- ____ (1) Evidence of Support: You must provide evidence that your relatives are not likely to become public charges in the United States. We therefore need two notarized Affidavits of Support from you or from the person or group who will guarantee support of the person(s) listed above. We suggest you use the Form I-134, available from any INS office or U.S. Consulate, for this purpose. After you complete the form, take it to a Notary Public to witness your signature. In addition, we require documentation on your assets as instructed at the bottom of the back side of the Form I-134.
