
Dear Admiral Zumwalt,

Please don't hesitate to call on us again.

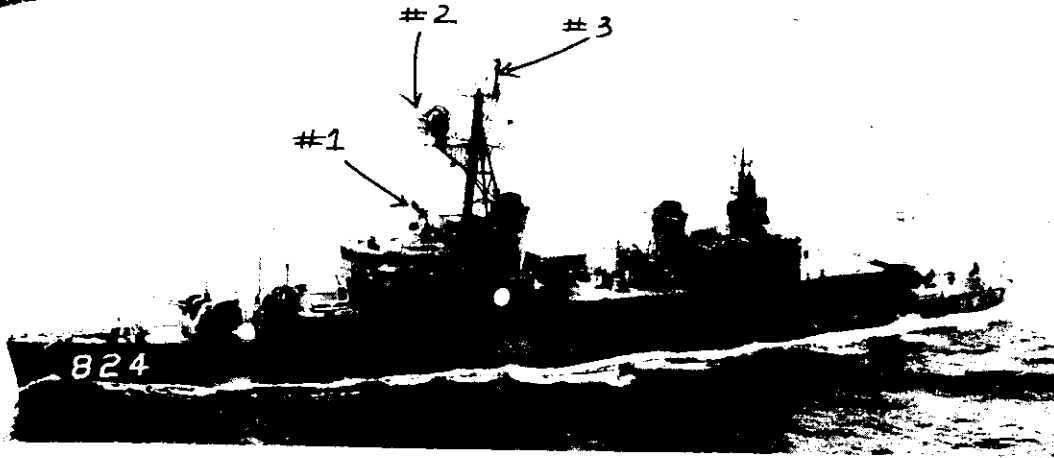
