Dear Ron,

We also have training at our by-weekly meetings. The center of the patch shows the top of our county courthouse along with the date that the fire dedaprtment was established in Hood County. At one time not too many years ago there was the only fire department in the county. Now we have eight (8) volunteer department scattered through the county. They are all seperate departments that have their own fire chief but we all act in corporation with each other. Granbury Fire Department has a contract with the City of Granbury and the county government for fire protection. The other items are the "Jaws of Life" tool for the extrication of victims from vehicles. Then the Celtic Cross is known as the fire fighter symbol that has been customized for our own need. The last symbol is for the Hazaradus Waste Material, which our department is qualified to act on. We have mostly gasoline, oil and other items to clean up. Hopefully we will never be called on to respond to our nuclear reactor that is about ten (10) air miles from the city of Granbury. Any patches we get will go up on our patch wall. We have about 80 to 100 now from around the U.S.A. and the world. But we do not have any from Australia, so anything you can do will be appreciated.
