Checkerboard opn in the area. At approximately 211600H vic XS700725 the helicopter down with mechanical troubles was extracted. At 211646H and 261705H Co B was extracted from vic XS705725 and lifted to Rach Kien at 211650H and 211711H. At 21736H 5 sorties of Co C were extracted from vic XS544586 and lifted to Rach Kien at 211739. At 211818H 6 sorties of Co C were extracted from vic XS635596 and lifted to Rach Kien at 211824H. 2-60: Co B continued its Recondo Checkerboard opn vic XS643673. The remainder of the 2-60 elements conducted local security patrols, road sweeps and maintenance of equipment. At 211220H vic XS643677 Co B engaged 2 VC w/wms wearing green uniforms with unknown results. At 211440H vic XS644673 Co B received AW and SA fire during a brief contact with an unknown size VC force. Fire was returned. Results: 2 US WHA (evacuated), unknown VC casualties. At 211600H Co A departed Tan Tru enroute to its 48-hour Recondo Checkerboard opn vic XS6765. Co's A and B continued their Recondo Checkerboard opns at the close of this report. 2-47: At 210908H vic XS563600 a Co B element found and destroyed 1 105mm rd. The 2-47 elements conducted road and bridge security, and convoy escort opns without further incident or finds. 3-39: At 210714H Co's A and C departed Can Giouc for a footmobile RIF opn with Co A setting up blocking positions vic XS805727 and Co C sweeping to Co A's positions from vic XS912715. At 210733H vic XS865779 from its RON position in the Nha Be rocket belt Co B loaded on boats. At 211006H Co B beached vic XS890706 to check out an L-19 plane that had crashed in the area at 210130H. At 211105H vic XS890706 Co B completed its search of the crash site and back loaded on boats. At 211125H Co's A and C closed at Can Giouc with negative results on their footmobile RIF opn northwest of Can Giouc. At 211155H Co B closed at Can Giouc. At 211445H Co A loaded on boats at Can Giouc and beached at 211750H vic XS885746 in the Nha Be rocket belt. Co A will RON in the area. A Trp/3-17 Cav: A Trp continued armed aerial reconnaissance in support of 1st Bde opns with priority to the 2-39 AML/RIF opn. At 211130H vic XS855705 A Trp picked up 2 detainees. A Trp flew "People Sniffer" missions and gunship support for 2-39 without further incident.

22 October: The 1st Bde conducted opns with 3 Inf Bn's (2-39, 3-39, 2-60), and 1 Mech Bn (2-47). 2-39: (Delayed entry: At 211605H vic XS544816 and XS625597 Co C found and destroyed 1 B40 rocket rd and 26 bunkers, respectively. At 212100H vic XS671677 in its Recondo Checkerboard opn A36 element received a small amount of SA fire. Negative US casualties. Illumination was fired over suspected site of fire). At 220030H vic XS671677 A36 element received 3 82mm mortar rds & a small amount of AW fire. Fire was not returned. Arty was fired in support of Co A. Negative US casualties. At 220730H vic XS671677 A36 swept area of firing with negative results. At 221243H Co B departed Rach Kien for a footmobile RIF opn vic XS7368. At 221420H vic XS743688 a helicopter (call sign-Stingray 2A6) crashed while attempting to extract Co B's forward observer who had broken his leg. (Not known how leg was broken) B16 element secured the downed helicopter. The pilot was unhurt. At 221700 vic XS743688 the downed helicopter was extracted. At 221731H Co B closed at Rach Kien. At 221738H vic XS715667 Co A observed 4 VC w/wms and called in Arty on them. At the close of this report Co A was sweeping the area vic XS715667 and will continue its Recondo Checkerboard opn in the area tonight. 2-60: (Delayed entry: At 211915H vic XS650683 in its Recondo Checkerboard opn B26 element received SA fire in a brief contact with an unknown size VC force. Arty provided supporting fires: 1 US WHA (evacuated) VC casualties unknown). At 221200H Co B closed at Tan Tru from vic XS650683. Co A continued its Recondo Checkerboard opn vic XS656642 without incident. The remainder of the 2-60 elements conducted local security patrols, road sweeps, and maintenance of equipment. 2-47: The 2-47 continued road and bridge security, and convoy escort opns without incident. At 221400H Co B departed Binh Phuoc for a 24-hour Bushmaster opn vic XS6150. At 221450H Co A departed Binh Phuoc for a 48-hour Recondo Checkerboard opn vic XS5961. At 221826H Co B checked out the area vic XS558532 where a platoon of VC had been reported sighted. Co B had negative finds in the area and returned to vic XS6150. At the close of this report Co's A and B continued their respective Recondo Checkerboard and Bushmaster opns.

They were taken under fire with unknown results. 1 satchel charge and 5 chicom grenades were found on the sampan. The satchel charge and grenades were destroyed. The sampan was to be pulled to Can Giouc). At 220005H at Can Giouc Co C loaded on boats for a riverine/RIF vic XS8568. At 220851H Co C beached vic XS867687. At 221200H vic XS867687 Co C backloaded on boats. At 221308H Co C beached vic XS917705. At 221351H vic XS917705 Co C again backloaded after negative finds at their 3rd objection area. At 221400H Co C beached vic XS898716. At 221435H vic XS898718 Co C backloaded boats enroute to Can Giouc, closing at 22164H. Co A conducted a footmobile/RIF around its RON vic XS885746. Co A will RON vic XS901759. The remainder of the 3-39 elements conducted local security patrols and maintenance of equipment.

23 October: The 1st Bde conducted opns with 3 Inf Bn's (2-39, 3-39, 2-60), and 1 Mech Bn (2-47). 2-39: (Delayed entries: At 221820 vic XS712632 Co A made contact with an estimated 3 to 5 VC with automatic weapons. Co A returned fire with organic weapons and arty. Co A detained 2 suspects, no further results reported). At 230658H Co's B & E initiated a cordon & search operation with RF/PF vic XS735746. At 230755 1 plt of Co B performed a security mission for engineers repairing Hwy 231 vic XS755787 at 230947 vic XS735740 RF/PF elements in C&S operation picked up 6 detainees. At 231510H Co C departed Rach Kien to initiate a checkerboard operation vic XS702715. At 231705H vic XS703722 Co C fired on 5 VC with weapons, negative results as of the close of this report. 2-47: At 230730 vic XS598587 Co A, on RIF mission, found and destroyed 2 booby traps. At 230830 vic XS566587 the Romeo element picked up 2 detainees. 2-47 continued convoy and road security missions without incident. 2-60: The 2-60 conducted local security operations, maintenance and prepared for future operations. A cordon and search was conducted with 3 Co's and RF/PF vic XS6563 with negative results. 2-60 elements returned to Tan Tru at 230825H. At 230945 vic XS618653 a road sweep team reported a crater in the road, engineers were notified. 3-39: At 230903 Co's B & C loaded on T boats at Can Giouc to begin RI operation. At 231049 Co's B & C loaded boats. At 231200 Co's B & C beached at XS875730. At 231211 vic XS875733 Co B reported 1 VC (BC), 1 POW, 2 AK47, 4 60mm rounds and 1 Claymore mine.

At 241020H Co E was picked up at Rach Kien and inserted at 241030H vic XS645705 to conduct RIF opn. At 241717H third plt of Co A closed Rach Kien after completion of Road Security Mission. At 241724 ten (10) slicks of Co B were extracted from vic XS678717 and closed Rach Kien at 241731. At 241740 the last ten (10) slick loads of Co B were extracted from vic XS682709 and closed Rach Kien at 241746. At 241752 Co E was extracted from vic XS710690 and closed Rach Kien at 241800H. Co C continues Recondo Checkerboard vic XS6972. 2-60: (Delayed entry: At 1808H (23 Oct) one (1) EM from Co A accidentally shot himself in the right hand. Dust off was completed at 231822H). At 272030H vic XS721665 Co E engaged 2 VC with unknown results). From 280210H to 280220H the 2039 CF at Rach Kien came under an attack by fire from an unknown size VC force. The 2-39 base camp received 5 107mm rocket rounds 1 B-40 rocket rd, 3 60mm mortar rds, and heavy SA fire. Arty and AF "Spooky" supported the 2-39 elements. Although heavy firing ceased at 280220H, sporadic firing continued until 280300H. Results: 1 US KHA, 22 US WHA (7 of which required evacuation). VC casualties unknown. At 280632H Co's A and B moved out of Rach Kien to sweep south and east of Rach Kien in an attempt to locate the enemy force that had attacked by fire earlier. At 280830H Co's A and B closed at the 2-39 CP with negative finds. Co E continued its Recondo Checkerboard opn vic XS725665. The remainder of the 2-39 elements conducted local security patrols, road sweeps, and maintenance of equipment. 2-60: At 280640H 9 sorties of Co A were lifted from Tan Tru and inserted at 280710H and 280719H vic XS917721 and 928718, respectively. At 280735H 9 sorties of Co B were lifted from Tan Tru and inserted at 280740H and 280750H vic XS938719 and XS947713, respectively. At 281415H the downed helicopter was extracted from vic XS505706. At 281421H 5 sorties of Co B were extracted from vic XS505705 and lifted to Tan Tru at 281430H. At 281545H Co A closed at Tan Tru by trucks. At 281610H the remainder of Co B closed at Tan Tru by footmobile march. From 281600H to 281807H 15 sorties of Co C were lifted from Tan Tru and inserted vic XS657707 and XS651709. At the close of this report Co C continued its RIF opn vic XS651709, and was scheduled to be extracted to Tan Tru. 3-30: At 280004H vic XS812653 A26 element had a brief contact which resulted in 3 VC KIA (BC), 1 AK47, 1 bandoleer, 1 magazine and a wallet. At 280820H vic XS811653 Co A send 1 sampan and captured 1 sampan mortar, 1 pistol (unk type) and 1 roncho. At 280920H vic XS823636 Co A picked up one (1) detainee. 15 (C) Commander's Evaluation

During the period of this report the Recondo Brigade has seen a complete change in enemy tactics. In July, August, and early September, the enemy continued to operate in company and battalion size units. The 1st Brigade was highly successful in engaging these units employing the encirclement and pile on techniques to destroy the units. As the contacts continued the enemy began to react to the tactics by fragmenting his units and dispersing them over larger areas. By late September enemy companies were spread over as much as four to six kilometers. As the enemy segmented his forces there was also a marked increase in his night movements.

In order to maintain pressure on the enemy, the Brigade developed new techniques to meet the enemy under the new conditions. The Jitterbug technique of airmobile insertions was used to a maximum to increase the capability of finding the enemy's fragmented units. To deny the enemy the use of the night to move units and supplies the "Night Hunter" operation was developed. The Night Hunter consists of using sophisticated surveillance devices such as radar and SLAR to acquire targets at night. Once a target has been established an artillery illumination TOT is prepared over the target area. The Air Cav is then alerted and flies to the vicinity of the target area. When the TOT is fired the Air Cav arrives on station as the artillery illuminates the target. If the target is valid the Air Cav engages. The Night Hunter has also been used with ground troops being employed in the target areas by riverine assets and has also been highly successful.

In addition to increased Jitterbugging and the Night Hunter operations the Brigade has utilized night ambushes and checkerboard operations to a maximum to limit the enemy's ability to move at night. Lines of communications were interdicted by saturation ambushing including the use of riverine assets to insert ambushes along streams, canals, and rivers.

During the latter part of October and November the Brigade has placed full support behind the Special Pacification Program in Long An. The Brigade operated around targeted hamlets to insure GVN control of the areas and has participated in the pacification of the hamlets by providing medical, civic

Main themes employ during operations: Chieu Hoi, NVA surrender, Scare and Power, Loneliness, Rally.

(2). The following Psyon assets were utilized during the operations (listed in order of frequency):

(a) 1000 watt speaker mounted in UHID: This was the easiest asset to use and quickest to react to tactical requirements.

(b) U-10 aircraft: This assets reaction time ranged from 45 mins to 6 hrs. The reaction time was slow but once on station speaker broadcast were superior to UHID.

(c) CH47 Helicopters: Used primarily at night to cover large areas. Normally available on preplanned basis only.

(d) LOH Helicopters with 500 Watt sneaker: This asset was used on a test basis and provided adequate coverage for small areas. Reaction time was very short and immediate reaction to tactical situations were possible.

(e) Backpacked 250 Watt speaker: Used primarily on Cordon and Search operations.

(f) AN/PLQ-5A Public address Set: Used primarily for the evaluation of Intimate Psywar Concept. The set was employed by maneuver elements down to platoon soze and was fairly effective. T6 set is lacking in ruggedness and durability for extended operations and maintenance time is excessive.

14. Logistics

a. Administration: The logistical support for units participating in operation Toan Thang II was provided by support units located in Tan An, Ben Luc, and Dong Tam. Unit rear areas were located at Rach Kien, Tan Tru, Binh Phouc, Bearcat, Dong Tam, Tan An. Resupply was effected utilizing organic vehicles and the highway network, CH-47, UH-1, and OH-6 to units in the field.

1. (U) Name of Operation: Toan Thang II (1st Recondo Bde, 9th Infantry Division).
2. (C) Dates of Operation: 221400H June - 131800H November 1968
3. (C) Location: Long An Province and portions of Gia Dinh Province south of grid line 78. Reference: Maps Vietnam, 1:50,000 sheets 6330 I,II,III,IV; 6230 I,II,III,IV; 6329 I and IV, 6229 I and IV.
4. (C) General: During the period 14 June to 13 November 1968 the First Recondo Brigade participated in Operation Toan Thang II. On 22 June the 1st Brigade Headquarters displaced from Dong Tam to Tan An and continued to operate from Tan An base throughout the reporting period. On 22 June the 2-60th Inf displaced to Tan Tru and 2-39th Inf displaced to Rach Kien, the battalions operated from these respective bases throughout the operational period. Upon displacement to Long An province 1st Brigade assumed OPCON of the 5-60th Inf Bn (M) located at Binh Phuoc and the 6-31st Inf Bn at Nha Be. On 14 August the 6-31st Inf was released from OPCON of 1st Bde and placed under OPCON of the 199th LIB. On 11 September the 1st Bde assumed OPCO of the 3-39th Inf from 3rd Bde, 9th Inf Div. On 13 September OPCON of 5-60th Inf (M) passed from CO, 1st Bde to 1st Inf Div and OPCON of 2-47th Inf (M) was passed to CO 1st Bde from TF Forsyth. The maneuver elements of the brigade performed strike operations throughout Long An and southern Gia Dinh Province. In addition the brigade conducted security operations along highway 4 and on critical bridges sites along highway 4. The missions of the brigade remained unchanged until 13 November 1968 when HHC 1st Brigade and 2-39th Inf displaced south to Dinh Tuong Province and began operation Quyet Chien II.

1. (U) Name of Operation: Quyet Chien (1st Recondo Bde, 9th Inf Div)
2. (C) Dates of Operation: 131800 November - 312400 December 1968.
3. (C) Location: Dinh Tuong and portions of Go Cong, Kien Tuong and Kien Hoa Provinces. Reference: Maps Vietnam, 1:50,000 sheets 6229 I, II, III, IV; 6129 I and II.
4. (C) General: During the period 13 November to 31 December 1968 the First Recondo Brigade conducted operations under Operation Quyet Chien. On 13 November Operation Toan Thang II was terminated as Headquarters, 1st Brigade and the 2-39th Infantry Battalion displaced from Long An to Dinh Tuong Province. At 131800H the 1st Brigade assumed Operation Quyet Chien and the 3rd Brigade assumed Operation Toan Thang II. Upon closing into Dong Tam Base, 1st Brigade assumed OPCON of 4-39th Infantry Battalion and 6-31st Infantry Battalion from the 3rd Brigade. The 3rd Brigade assumed OPCON of the 2-60, 2-47(M) and 3-39th Infantry Battalions upon closing into Tan An Base. The Recondo Brigade established its headquarters at Dong Tam Base with a forward CP at FSB MOORE (XS265505). The 2-39 and 4-39 Infantry Battalions established their headquarters at Dong Tam and the 6-31st Infantry operated from FSB MOORE. The task organization of the brigade again changed on 24 November when OPCON of the 4-39 Infantry was released to 3rd Brigade and OPCON of 3-39th Infantry was assumed by 1st Brigade. The 3-39th Infantry displaced to Dong Tam and established their headquarters. On 4 December the 1st Brigade again assumed OPCON of the 4-39 Infantry from the 3rd Brigade and the 4-39 Infantry displaced to Dong Tam for operations in Dinh Tuong Province. During the period 20 November to 4 December the 1st Brigade had OPCON of the 4-47 Infantry which was conducting a separate operation (Operation Kudzu) and did not participate in Operation Quyet Chien. On 4 December the 4-47 Infantry was released to OPCON of the 2nd Brigade and the Defense against Rocket and Missile attack (DARMA) operations around Dong Tam Base under Operation Kudzu was assumed by 4-39 Infantry. On 20 December Operation Kudzu was terminated and the DARMA operations for Dong Tam Base were incorporated into Operation Quyet Chien. The mission of the Recondo Brigade under Operation Quyet Chien was to conduct strike operations throughout Dinh Tuong and adjacent provinces, conduct DARMA operations around Dong Tam Base, provide overwatch security along Highway 4 and critical bridge sites and conduct combined and complimentary operations in support of the GVN Accelerated Pacification Program to include extensive civic action and psychological warfare operations. The mission of the brigade remained unchanged until 010001 January 1969 when Operation Quyet Thang was initiated by the Recondo Brigade.

15. (C) COMMANDERS EVALUATION:

In the security operations in AO Crackerjack the Brigade effectively opened and held open the main commerce route from the rich Mekong Delta to the markets in Saigon. The Reconnaissance in Force/Spoiling Operations conducted along and adjacent to Highway 4 kept the enemy off balance and greatly reduced his ability to crater and interdict the road. The results of the operations north of AO Crackerjack indicated that the 514B and 261B Battalions had been all but annihilated. The 267B is believed to have the Ap Base area from Long An by an unknown route. It is not known where the 267B or the 261A went following the contact. Neither has been located since the contact.

The most effective group of tactical techniques developed during this period concerns the actions taken to annihilate located enemy units. The sequence involves location of enemy forces, "piling on" all available forces to encircle the enemy, and causing the encircled force to surrender or be annihilated. The various techniques developed to support this desired end have shown gratifying process. Initially the brigade begins its operations by employing the "people sniffer", airborne CS helicopters, ambush patrols, and air landed operations to locate the enemy. Once contact is established the brigade uses every available resource, stripping the base camps bare, to surround the located enemy force. Movement is continued even during the hours of darkness to ensure that the encirclement is complete. Then the brigade employs all available air and artillery to pound the enemy force, halting occasionally to practice the "intimate psychological warfare" described below. Finally the area is swept to destroy those who refuse to surrender. The primary object of this group of techniques is to obtain the surrender of a large enemy force. While the brigade achieved some success in this direction against local forces in Dinh Tuong province, we feel that our prospects are better against the NVA units who should be more susceptible to the appeals of the "intimate psychological warfare" program. If all the techniques are employed properly and a certain element of luck is present we feel that our "piling-on" tactic might yield gratifying results. We also further wish to refine this tactic through the inclusion of other friendly forces. This worked quite well in Dinh Tuong province when we acquired the cooperation of CIDG units.

During our encounter with main force battalions outside AO CRACKERJACK we quickly realized that our psychological appeals to the individual soldier were not applicable to these type targets. A second set of appeal cards are presently being prepared to hit directly at the cadre and leaders of these main force units aiming at the surrender of an entire structured main force unit. With selection, the US commander can choose his appeal based on the character and size of the contact. In debriefing the NVA Regimental S1 mentioned previously we found that our timing suffered. The trapped battalions had not been pounded long enough before we started out 15 to 20 minute appeals. He related to us that when the rhythm of "appeal - fire power-appeal" was set up they used the lull to maneuver their troops away from the bombed area. In our next encounter we plan a 4-5 minute appeal and if we do not receive a mass turnout, we intend to resume the fire power quickly.

8. Intelligence

a. Preoperational Intelligence:

(1) During the post-Tet Offensive period the enemy is concentrating his efforts toward the accumulation of supplies and material and the rebuilding of his understrength units in preparation for a second major offensive. At the same time he is conducting interdiction and harassment operations against primary lines of communication in an attempt to divert and weaken GVN and FVMAF. The segment of QL 4 between My Tho and Vinh Long is considered by the enemy an especially vital communication link between the rice growing regions of the Mekong Delta and the rice distribution centers in Saigon. Accordingly, he is devoting a major effort in an attempt to permanently disrupt this important supply line.

(2) Enemy units engaged in the interdiction of QL 4 include the 261 and 263 Battalions of the Dong Thap I Regiment, the 514 Mobile Provincial Battalions, 330, 332 and 334 sapper companies, the Vinh Kim, Cai Lay and Cai Be Local Force Companies, and hamlet guerrillas.

b. VC Strengths and Weaknesses:

(1) Dinh Tuong Province has, since the beginning of overt hostilities against the GVN, been a traditional stronghold of the VC and, before them the Viet Minh. Consequently, the entire province is laced with fortified base areas and a complex of concealed communication and liaison routes. Further, the inhabitants of the province are by and large VC sympathizers, which contributes to the hostility of the area.

(2) As a result of the heavy casualties inflicted upon the enemy during the Tet Offensive, his units are far below their normal ~~manpower levels~~ ^{manpower levels}. Replacement personnel have been drawn from local force units, recruited directly, or have infiltrated from North Vietnam. For the most part, they are inexperienced.

(3) In spite of the low personnel strength of the enemy, he is capable of limited offensive action against population centers and military installations. He is also capable of coordinated, multi-battalion operations. Due to the abundance of locally grown produce, he is well provisioned. The proximity of Cambodia ensures adequate logistic support of weapons, munitions and material.

d. Conclusion:

(1) Throughout the reporting period the enemy usually avoided major engagement when he could and confined his offensive activity to indirect fires and ground attacks against small outposts. The battalion sized elements continued to husband their forces and material leaving the bulk of interdiction operations to the local forces and guerrillas.

(2) The enemy appeared to devote a great deal of effort toward political and propaganda activities, possibly in response to the success of US psychological operations, reinforced by frequent and significant SVN and US tactical victories.

(3) There is strong evidence, in the form of documents, interrogation of FWs, and agent reports, to support the possibility that at least three enemy battalions, 514A, 261A and 261B, had been seriously depleted, if not rendered combat ineffective, by 1st Brigade operations in the Plain of Reeds and Northern Dinh Tuong Province during the period 29 May-8 June.

9. Mission: The First Brigade had the missions of securing Hwy4 from Cai Lay (XS228503) to the intersection of Hwy's 4 and 6A (XS472478) and conducting strike operations adjacent to Hwy 4 and throughout Dinh Tuong Province.

10. Concept:

a. Headquarters 1st Brigade, Headquarters 15th Engineer Battalion (Fwd) and Headquarters 1-11 Arty (DS) continued to operate bases at Dong Tam to support and control the 2-39 Inf, 2-60 Inf and the 5-60 (M) Inf.

b. The 2-39 Inf located its headquarters at FS/PB Moore (XS266505) and from here conducted strike operations in Dinh Tuong Province as well as provide security for work parties along Hwy 4.

c. The 2-60 Inf established its headquarters at FS/PB Pink Palace (XS406495) and from here conducted strike operations in the areas adjacent to Hwy 4 and throughout Dinh Tuong Province.

d. The 5-60 Inf (M) established its headquarters at FS/PB Jager (XS361496) and conducted security operations along Hwy 4 from Cai Lay to the intersection of Hwy's 4 and 6A. The 5-60 (M) Inf was released from OPCON of 1st Brigade on ~~20 June~~ 1968, one company remained OPCON to 2-39 Inf. This company moved to FS/PB Moore and continued security operations from that location.

11. (C) EXECUTION:

7 March: 1st Bde conducted intensive reconnaissance of Obj 3 area with C/3-17th Air Cav and conducted airmobile assaults into the objective area and initiated offensive opns with two inf bns. Bde TAC CP displaced to BINH PHUOC (vic XS610550) by motor, departing DONG TAM 1000H and arriving at new location at 1400H. 2-39th Inf conducted an AML assault into the objective area. (1st lift off 1020H; last lift touch down 1130H.) A & B Co's LZ vic XS601585; C & E Co's LZ vic XS606585. The bn swept west conducting a recon in force. At 1214H vic XS598584 B Co located 54 fighting and shelter type bunkers (to be destroyed at a later date). At 1440H C Co detonated a booby trap vic XS585581 resulting in 1 US KIA and 4 US WIA (dust-off completed at 1524H). The bn apprehended one detainee (to be evacuated). 2-60th Inf (-A Co) conducted an AML assault into the objective area (1st lift off 1122H; last lift down 1150H). LZ vic XS603555. The co's swept northwest conducting a recon in force, without contact or significant findings, to RON positions (B Co vic XS577570 & C Co vic XS565576). C/3-17th Air Cav conducted intensive reconnaissance of the Obj 3 area and of AO CRACKERJACK and reported numerous sightings of bunkers, roadblocks, sampans and enemy activity (see 1st Bde SPHINX). The troop also screened to the flanks and in front of the recon in force opns of 2-39th Inf and 2-60th Inf. At 1505H the troop landed vic XS556564, conducted a ground recon and talked to farmers who stated VC had left area and moved north one week ago. The troop extracted and departed the area at 1610H.

8 March: The 1st Bde continued recon in force opns northeast of MY THO in the north central and western parts of Obj 3 with the 2-39 and 2-60 Inf (-). The 2-39 Inf Fwd CP remained at XS565585 with Co's A, B, C and E as security. (Late entry: At 2213H a Co C ambush engaged an estimated 6-8 VC at XS567583 with SA & AW. The contact resulted in 2 VC KIA (BC). There were no US casualties.) From the Bn CP, commencing at 0753H, Co's A, B & C conducted recon in force opns to the northwest with no significant finds. Upon reaching a PZ vic XS545595, Co A and C conducted AML assaults to LZ's to the west (A - XS505585, C - XS515595) closing at 1307H and 1330H respectively. Co B continued, on foot, from the PZ southwest to the Bn RON location at XS528577. Co E and the Bn Fwd CP moved from the Bn RON location AML to XS545595 closing at 1108H. Following recon in force opns around the LZ, the Co & Bn Fwd CP moved AML to the Bn RON location closing at 1420H. Following sweeps to the southeast by Co's A and C to PZ's located at (Co A) XS522578 and (Co C) XS523593, the Co's conducted AML moves back to the Bn Fwd CP closing at 1710H. The 2-39 Inf Rear remained at FS/PB FELLS. The 2-60 Inf (-) continued recon in force opns in the central and western portions of obj 3 with Co's B and C. The Bn Fwd CP remained at Binh Phuoc. Co A remained OPCON to 3d Brigade. (Late entry: At 2207H, vic XS565576, a Co C AP sighted 12 VC outside their perimeter. Arty was fired and 1 VC was spotted fleeing the area.) The 2-60 Inf (-), with Co B & C, moved southwest from their RON locations (XS556564; XS578570) to form a block, oriented to the southwest, vic XS550560. At 1353H, vic XS554575, Co B found 9 fresh graves and 20 spider holes w/OHC. The Co destroyed the spider holes and continued with their mission. This block was held, in support of 7th ARVN Div opns to the south, until 1650H when the 2 Co's conducted an AML assault to their RON location vic XS532578. Trp C, 3-17 Air Cav conducted aerial recon and insertions of the aerial rifle plat (ARP) throughout Dinh

Tuong Province and the southeastern area of the 1st Bde AO concentrating on the stream/wood lines at XS590530, XS590518, XS600540. There were no significant finds and the ARP was extracted for the last time at 1605H.

9 March: The 1st Bde conducted recon in force opns 2 km south of Binh Phuoc with the 2-39 Inf & 2-60 Inf (-) and then displaced bns to AO CRACKER-JACK and to Dong Tam in preparation for future opns. Bde TAC CP displaced by motor from Binh Phuoc to Dong Tam (dept 1245H; ar 1520H). 2-39 Inf conducted airmobile assaults and reconnoitered in force along the Rach Tam Vu. (Delayed entry: At 081030H vic XS552589 B Co apprehended 1 detainee; evac to Dong Tam IPW 09 March). The bn conducted airmobile assaults into three LZ's: A Co LZ vic XS588535; B Co & E Co (-) LZ vic XS600514; C Co LZ vic XS580528. A Co: (1) lift off 0744H; down 0804H. B Co: 1st lift off 0759H; 2d lift down 0821H. C Co: 1st lift off 0830H; 2d lift down 0848H. E Co (-): (1) lift off 0844H; down 0849H. The co's reconnoitered to the east and north astride the Rach Tan Vu, closing at 2-60 Inf blocking psn vic XS606535 at approx 1345H without contact or significant findings. The bn then extracted by air and returned to its former FS/PB's (bn (-) to FELS and B Co to JAGER). 1st lift off 1421H; 4th lift down 1643H. During the displacement at approx 1512H vic XS3448 one CH-47 took one rd AW fire without casualties (speed 60 knts; alt 1500 ft). 2-60 Inf conducted an airmobile assault, reconnoitered in force southeast along the Rach Tam Vu, and established a blocking position for 2-39 Inf sweep. Airmobile assault was conducted into LZ's vic XS593547 (1st lift off 0925H; 4th lift down 1027H). Co's reconnoitered southeast without contact or significant findings & established their block approx 1130H. Upon completion of 2-39 Inf sweep, the Bn extracted and displaced by air to Dong Tam (1st lift off 1455H; 4th lift down 1610H). C/3-17 Air Cav conducted intensive aerial reconnaissance throughout Dinh Tuong Province and reported numerous sightings of VC bunkers, field fortifications and fighting positions (see 1st Bde SPHINX). At 1042H vic XS3448 the trp was engaged with AW fire and at least 1 RPG-2 rd. The trp returned fire, and contact was broken at 1055H. Results of encounter were 1 VC KIA (BC) (no US casualties or significant equip damage). At 1350H vic XS306449 the trp engaged one VC observed running into a bunker with unknown results (bunker could not be destroyed).

10 March: 1st Bde continued road/engr security, night ambush patrolling and convoy security operations along Hwy 4 with 5-60 Inf (M) (-) and conducted offensive operations west of Dong Tam with 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf (-). The 5-60 Inf (M) (-) continued engr/road security, conducted night ambush patrols along the entire length of Hwy 4 in AO CRACKERJACK and secured FS/PB's FELS & JAGER. Convoy escort was also provided by the 5-60 (M) (-) between Dong Tam & Tan An. The 5-60 Inf CP remained at FS/PB JAGER (B Btry, 1-84 Arty) with Co A (-) and the Scout Plat as security. Co B, Scout Plat 2-47 Inf (M) (OPCON to 5-60 Inf (M), E Co (-) 2-39 Inf, and 1 plat of Co A provided security for FS/PB FELS (A Btry, 1-11 Arty). A Co conducted road reconnaissance, engr security & convoy security opns. At 0755H vic XS360498 2d Plat AP, returning to CP, found several aiming stakes (dest), 9 rds AK47 ammo and 3 "D" size batteries (evac to Dong Tam). Convoy security element escorted DISCOM convoy between Dong Tam & Tan Tru (dpt Dong Tam 0845H; ar Tan Tru 1015H). At 1300H vic XS354493 2d Plat found a B-40 rd (dest by EOD). At 1330H vic XS435448, 3d Plat engr escort element was engaged with a command detonated mine, SA & AW fire. Plat returned fire. No US casualties resulted. VC casualties are unknown. One APC was slightly damaged. B Co conducted road reconnaissance and engr security opns. At 1007H vic XS300500 the co apprehended 2 detainees near the end of wire leading to a command detonated mine (evac to Dong Tam IPW.) Mine was destroyed in place- also 1 81mm dud rd and 2 81mm illum rds found same vic. At 1350H vic XS312498 the unit was engaged with SA & AW fire by an est reinf VC co. Arty, TAC air and LFT supported (on station 1415H). Scout Plat, 2-47 Inf (M) was

dispatched to scene of contact, arriving 1441H, and became OPCON of B Co. Air strike was delivered beginning at 1518H. Scout Plat deployed into a blocking position facing north (ctr of mass vic XS314494) (in psn 1530H). At 1535H B Co with Scout Plat, 5-60 Inf (M) began a sweep to the south from vic XS312496 to vic XS318498 against the Scout Plat block. Sweep was completed 1715H. Results of engagement were 2 US WIA (dust-off completed at 1430H), 5 VC KIA (possible) (by TAC air), 60 bunkers destroyed (by arty/TAC air), 15 structures destroyed and six structures damaged (by TAC air). Five blood trails were also found. C Co remained OPCON of 3d Bde. 2-39 Inf conducted airmobile assaults into the Obj 10 area and reconnoitered in force to the east along the RACH TRA TAN. (Delayed entries: at 091910H vic XS340499 B Co AP recvd approx 15 rds SA fire from south of their position without incurring casualties. Arty was fired into the area with unknown results. At 091945H vic XS336505 B Co was engaged by an estimated reinforced VC company with SA, AW and three rds of 60mm mortar fire. Arty and LFT supported (on station 2013H). VC broke contact at approx 2026H, but arty and LFT continued to recon the area by fire. At 2113H approx 20 VC broke from woods fleeing to the east and were engaged with arty & SA with unknown effect. There were no US casualties. On 10 (AM) Mar the battalion conducted airmobile assaults into two LZ's in Obj 10. B Co & E Co (-) LZ vic XS256439. A Co & C Co LZ vic XS261432. A Co" 1st lift off 0907H; 2d lift down 0940H. B Co" 1st lift off 0858H; 2d lift (split) down 0928H. C Co" (one) lift off 0924H; down 0940H. E Co (-): (one) lift off 0940H; down 0956H. The battalion reconnoitered east along the RACH TRA TAN. At 1200H vic XS264443 E Co discovered 18 new bunkers recently occupied and a well tended garden - also many trails (arty fired into area). At 1330H vic XS267444 E Co apprehended one detainee, non-ambulatory with shell frag wound in hip (evac to DONG TAM IPW). At 1444H vic XS268445 E Co discovered and destroyed a complex of 33 bunkers in a rectangular configuration on rice paddy dike - used recently. The bn continued its sweep without contact or further findings and established a RON position vic XS287459. At 1615H one dog handler with Bn main CP shot himself in the foot at FS/PB FELS (dust-off completed at 1633H). 2-60 Inf (-) conducted airmobile assaults into two LZ's in Obj 10, vic XS-299444 and vic XS299454. B Co 1st lift off 0715H; 2d lift down 0754H. C Co 1st lift off 0730H; 2d lift down 0800H. The battalion proceeded to establish a north-south blocking position facing west along the canal from vic XS301450 to vic XS302443 (in position 0915H). Beginning at 1100H the bn swept to the west with B Co and C Co on line for approx 1300 m. Vic XS293452 C Co found & destroyed onesquad-size bunker, one hut, 20 two-man spider-holes and returned by air to RON FS/PB JAGER (closed approx 1740H). C/3-17 Air Cav screened the flanks of 2-39 Inf reconnaissance in force in Obj area 10, continued overwatch of southern Dinh Tuong Province and conducted an air/ground reconnaissance along the Rach Ba Muong. ARP was inserted vic XS255443 at 1405H and swept to the northeast. ARP sweep and aerial VR were completed at 1555H with ARP extracted from PZ vic XS261458. No contacts or significant findings were reported. B Co night combat patrol departed FS/PB JAGER at 2055H. C Co night combat patrol departed at 2122H. At 2145H vic XS334507, C Co observed an estimated group of 12 VC and prepared a hasty ambush. At 2158H the co sprang the ambush, called in arty and then began sweeping the area. 1 VC WIA was found with pistol belt and grenade (died while awaiting aero-med evac) (equip evac to Dong Tam). Four detainees were apprehended in the area (evac to Dong Tam IPW). (Detainees were 20-35 years of age but had ID cards dating back as far as 1916.)

11 March: 1st Bde continued road/engr security, night ambush patrolling and convoy security operations along Hwy 4 with 5-60 Inf (M) (-) and conducted offensive operations west of Dong Tam with 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf (-). The 5-60 Inf (M) (-) continues engr/road security, conducted night ambush patrols along Hwy 4 in AO CRACKERJACK and secured FS/PB's FELS and JAGER. Convoy escort was also provided by the 5-60 Inf (M) (-) between Dong Tam and Tan An. The 5-60 Inf CP remained at FS/PB JAGER (B Btry, 1-84 Arty & C Btry, 1-11 Arty) with Co A and the Scout Plat as security. Co B, Scout Plat 2-47
