Dear Madam Ambassador:

Admiral Zumwalt has been kind enough to forward to me copies of his and your correspondence. I have enclosed a copy of the letter I sent to Ambassador Jaya. I have not told Ambassador Jaya that I am corresponding with you, as I did not want to send cross signals. However, since Admiral Zumwalt has forwarded a copy to me of your letter, I wanted to let you know Mr. Stetson's and my activities in relation to Brunei. Perhaps you can help us.

We would very much like to see you. Also, we would like your advice on where to stay. We are flying to Bruni on Sunday, January 22, 1995. We would like to spend Sunday and Monday nights there. On one day we would like to visit the Outward Bound School, and on the other day we would like to visit with the Navy officials. Hopefully, we could have an audience with His Majesty. Perhaps you can be of help and give us guidance in the delicacy of the handling of this matter.

We have two objectives. One is to obtain support for the South African Outward Bound School, with an approach to His Majesty to support the Muslim population attending the Outward Bound School. A second item on the agenda is to talk about what involvement Brunei might have in commemorating the end of World War II next summer - 50 years after the surrender in 1945 - and how the U.S. might be involved

I will be visiting Balikpapan for discussions with city officials on how best to remember the end of World War II and to commemorate the birth of a new country. We have already talked with a few Australians who are very interested in participating. The United States Navy Memorial is considering a tour to Balikpapan, and as long as they are going there, they might as well go to Singapore, Brunei, and a few other places. These are some of the items we would like to discuss with you and the appropriate Brunei officials. We look forward to your help and to meeting with you.
