

Over the years I have listened to several conversations or parts of several conversations about the battle on May 21-22nd 1966 involving Bravo and Charlie Company and a battalion of NVA. David Dolby was awarded the CMH for the battle and

Roy Martin the DSC. The most extensive writing about the battle was by S.L.A. Marshall and from what I remember reading while working in the intelligence section of 2nd/19th Artillery, he left out significant parts of the battle. More importantly he left out a lot of very interesting stories of individual heroism. I have been in contact with some of the Jumping Mustangs already and have some good data. I would like to make the article as complete as possible for Airborne Quarterly and/or Saber. Martin, Mozey, Poynter, McCarron, and McCallum like the idea of Airborne Quarterly because they can devote more space and

to do the battle justice we do need the space. If you were involved in the battle and haven't been contacted your comments would be appreciated. I also noticed that Airborne Quarterly likes to have photographs. If you have photographs taken on either of those two days or possibly small group pictures taken near that time of people involved, they would help. 

Home again and memories of that year in Vietnam,


And what do you know, that same old Uncle called me up again.
