PRESS RELEASE

At the New Jersey State Council, Vietnam Veterans of America Inc., meeting, Sunday, January 17, a motion was unanimously passed to join the fight against the ocean dumping of Dioxin contaminated sludge from Newark Bay. The motion gave the authority to the State Council to take any and all actions that they may deem necessary to prevent Dioxin contamination from affecting other generations.


The motion was immediately joined by the New York State Council of Vietnam Veterans of America Inc. The President of the N.J. State Council, Gary Wall and the N.Y. State Council President, John Greco said, "The New Jersey and New York State Councils will not idly stand by while another generation is exposed to Dioxin. We, as Vietnam Veterans, know all too well the severe health impact and birth defects caused by exposure of dioxins in Vietnam. There is little we can do to reverse our own exposure, but we can do everything in our power to prevent another generation from experiencing the adverse health effects of Dioxin in the food chain and water."
