Dear Admiral Zumwalt:

Dr. Jim Reckner has indicated that you would be willing to write a letter of support for Texas Tech University Libraries' grant application to the Department of Education. The focus of the proposal is funding for the Vietnam Archive located in Texas Tech University's Main Library. The application is being submitted to the U.S. Department of Education's "Strengthening Research Library Resources Program". The purpose of the program is to provide grants to the Nation's major research libraries to maintain and strengthen their collections and make their holdings available to other libraries whose users have need for research materials.

Texas Tech University Libraries have already qualified as a major research library. At this time, we are developing a proposal to strengthen our collection in the Vietnam Archive, in hopes of becoming the strongest collection of holdings concerning the Vietnam Conflict in the United States. The fact that Texas Tech University has one of the most liberal policies as far as lending microform materials (a major portion of the Vietnam Archive's collection) to other libraries through interlibrary loan would be a significant factor of our willingness to make our holdings available to other libraries whose users need these research materials. In fact, we have already fulfilled requests for use of materials from our current holdings in the Vietnam Archive from researchers in Washington, D.C.
