Dear Admiral Zumwalt:

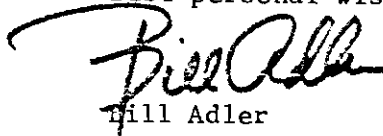
It was pleasant talking with you on the phone.
