A photographer wades in chest-high swamp water, grimacing as he suspends camera equipment above his head. He is one of the fearless young men who traversed the face of South Vietnam capturing iconic images that have become part of the visual history of the Vietnam conflict. This exhibit explores not only the images, but the photographers whose lives were forever intertwined with Vietnam. Included are stunning images by members of The Department of the Army Special Photographic Office (DASPO), and Robert J. Ellison's award-winning photos that were published in Time and Newsweek. Ellison lost his life in Khe Sanh, Vietnam at the age of 23.
