WE REMEMBER AND HONOR THE OFFICERS AND MEN WHO SERVED THEIR COUNTRY ABOARD THE EVANS, A QUICK AND POWERFUL DESTROYER, NICKNAMED "THE FIGHTER" ... IN WORLD WAR II, AND IN THE POST WAR YEARS, IN THE KOREAN WAR AND THE VIETNAM CONFLICT.
