Dear Tom:

Sunday I had a brief meeting with Vladimir Tolstoy, a Russian language professor at the U.S. Naval Academy, whom I have known for nearly thirty years. He expressed deep concern about the employment there of a female Russian/Spanish teacher by the name of Pruna (spelling estimated).

He reported that she was originally a Soviet citizen who married a Communist citizen of the Dominican Republic, divorced him, and married a U.S. citizen. He stated that this woman had graduated from Lumumba University where, according to a Soviet defector, she was under the control of a Soviet KGB general.

Tolstoy reports that she subtly advocates the cause of the USSR and deprecates the U.S. in certain ways.

His concern is that she is there to identify malleable midshipmen for the establishment of dossiers for later use.

All of the foregoing is obviously unevaluated by me, but I can attest to Tolstoy's sincere and patriotic interests.
