Dear Admiral Zumwalt:

We are asking for your assistance, if possible, with respect to some information that we need to substantiate a claim for a disabled veteran whom we are representing.

The veteran currently has a claim pending with the Veterans Administration for a non Hodgkins Lymphoma based on exposure to non ionizing radiation from a radar unit while he was acting as a Signalman on the USS Holder DD189 from 1963 through 1967.

My reason for this letter to you, Admiral Zumwalt, is that we are in the process of obtaining a statement as to the probable effects of radar type radiation and the causal effects of non Hodgkins Lymphoma, however, we have been asked to specify the make, type and model number of the radar used on the above mentioned ship. If, through your connections, it would be at all possible to find out this information, we would be extremely grateful.

I await your reply and thank you for your assistance in this matter.
