

Shortly after my arrival Eagle Dustoff lost a ship and a crew. The unit sorrowfully bade farewell to WO Ed O'Brien, WO Bruce Graham, SP4 Bill Hawkins and SP5 Dave Johnson. An RPG round cut short the hoist mission they were on and their lives on 26 May. On 30 May WO Louis Lewis and LT. Dennis Story took a few rounds and were evacuated. 23 June CW2 Dan Smith and SP4 Randy Hall were wounded and evacuated.

Mean while the business of surviving in the heat and accomplishing the mission continues. So much for this issue from the new 96.
