Lt. General Calvin A.H. Waller assumed his current duties as Commanding General on August 3, 1989. From November 14, 1990 to March 25, 1991, General Walter served as Deputy Commander-in-chief of U.S. command, in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, during Operation Desert Shield/Storm. As second in command of all deployed Persian Gulf forces and coordinator of the ground campaign plan, he was instrumental in the ultimate success of Operation Desert Storm. He resumed command of I Corps and Fort Lewis on March 25, 1991.

# COMMANDING GENERAL

## I CORPS & FORT LEWIS

Lieutenant General Waller was born December 17, 1937, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He graduated from Prairie View A&M University as a distinguished military graduate in 1959. He obtained his Master of Science degree in Public Administration from Shippensburg State College, Pennsylvania, in 1978.

General Waller's initial military assignments were in company-grade positions in the 4th Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Washington. He attended the Advanced Course before serving as Training Officer for the Eighth U.S. Support Command in Korea. After that tour, he was assigned to the 82d Airborne Division as Brigade Assistant Training Officer and later as the Division Training Officer.

After attending the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, General Waller served a tour in Vietnam as Joint Operations Officer for the Military Assistance Command - Vietnam. Later he was assigned to Washington, D.C., as a personnel staff officer in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel, Department of the Army. He left that office to serve as Executive Officer of the 1st Battalion, 68th Armor, in Baumholder, Germany.

General Waller was also assigned to Headquarters, 8th Infantry Division (Mechanized), in Germany, where he served as Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Training. He served at Fort Carson, Colorado, as Commander, 1st Battalion, 77th Armor, and after attending the Army War College in Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, returned to Fort Carson as the Assistant Chief of Staff, Operations and Training, 4th Infantry Division (Mechanized).

In July 1980, he became Senior Military Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Manpower, Reserve Affairs and Logistics, a position he held until his assignment to Germany to command the 2d Brigade, 8th Infantry Division. Upon return from Germany in August 1983, he became Chief of Staff of the 24th Infantry Division (Mechanized) in Fort Stewart, Georgia. He became the Chief of Staff of XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg, North Carolina, in December of 1983. In June of 1984, he became the Assistant Division Commander for Operations in the 82d Airborne Division, a position he held for two years. General Waller returned to Fort Lewis as Deputy Commanding General, Headquarters, I Corps and Fort Lewis. Following that assignment, he went back to Germany as Commander, 8th Infantry Division.

His decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Bronze Star (with Oak Leaf Clusters), Meritorious Service Medal (with Oak Leaf Clusters), Air Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge, and the Master Parachutist Badge.

General Waller is married to the former Marlon Estes of Davenport, Iowa. They have two sons: Michael, who lives in Colorado Springs, Colorado; and Mark, who lives in Austin, Texas.
