The preservation of DASPO exploits somewhere is a wonderful project and I can see that a lot of effort is being made. The Yoho/Rein scholarship is a fine thing and I will certainly contribute to it. Yoho served in the Pacific Detachment when I was the CO. He came from Moundsville, West Virginia, where his father ran the local TV station. I believe he owned it. When Yoho was ordered to join the Pacific Detachment, his father drove him all the way to the west coast where he caught a plane to Hawaii. The time they spent together on the road was their last time together. I think it would be nice, when the scholarship is organized, if someone notified the TV station in Moundsville so they could do a piece about it.

One is of Art Jones pinning a 1st Lieutenant bar on Carl Conn at the time of his promotion.
