

SP4 Charles F. Rein, RA 10124679, was killed in the Republic of Vietnam when the aircraft in which he was a passenger was hit by hostile automatic weapons fire, which caused the aircraft to crash and burn. Specialist Rein was the photographer aboard a UH-1H aircraft, which was on an aerial personnel detection mission at the time it was shot down.

Specialist Rein was born in Morristown, New Jersey, but accompanied his parents when they moved to Titusville, Florida. He entered the United States Army while living at Fort Buckner, Okinawa, with his parents. After basic training was completed at Ft Ord, California, he received advanced training as a Motion Picture Photographer at Ft Monmouth, New Jersey, from February to June, 1967.

During his assignment with the U. S. Army Special Photographic Detachment, Pacific, Specialist Rein went temporary duty twice to Thailand and once to Vietnam. He departed for his second Vietnam duty on 16 Nov 1968.

He is survived by his mother and step-father, Mr. and Mrs. James B. Tyner, Jr., of Tampa, Florida.
