SUBJECT: Combat Operations After Action Report (MACV/RCS/J3/J2)

1 May: 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and recon in force opns with the 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. 1st Bde continued its program of conducting combined opnw with RF and PF units to bolster their confidence, experience and combat proficiency and also to enhance the effectiveness of current US operations. The 2-39 Inf continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK and adjacent areas. At 0834H vic XS265568 Co A found 22 Chicom claymore mines (20 lb type). At 1212H vic XS-321495 Co B found a grenade booby trap with trip wire. Booby trap was destroyed in place. Co A and Co C completed their RIF opns in area of caches found on 30 April 1968 and were extracted, closing in their FS/PB's at 1125H. At 1915H Co B received 1 rd of sniper from the southeast of their CP loc. During the night the bn conducted 5 squad size ambush patrols. The 2-60 Inf continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Delayed entry: at 302230H vic XS365490 a Co C ambush patrol received several rds of sniper fire. Fire was returned. When area was checked out 3 male personnel were picked up in a hooch. They were in the process of changing clothes.) At 0130H vic XS365489 a Co C ambush patrol engaged 3 VC near a stream. Results: 1 VC (BC). Two blood trails were found in the area. During the night the bn conducted 9 squad size ambush patrols.

2 May: 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and recon in force opns with the 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 1st Bde continued its program of conducting combined opns with RF and PF units to bolster their confidence, experience and combat proficiency and also to enhance the effectiveness of current US opns. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0840H, vic XS330495 FS/PB Lambert received an unknown number of sniper rds. There were no casualties. At 1018H, Co B, 5-60 relieved Co C, 5-60 in place at FS/PB Lambert. Co B will remain OIFCON to 2-39 for the purpose of securing the engineer upgrading effort on Hwy 4. At 1610H, Co E conducted an AML assault into an LZ loc XS326520. The Co will move on foot to the west and conduct opns in a Bushmaster AO (XS3251, XS3253, XS2953, XS2951). At 1654H, vic XS323520 Co E apprehended 4 detainees and one child (WIA) as a result of a grenade thrown into a bunker complex being searched by the Co. Road sweeps and local security patrols were conducted without incidents. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 1315H Co's B and C commenced an AML move to the My Dien SF Camp XS360600 closing at 1521H. They will conduct RIF/Bushmaster Ops out of the camp for the next 2-3 days.

3 May: 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and recon in force opns with the 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 1st Bde continued its program of conducting combined opns with RF and PF units to bolster their confidence, experience and combat proficiency and also to enhance the effectiveness of current US opns. The 2-39 Inf continued opnw in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0716H vic XS315501 during a road sweep a platoon from Co B found fresh tracks which lead to two buried box type mines. Mines were command detonated type with wires leading to the south of the road. The mines were extracted and returned to the co's CP. All other road sweeps and local patrols were without incident. At 1254H vic XS318502 1st Plat, B Co received sniper fire. Negative casualties. Negative results upon sweeping the area fire came from. At 1312H vic XS322499 1st Plat, B Co received AW fire. An arty mission was fired on the area. Negative casualties. At 1320H vic XS314-494 1st Plat, Co B/3-39 spotted 5 VC with AW's. The VC were taken under fire with arty and mortars. Area was swept with negative results. At 1530H vic XS-299388 Co C picked up 4 detainees. Detainees were evacuated to Dong Tam. Co E

continued its Bushmaster opn. During the night the bn conducted 1 co size and 6 squad size ambush patrols. The 2-60 Inf continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 1010H vic XS365598 Co B found 2 Chicom grenades. One was an anti-personnel type and the other was set up as a booby trap under a mine. Grenades and mine were blown in place. Co's B and C continued RIF/BUSHMASTER opns out of the My Dien SF Camp. Co B established a BUSHMASTER opn vic XS3157, XS3159, XS3459, XS3457. During the night the bn conducted 1 co size and 7 squad size ambush patrols.

4 May: 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and recon in force opns with the 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 1st Bde continued its program of conducting combined opns with RF and PF units to bolster their confidence, experience and combat proficiency and also to enhance the effectiveness of current US opns. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Late entry: at 1530H, vic XS299488 Co C apprehended 4 detainees who were evacuated to Dong Tam.) At 0902H, Co A (-) was inserted into an LZ vic XS264586. The 3rd plat was inserted at XS270580 at 0902H. Both elements conducted RIF vic of their LZ's. At 1020H, vic XS330494 the 3rd plat received sporadic SA fire. The area was swept revealing a small amount of expended carbine rds. At 1150H, Co A began a sweep to the south toward FS/PB Moore. The Co closed FS/PB Moore at 1613H. Co C was moved AML from FS/PB Moore to Dong Tam for a maintenance stand down at 1100H. Co B conducted a RIF to the south of FS/PB Moore. At 1443H, vic XS329486 Co B engaged 6 VC. The VC fled to the south leaving behind one female detainee (WIA). The female was dusted off to My Tho. Co B closed FS/PB Lambert at 1540H. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK and vic the My Dien SF Camp with negative results. Trp D, 3-5 Cav, OPCON to 1st Bde for the day conducted VR and armed recon of AO CRACKERJACK and adjacent areas. At 0945H, vic XS274573 a LFT engaged 2 VC resulting in 2 VC KBA. The ARP was inserted at XS278570 at 1020H and engaged 1 VC resulting in 1 VC KIA (BC). The ARP was extracted at 1050H with no further incidents. The ARP was again inserted at 1314H, vic XS4060 with negative results; extracted at 1502H. At 1400H, vic XS325558 a LFT engaged 2 personnel moving down a canal in a sampan. The personnel, 1 male and 1 female, were apprehended when they took evasive action and returned to Dong Tam for interrogation. At 1520H, vic XS336560 a LFT engaged and sunk 1 sampan. At 1530H, vic XS368550 the ARP was again inserted with negative results; extracted at 1700H.

5 May: 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and recon in force opns with the 2-39 Inf and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 1st Bde continued its program of conducting combined opns with RF and PF units to bolster their confidence, experience and combat proficiency and also to enhance the effectiveness of current US opns. The 2-39 Inf continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0625H FS/PB Lambert received 6 rds of mortar fire. Rds fell outside of berm. Negative casualties. At 0625H B15 AP spotted a roadblock vic XS299499. Part of a hooch roof was placed on the road. Booby traps that were under the roof were blown and road was cleared. B15 AP also destroyed a mud wall roadblock on Hwy 4 vic XS299499. Explosion of mud wall resulted in one secondary explosion. At 0940H a VC flag was seen 500 meters north of old FS/PB JAGER. Two platoons from 2-39 were sent to investigate. At 1030H the two platoons secured the VC flag and destroyed two one-man bunkers in the area. Flag was booby trapped. While securing the VC flag the 2-39 elements received sniper fire from vic XS364486. Two VC were spotted running from the area. 2-39 elements pursued with negative results. At 1100H it was reported that R-2/2-39 vic XS310520 received sniper fire. Negative casualties. At 1410H vic XS341482 to vic XS343489 Co B found 35 freshly made bunkers and approximately 50 punji pits. At 1520H vic XS335477 Co B engaged 4 VC. One VC

was captured (He had no weapon and wore black shorts with a white shirt) and the other 3 escaped. The 2-60 continued operations in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0350H vic XS321576 B26 AP engaged 2 sampans loaded with rice. The sampans fled down another canal when taken under fire. In second canal B16 AP engaged the same sampans. Results 1 VC female KIA and 1 VC female WIA. Dusted off at 0850H to Dong Tam. (WIA female was later classified IC.) At 0737H 2-60 reported two craters in the road. One vic XS440486 was 70% damage to road and one vic XS469498 was 70% damage to road. Engr elements repaired the damage. Co's B and C continued opns vic My Dien SF Camp, closing by airmobile means in their parent CP locations at 1350H. Trp D, 3-5 Cav, OPCON to 1st Bde for the day, conducted VR and armed recon of AO CRACKERJACK, and adjacent areas. At 1020H vic XS283428 Trp D elements saw several VC swimming down a canal, trying to camouflage themselves as they went along. The canal was reconed by fire with negative results. At 1112H an ARP was inserted vic XS263462, received AW fire. Negative results upon sweeping area of fire. At 1215H vic XS293422 an ARP found a bunker with 1 civilian radio (tuned to pick up military transmissions) 1 US canteen with cover, 1 US ammo pouch and 1 writing pad. All equipment found was evacuated to Dong Tam.

6 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force operations with 2-39, 2-60 and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0300H FS/PB MOORE received 20 60mm mtr rds. Rds fell outside of perimeter. Counter mortar arty was fired on suspected VC mortar site. Negative casualties. At 0615H vic XS314502 B26 elements, saw 2 persons on Hwy 4 who looked as if they were digging holes and laying wire. B26 element fired on the 2 individuals who fled the area. At 0650H vic XS360497 Co B/5-60 (OPCON to 2-39) found a roadblock made of barrels and hay. At 1443H on road leading from FS/PB Lambert, 10 rds of 82mm mortar landed approx 250 meters outside perimeter. Mortar fire seemed to come from vic XS325490. Counter mortar fire was employed on area. At 1935H vic XS259459 A16 picked up 3 detainees in its Bushmaster location. Only 1 detainee had an ID card. Two detainees wore black shorts and black shirts. One wore blue pants and grey shirt plus a 514 scarf. The detainee wearing the scarf tried to get rid of a small book when approached. At 2015H 2-39 CP reported three contacts, one of its elements at the Cai Lay water point received SA fire; Co E CP received SA fire from vic XS250505; and at Co B AP loc vic XS296505 received SA sniper fire. Fire was returned at all three points of contact. Negative US casualties. Co A continued its Bushmaster (initiated 061600H May) operation vic XS2457 - 2545 - 2845 - 2847. (late entry: At 050920H FS/PB Lambert received unknown amount of mortar rounds. Rds fell outside of perimeter. Negative cas. At 2130H vic XS296499 E1 AP received AW fire from west by approx 12 VC. Fire was returned. Results: 3 US WIA. (Dust off completed at 0015H. Delay due to dust off ship receiving fire. LFT was called to cover dust off.) At 2132H vic XS273501 C1 AP had contact with approx 4 VC. Negative casualties. Negative results.) The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0620H vic XS368496 R1 AP found a mine in Hwy 4. Blew minw in place. Made a crater in road approx 2 square feet. Crater was filled in. At 0703H vic XS355498 C3 AP found a roadblock on Hwy 4. While clearing roadblock a booby trap went off resulting in 4 US WIA. Dust off not required. At 0750H vic XS360497 Co A spotted 3 mounds of dirt on road. Also picked up 1 WIA VN detainee (unknown how wounds were sustained). At 0800H vic XS394494 Co A located a road block on Hwy 4. Roadblock was removed.

7 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force operations with the 2-39, 2-60 and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Delayed entry: At 062354H at FS/PB Moore 2-39 received 5-6 rds SA fire from 75-100 meters north of their perimeter. Negative casualties.) During VC mortar attack at Dong Tam on morning of 7 May in which a combined total of 63 120mm and 82mm mortar and 75mm RR rounds were delivered on the base camp, 2-39 suffered 1 KIA and 1 WIA. At 0735H vic XS271460 Co C conducted airmobile assault into a cold LZ. At 0910H vic XS271-460 Co C reported apprehending 6 detainees who had taken evasive action from Co C

elements. One detainee was apprehended in a bunker which was located inside a hooch (this detainee wore a 514 scarf.) At 1506H vic XS328493 (300 meters south of FS/PF Lambert) B16 patrol found a chicom claymore (25 lb type). Claymore was placed alongside a trail facing north. A dud 105mm round was also found in same vicinity. The 105 round was booby trapped. Claymore was evacuated and dud 105 destroyed in place. At 1602H vic XS333490 B16 patrol found two grenade booby traps. Both booby traps were blown in place. All elements of 2-39 closed into their CP's. During the night the battalion conducted one company (Co A Bushmaster initiated on 6 May) and 8 squad size ambush patrols. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. Road sweeps and local patrols were without significant finds. At 1630H just north of the battalion CP, 2-60 apprehended one detainee. When discovered in the area, the detainee ran and was apprehended in a hooch. During the night the battalion conducted 10 squad size ambush patrols. At 0947H vic XS210508 A/1-11 Arty enroute from FS/PB Moore to FS/PB Parker to support opns of 2-39 encountered a mud wall road block (road block had been reported at 0800H by 1st Bde S3 (fwd)). At vic XS200509 another mud wall road block could also be seen. A Battery searched out mud wall and found 2 grenade booby traps. Both sides of the road appeared to be booby trapped. While searching out road block, "A" received 3 rds of mortar fire from the north. Unable to go on to FS/PB Parker, A Battery returned to FS/PB Moore. At 1450H the 1-11 Arty 46 element received sniper fire near old FS/PB Jager. Results were 1 US WIA (slight). Dust off not required.

8 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force operations with the 2-39, 2-60 and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Delayed entry: At 072030H vic XS315503 B16/2-39 AP spotted several persons near their AP. Fired M-79 and mortar into area. Negative results.) Road sweeps and local patrols were without significant finds. At 0814H Co A closed into its CP from its Bushmaster opn. At 1658H vic XS258490 Co E/2-39 found a bunker that had been occupied recently in a haystack. Bunker was destroyed. At 1950H vic XS264502 a Co B LP received SA fire from approx 150 meters west of its location. Fire was returned. Negative casualties. Negative results. During the night the battalion conducted 12 squad size ambush patrols. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. Road sweeps and local security patrols were without significant finds. At 1600H vic XS413503, 2nd Plt, Co C/2-60 captured 1 detainee. Detainee had no ID card. During the night the battalion conducted 10 squad size ambush patrols. At 1530 vic XS242502 an element of the 1st Bde PSYOPS Team received AW fire from 2 VC north of highway. Fire was returned and VC were pursued. Results were one captured B41 rocket launcher. Blood trails were found in the area leading to the north.

9 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force opns with the 2-39 and 2-60 and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 0745H vic XS266488, Co C apprehended one detainee, 46 yrs of age during the course of a local patrol. The detainee was evacuated to Dong Tam. Co B conducted a RIF opn to the east of FS/PF Lambert vic XS308495 with negative results. The Co closed back to their CP at 1325H. At 1355H vic XS330492, a Co B local patrol located a complex of 15 bunkers and one US claymore mine with 150' of electrical wire. The bunkers were destroyed and the claymore evacuated. At 0817H vic XS237504, Co E observed a VC flag while conducting a road sweep. The flag was taken down and returned to the Co E CP at 0955H. At 0955H vic XS290499, Co A, 15th Engr uncovered a mine and destroyed it in place. At 0330H vic XS267500, a PF OP received AW fire resulting in 1 KHA and 2 WHA. Reports from the Cai Lay Advisor indicated that 2 PF inside the OP were actually VC in disguise. Upon initiation of the attack they threw several grenades inside the OP and escaped with 1 BAR, 1 carbine and a radio. The 2 PF WHA were dusted off. Arrangements have been made with the 2-39 to place a 3 man LNC team, radio, starlight scope and field telephone line to FS/PB Moore in the OP. At 1455H one platoon was inserted at XS179357 at 1520H. Both platoons conducted RIF opns vic of their LZ's with negative results. Both platoons were extracted at 1542H. The 1st plat was reinserted at 1632H, vic XS280570. The 2nd plat was inserted vic XS283573 at 1650H. At 1750H, vic XS283571 a UH-1D helicopter supporting 2-39 opns caught on fire and

made a forced landing. Co A elements in the area secured the aircraft until it was evacuated by CH-47 at 1928H. The 2 platoons of Co A were extracted at 1940H. The lift aircraft received a heavy volume of AW fire during the extraction, but no damage resulted. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. Local patrols, AP's and road sweeps took place without incident. At 1615H vic XS43-482, a convoy enroute from Vinh Long hit a mine. One vehicle sustained moderate damage. There were no casualties.

10 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force opns with the 2-39 and 2-60 Inf and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements from Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Delayed entry: At 0919H vic Fort Dent B16 AP was under a mortar attack, rounds coming from vic XS305-495. Arty fire was called in on suspected mortar position. Eight rounds of 82mm mortar fire was received. Negative US casualties. One VN woman WHA. Woman was moved to FS/PB Moore. At 1958H one helicopter from airmobile company utilized today had mechanical problems. Helicopter was secured at FS/PF Moore, overnight.) At 100109H vic XS263505 a listening post at FS/PB Moore spotted 1 man 200 meters west of LP. Fired M-79's into area. Negative results. At 0845H vic XS306495 a Co B patrol sweeping SW side of FS/PB Lambert received AW fire from 3 AK-47's vic XS306-497. Fire was returned. Negative US casualties. Negative results. At 1025H vic XS310498, 1st Plt, Co B found and destroyed 4 bunkers (shelter type). At 1320H in woodline vic old Fort Dent a Co B patrol received sniper fire from 3 or 4 VC vic XS310495. Fire was returned and arty called in. Results: 1 US WHA (back wound) and 1 ARVN WHA (leg wound). Dust off completed 1430H. At 1409H Co A was airmobiled into LZ vic XS350439. At 1443H Co E was airmobiled into LZ vic XS356435. At 1458H vic XS294494, 1st Plt, Co B received 2 rds 82mm while on patrol. Arty was called in on suspected mortar sight. Negative US casualties. At 1530H vic XS345436 Co A engaged 2 VC. Results were 1 VC KIA (BC) and 1 VC detainee. Two Thomson MG magazines were also found in area. At 1645H vic XS350421 Co A apprehended 2 detainees. At 1715H Co A assaulted into LZ vic XS335456. Helicopters received fire going into LZ, but the LZ itself was cold. Co A picked up 1 VC KIA (BC) same vic as LZ. 2-39 elements closed back in their CP's at 1758H. At 1858H vic XS332-482 Co C found 1 VC KIA (BC) while enroute to their Bushmaster opn (vic XS3249 - 3549 - 3546 - 3246). VC was wearing grey uniform. At 1956H vic XS255492 Co E CP spotted approx 25 VC setting up an attack position. VC were engaged with 4.2 mortar and 155mm arty fire. At 2018H when 2-39 elements were moved into the area to check it out, the 25 VC dispersed in three directions with Co E (-) pursuing them trying to maintain contact. Some were carrying wounded VC on their backs. At 2110H vic XS298500 a Co B AP received AW and B40 rocket fire. Fire was returned. Results: 2 US KHA, 5 US WHA. VC casualties unknown. During the night the battalions conducted 1 company size and 9 squad size ambush patrols. The 2-60 continued opns in the eastern portion of AO CRACKERJACK. (Delayed entry: At 092125H vic XS356497 R2 AP (while moving to AP position) found a roadblock of barrels, straw, gravel, 2 VC flags and 1 VC banner. Road block was to be removed at first light.) At 100315H vic 2-60 CP, 1 VC was spotted in area. M-79 was fired at this person who then moved out of the area. Negative results were obtained upon a check of the area. At 1017H vic 2-60 CP a VN Tiger Scout who had been injured by a US trailer at 0945H was dusted off. During the night the battalion conducted 9 squad size ambush patrols.

11 May: The 1st Bde continued road and engineer security, night ambush patrolling and reconnaissance in force operations with the 2-39 and 2-60 Inf's and in close coordination and cooperation with RF/PF elements of Dinh Tuong Province. The 2-39 continued opns in the western portion of AO CRACKERJACK. At 110510H vic XS334473 Co C engaged an unk size force moving along a trail resulting in 1 VC KHA (BC). At 110805H vic XS345472 a Co E patrol located and destroyed 1 fighting type bunker. At 110830H vic XS295500 Co A 15 Engr located 3 grenades wired together on the north side of the road. The grenades were blown in place. The engr also located and blew in place a pressure type mine located at XS296500 at 110910H. At 110956H vic XS314497 a Co B local patrol located 2 155 duds and 2 grenade booby traps. They were destroyed in place. At 111029H vic XS250489 a Co E patrol made contact with 6 VC. SA and AW fires were exchanged resulting in 1 VC KHA (BC) and

2 US WHA (dusted off). The VC were wearing all black clothing. A sweep of the area revealed expended M-14 and M-16 cartridges. Co A was inserted AML at 111120H, vic XS250472 and XS268485 in response to the Co E contact. At 111220H, vic XS286-455 the 2-39 C&C aircraft spotted 1 VC in a sampan taking evasive action. At the same time vic XS280501 a searchlight and security party also rec 8-10 mins of harrassing SA fire from the north. Firs was not returned in either case in an effort to prevent revealing the friendly positions.) At 191320H vic XS315498 vehicles on Hwy 4 received sniper fire from the south. Two groups of 6-8 people were spotted. A LFT from the 191st AHC conducted a VR of the area with negative results. At 191935H vic XS308498 a Co A AP enroute to its AP location, received SA fire. Contact broke at 191945H and the area was swept with negative results. There were no US casualties.
