
Dear Admiral Zumwalt:

Dear Guidance Counselor:

TET '68 is again proud this year to offer our scholarship program to graduating seniors whose parent or step-parent is a Vietnam Veteran. The rules for applying are detailed in the attached letter.

Last year, we received 108 essays for consideration by our panel of judges. We owe a tremendous "thank you" to all the guidance counselors who helped us by getting the word out to the students and assisting those who submitted essays assemble their supporting documentation. With funds available from our last veterans' reunion weekend, we awarded eight \$500 scholarships to children of Vietnam Veterans. In the four years of our program, we have awarded twenty-one \$500 scholarships and are proud to be able to offer our program another year.

Our Fifth Annual Vietnam Veterans Reunion will be January 31 - February 1 and 2, 1992. As of now, we do not know the amount of funds which will be available after this weekend. Therefore, we cannot say now how many scholarships will be given in 1992, but can assure you that as many as possible will be awarded. As detailed in the attached letter, applications, essays, and supporting documents are due in no later than March 31, 1992. The essays will be read by our judges during April, and we will inform the winning recipients and guidance counselors by mid-May. Where possible, we will attempt to attend the school's awards ceremonies and present the TET scholarship to the person who wins from that school.

1992 SCHOLARSHIP RULES

In order to be considered for a \$500 scholarship, the applicant must be a high school senior, write a short essay on "What Is Freedom?", and submit this for judging by a panel selected by the TET '68 Board. Previous recipients of a scholarship from TET '68 are not eligible. All entries must be received no later than March 31, 1992. Only successful applicants will be notified by phone by May 15, 1992. We will work with your high school in order to try and award the scholarship at graduation or awards ceremonies in June. Since we do not know at this time how much will be available from our 1992 reunion after paying all our expenses, we cannot say how many scholarships will be given. However, you can be assured that we will give as many scholarships as possible.

Each application submitted for scholarship competition must include the following:

(1) A copy of parent's or step-parent's DD 214 showing Vietnam service with Campaign Ribbon earned.

(2) Short essay on "What Is Freedom?" (500 words maximum). Essay must be typed and double spaced and will be judged on originality and neatness. Essays must be able to be xeroxed for distribution to the judges. All applicants agree that TET '68 may republish their essays.

(3) Provide cover sheet to include the following: (a) applicant's full name, address, and telephone number where applicant can be reached in the evenings, (b) name, address, telephone number, and contact person of high school currently attending, (c) name, address, telephone number, and contact person of school where application has been made or will be made for further education or training.

(4) Applicant's high school grades through Fall term.

(5) To be eligible for judging, all of the above must be received no later than March 31, 1992. Please send by U.S. Mail ONLY -- no Overnight, Certified, Registered or Federal Express mailings please. Any package received after the March 31, 1992, deadline or with postage due will not be accepted. Send to:
