"The Clinton administration's fiscal year 1997-2001 plan includes funding for 14 additional Arleigh Burke (DDG-51) - class Aegis destroyers; a total of 57 DDG-51s are planned to complement the 27 Ticonderoga (CG-47)-class Aegis cruisers in the fleet."

What a fitting tribute to those 74 shipmates, and to the U.S.S. Frank E. Evans DD754! I would welcome any thoughts you may have on this, *and ask that we do this together as an organization.* Doing something of the magnitude will take a lot of coordinating to have the necessary impact.
