2 sampans with unk results. At 1700H Co B departed Binh Phuoc by APC and moved to vic XS 600500 at 1810H establishing contact with the enemy at that time. Contact continues as of 2400H.

c The 2-3 Inf conducted Co size foot mobile Recon in Force operations. At 222000H vic XS 700814 Co B ambush patrol sank 1 sampan and killed 2 VC. At 2045H vic XS 810755 Co C ambush patrol observed 15-20 VC 400 meters from their position. The enemy was engaged using arty with unk results. At 0807H vic XS 789771 Co A departed FSPB SMOKE and conducted a Co size Recon in Force opn north to XS 800780, then west to vic XS 788782, southwest to XS 782773 and returned to FSPB SMOKE. At 1000H vic XS 802779 Co A destroyed 3 15 ft sampans. At 1305H vic XS 787780 Co A destroyed 11 bunkers. At 1440H Co A closed FSPB SMOKE. Co D conducted platoon size combat patrols north and south of PB DAGGER. At 0940H vic XS 796840 1st Platoon Co D departed PB DAGGER on foot and moved north to vic XS 797847 then east returning to FSPB SMOKE. At 1405H vic XS 746845 1st Platoon destroyed 7 bunkers.

d The 4-39 Inf conducted Co size foot mobile, and waterborne assaults and Recon in Force opns. At 1235H vic XS 848855 Co B departed Nha Be by vehicle to DP vic XS 862849. From the DP Co B conducted Recon in Force north to vic XS 852857 then south to vic XS 856835 and established night ambush positions. At 1230H vic XS 956895 Co C departed Cat Lai by air boat and conducted a waterborne assault and Recon in Force opns. At 1310H vic XS 943846 Co C landed and swept west to vic XS 926843 where the Co reboarded boats and closed Cat Lai at 1800H. At 1805H vic XS 848855 the Recon Platoon departed Nha Be by vehicle, dismounted vic XS 914804, and conducted Recon in Force operations west to vic XS 903809 where the platoon established a night position.

e Trp D/3-5 Cav (OPCON to 3rd Bde for todays opns), conducted aerial Recon and airmobile assaults and Recon in Force opns. Trp D ARP was inserted at the following locations west of Rach Kien; vic XS 640728, XS 658710, and XS 607705.

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At 1138H via XS 659709 the ARP engaged 1 VC resulting in 1 VC KIA. At 1145H via XS 658705 the ARP found 3 VC bodies wrapped in ponchoes. They had been killed by small arms. At 1255H via XS 656710 the ARP found 1 Ak-47 and 300 ft of commo wire. At 1625H via XS 604704 the ARP established contact with an estimated 3 VC squads. The platoon began receiving a heavy volume of small arms and automatic weapons fire. Fire was returned using organic weapons and a LFT was placed on station at 1634H. While flying at 1200 ft(70 knots) the LFT received 12.7 machine gun fire resulting in 1 US WHA. The ARP platoon thus far has sustained 1 KHA and 2 WHA (evac). Enemy losses thus far are 1 KIA dressed in a blue uniform with steel helmet and pack. At 1830H the enemy force was estimated to be a reinforced bn (probably NVA). At 1828H airstrikes were placed on the target. They received heavy ground fire and 1 fighter was hit. Extent of damage is not known. Gunships supporting the contact received fire from both sides of the Vam Co Dong River. Contact continues and is being reinforced with elements from the 5-60 Inf and 2-3 Inf as of 2400H.

(b) 1st Bde: Continued Operation PEOPLE'S ROAD (DUONG CUA DAN) with 2 maneuver battalions.

1 The 2-39 Inf continued operations in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. Co C continued the 36 hour ambush patrol in same RON position vio XS 313533, working in the area from vio XS 288512 - XS 317512 - XS 317540 - XS 285523. At 0921H vio XS 254333 Co B engaged 1 VC resulting in 1 VC KIA (BC). At 0941H vio XS 253555 Co B apprehended 5 detainees trying to run away to the east. At 1015H vio XS 253553 Co B apprehended 1 more detainee along with 10 lbs of documents. At 1215H Co C/5-60 Inf provided security for 15 Engr vio XS 320502 to fill a 6-7 foot hole in the road. At 1355H vio XS 312538 Co B apprehended 1 more detainee. At 1512H vio XS 281479 Co A apprehended 6 detainees. At 1545H vio XS 316489 Co B apprehended 1 detainee. At 1550H vio XS 316489 Co

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1 found a sachel with 3 ID cards and 18 lbs of documents. At 1600H via XS 293477 Co A apprehended 6 more detainees. At 1845H via XS 320502 Co C/5-60 Inf (M) APC was hit by a command detonated mine and SA fire. Contact was broken at 1900H. Results 1 US KHA (B/2-39) and 8 WHA (evac). Roadway 20% damaged with 8 foot crater in middle of road. APC went off the road and turned over. All 2-39 Inf elements closed into their CP's. During the night the bn conducted 8 squad size ambush patrols. (Of the 20 detainees captured 5 were reclassified PW's).

2 The 2-60 Inf continued operations in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. Road sweeps and local security patrols were conducted without incident or significant finds. Co B/2-60 Inf started a 36 hour Bushmaster opn via XS 325458. During the night the bn conducted 6 squad size, 1 platoon size and 1 company size ambush patrol.

3 Pd cas US 1 KHA, 8 WHA (evac); VC 1 KIA, 5 PW, 15 detainees, 28 lbs of docu, 3 ID cards cptr.

(o) 2d Bde: Continued Operation TRUONG CONG DINH with 2 maneuver battalions and in close coop and coord with 1 VNNMC bn.

1 The 3-47 Inf assumed Div RRF posture.

2 The 2d bn VNNMC also assumed a RRF posture.

3 The 4-47 Inf utilized 2 platoons of Co E, completed a Bushmaster opn by extracting from via XS 036391 at 0620H and closed the MRB at 0745H. Because of deep mud at the original insertion point 2 platoons of Co B inserted via XS 003373 at 0920H with no contact. Patrols were conducted without contact and all elements were extracted at 1218H. Methods used to deceive the enemy were: (1) Radio silence and (2) false insertions, (3) establishing positions then relocating under cover of darkness. At 1404H via XS 020360 Co B relieved Co E as MRB defense. MRB defensive night locations are: via XS 015359 and via XS 019351. Co E closed the MRB at 1415H.

4 The 3-34 Arty remained in DS of the MRF from FSPB CAMERON via XS 047338.

5 TF 117 provided transportation for the Bushmaster opn. TF 117 also conducted 6 waterborne patrols in defense of the MRB.

6 Pd cas US none; VC none.

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(d) TF Funston: Continued Operation HOPTAC I with one maneuver battalion.

1 The 3-60 Inf conducted security of the Dong Tam berm, road surveillance and operations in the AO. Co A continued security of the north and south sectors of the berm and established 2 ambushes in the northern AO vic XS 405475 and XS 404465. Co A assumed the mission of road surveillance on Hwy 25 and Hwy 22. Co B continued Dong Tam RRF and assumed the mission of security of the berm. Co B initiated patrolling in the northern AO. Co B apprehended a total of six detainees, 3 at 1530H vic XS 404478, 3 at 1400H vic XS 400475. Co C continued road surveillance on Hwy 25 and Hwy 22. At 0725H vic XS 435442 Co C hit a command detonated claymore, resulting in 1 US WHA (evac). At 1200H Co C departed Dong Tam for the western AO, accompanied by elements of the Recon Platoon/5-60 Inf. From 1300H to 1455H Co C, Co E, and Recon Platoon/5-60 Inf searched the area vic XS 359468. Co E continued operations in the western AO during the night of 21-22 April. At 212047H all Co E elements were in their final night positions at the following locations: XS 373445, XS 368453, XS 370452. From 1300H to 1455H Co E participated in the opn vic XS 359468. During the opn Co C apprehended 36 detainees, Co E apprehended 22 detainees. The Recon Platoon/5-60 Inf continued convoy security between Dong Tam, Tan An and My Thuan.

At 1055H Co A extracted responding to contact made by Trp D/3-5 Cav, reinserted on LZ vic XS 772795 at 1105H. From the LZ Co A moved northwest. At 1120H vio XS 772797 Co A established contact with a Co size VC force and began receiving automatic weapons fire from 4 different locations. At 1155H Co A reported having sustained 5 WHA from fire comming from a 300 meter long bunker complex running NE-SW vic XS 767797. At 1200H the 1st of 3 airstrikes was requested. At 1300H Co A reported sustaining 3 additional WHA. At 1310H the 1st airstrike was delivered and the enemy broke contact. At 1337H vic XS 769797 Co A completed dust off for 2 US DOW and 6 US WHA. At 1632H vio XS 767797 Co A found 5 RPG-2 rounds, 5 lbs of medical supplies, 25 lbs of clothing and destroyed 12 bunkers. At 1709H vio XS 76793 Co A found 1 VC KBA. At 1826H vio XS 765796 Co A extracted closing FSPB SMOKE at 1830H. At 0900H vio XS 794829 Co B departed FSPB DAGGER to conduct waterborne assaults and Recon in Force operations. At 0930H vio XS 815775 Co B boarded RAG boats moved up river and landed vio XS 847782 at 1005H. From the landing point Co B conducted Recon in Force opns to vic XS 839783. At 1258H vio XS 839783 Co B lifted off a PZ responding to the Trp D contact and reinserted vic XS 767813 at 1315H. From the LZ Co B moved southeast to vic XS 768802 without contact. At 1747H vio PZ XS 777815 Co B extracted closing PB DAGGER at 1753H. At 1110H vio XS 789771 D/17 Cav and the Recon Platoon reacting to contact made by Trp D departed FSPB SMOKE by APC. The Recon Platoon dismounted vio XS 778803 and secured a gunship from Trp

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D that had been downed by ground fire. At 1605H the helicopter was extracted. At 1622H vic XS 772791 the Recon Platoon apprehended 1 detainee and destroyed 2 sampans. At 1630H the Recon Platoon departed the area of contact by APC closing FSPB SMOKE at 1700H. After relocating the Recon Platoon, Trp D/17 Cav continued northwest to vic XS 770804 and formed a screening position oriented to the southeast. The Cav and Recon Platoon rejoined closing FSPB SMOKE by APC at 1700H. Trp D/3\*5 Cav in support of the 2-3 Inf for todays opns conducted aerial Recon and Platoon size airmobile assaults and Recon in Force operations. Operations began at 0800H and at 0854H vic XS 767797, a Recon ship observed 1 VC working on a bunker. He was engaged by gunships and killed. At 0935H vic XS 769797 the ARP was inserted to conduct a search of the area. At 1005H vic XS 769797 the ARP extracted and reinserted via XS 770800. The ARP immediately made contact with an a VC Co and began receiving small arms and automatic weapons fire from a bunker complex approximately 300 meters long. At 1055H vic XS 778803 1 gunship from Trp D was downed as a result of ground fire and was extracted at 1605H. Crew members were not injured. At 1155H the ARP had sustained 6 WIA (evac) and 2 KHA. At 1310H the ARP was extracted from the area of contact. At 1800H Trp D was released to Division control.

d The 4-39 Inf conducted local combat patrols and planned for future opns. At 1045H vic XS 661615 the Recon Platoon while conducting a local security patrol engaged 2 male VC when they took evasive action to avoid the patrol, both were wounded and apprehended. At 1550H vic XS 671615 the Recon Platoon began receiving automatic weapons fire from an unk size VC force. Fire was returned using organic weapons and an airstrike was requested. At 1632H a LFT was on station and contact continued. At 1645H vic XS 674607 the VC broke contact. At 1715H the airstrike was delivered on the enemy position. A search of the area was conducted without incident.

e At 0400H vic XS 638768 the US Arty compound at Ben Luc came under attack when it received 15 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. A LFT and Arty were fired in support on a suspected enemy mortar position vic XS 633787. At 0402H the attack ceased. There were no friendly casualties. Enemy losses are unk.

f Night VR mission: At 0500H vic XS 817758 the S-2 from the 2-3 Inf

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observed approximately 10 personnel and lights at 0505H the target was engaged by door gunners with unknown results.
