

It is with great pleasure that I invite you, on behalf of the Center for the Study of the Vietnam Conflict, to attend and participate in the Center's second triennial symposium, *After the Cold War: Reassessing Vietnam*.

The purpose of this symposium is to provide an opportunity for participants in the war and academics of all points of view to meet and conduct a frank exchange of ideas about all aspects of the conflict in Indochina. We believe this is an appropriate time to reexamine all aspects of the war, as the end of the Cold War and the normalization of relations between our two nations has made it possible to conduct a freer international exchange of ideas.
